Edge: Public Access Technology Benchmarks

A PLA Initiative – Funded by the Bill and Melinda
Gates Foundation



The Edge Coalition has developed a rating system comprised of benchmarks and indicators designed to work as an assessment tool.

They identify what practices, policies, equipment, and staffing libraries need to have in place to provide robust computer and Internet services to their patrons.

Sample Benchmark



Libraries have sufficient devices and bandwidth to accommodate user demand.

Indicator: *The library has a sufficient number of device hours available on a per capita basis.*

Indicator: *The library has sufficient bandwidth capacity to support user demand. See the **Bandwidth Planner/Calculator** for an approximation of how this calculation will be performed.*

Sample Benchmark

Libraries manage their technology resources to maximize quality.

Indicator: *The library manages internet connectivity by tracking some/all of the following:*

- ❑ Knows maximum available bandwidth speed available at each branch
- ❑ Monitors connectivity (up/down) continuously at the network level for all branches
- ❑ Monitors traffic by packet type and volume
- ❑ Receives alerts about connectivity problems in real time
- ❑ Optimizes network bandwidth to provide stable service by splitting bandwidth between library staff functions and public Internet access

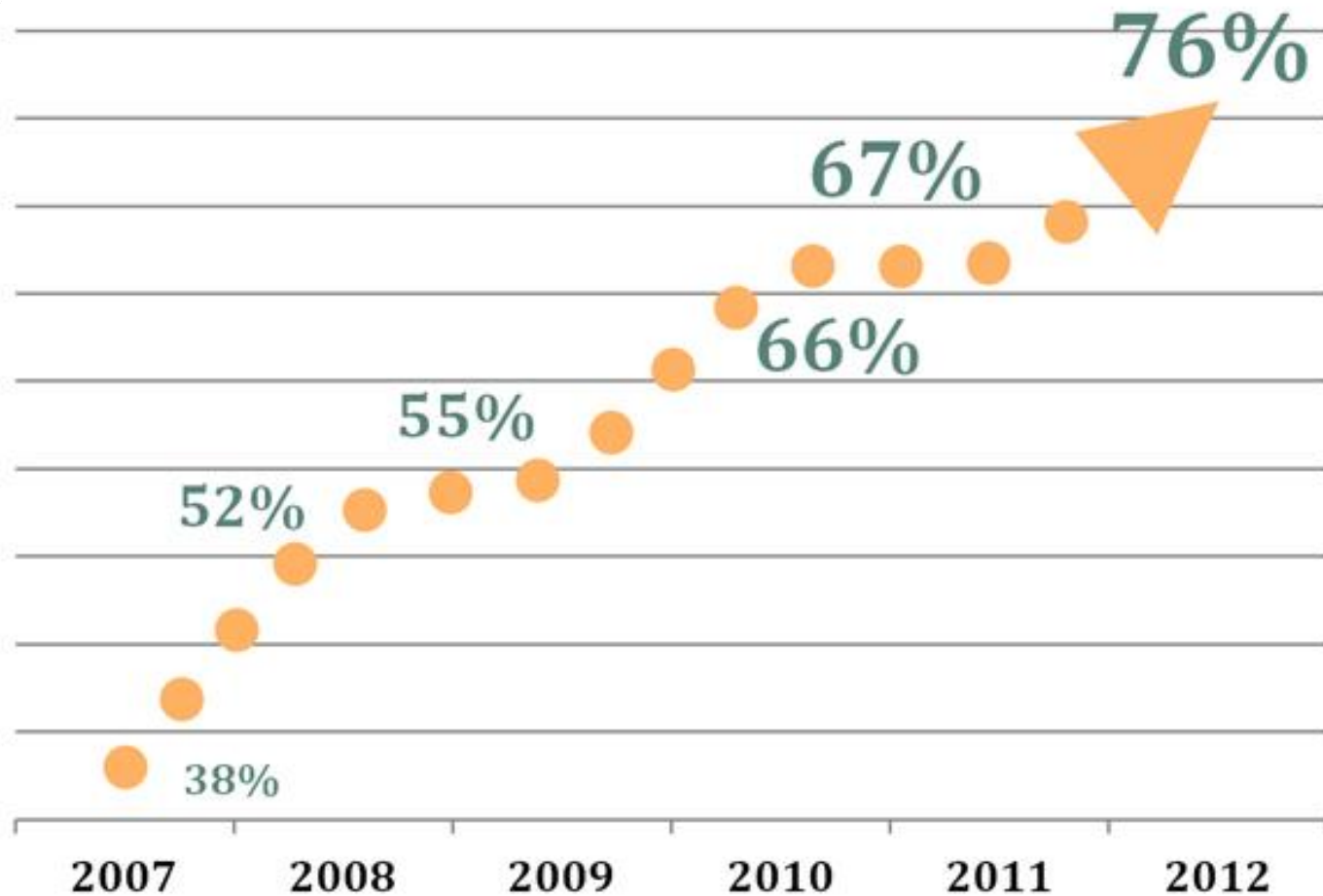
