市長序

《臺北市年鑑2024》完整記錄臺北隊在「永續共融・希望首都」的施政理念下，努力與用心的施政足跡與成果。感謝市民朋友的信任與同行，讓這座城市跨出的每一步都穩健而堅定，持續朝向安全、運動與未來之都的願景前行，邁向更美好的臺北！

安全，是一座城市穩定發展的基石。2024年，臺北市以「交通安全年」為核心，從通暢行人環境、路口行人安全、交通安全教育、執法強化，到推行交通友善區等5大「人本交通」面向，積極推動機退2.0、行穿線退縮、設置庇護島等措施，交通事故人數顯著下降，讓市民朋友在日常穿梭中，都能感受到安全與友善兼具的交通環境。

面對氣候變遷的挑戰，臺北隊秉持「料敵從寬、禦敵從嚴」的態度，啟動「降溫城市計畫」，從體感降溫、建築節能到擴大綠覆率，全面推動城市降溫與環境轉型，致力打造低碳宜居的家園；同時，針對老舊建物的安全疑慮，也正式啟動「大都更時代」，推動老舊校舍改建、增設電梯補助、防災型都更、海砂屋更新，以具體行動強化城市韌性，打造安全、宜居、永續的未來城市。





運動，不只是健康生活的基礎，更是城市活力的展現。2024年，臺北延續推動全民運動的目標，推出升級版U-Sport，並展開臺北特色運動館計畫，讓運動成為市民日常生活中的一部分；同時，我們的主場——臺北大巨蛋，也迎來世界棒球12強賽熱血開打，還有一場場人氣演唱會接力登場，不僅點燃城市熱度，更帶動觀光經濟，展現臺北多元豐富、充滿動能的魅力。

未來，是城市競爭力與永續發展的關鍵指標。2024年，臺北實施 YouBike 前 30 分鐘免費，串起綠色通勤最後一哩路，也為減碳永續盡一份力；同時，發行全國首創「永續發展債券」，為重大建設籌措資源，減輕市民長期財政負擔。1999 市民熱線也導入 AI 技術，有效提升回應效率與服務品質，持續打造即時、貼心的智慧城市。

臺北也積極走向國際舞台，參與「2024東京永續高科技論壇市長峰會」，向世界分享臺北在智慧防災領域的實踐成果；同時，也前往美國紐約、波士頓等城市交流，學習先進的交通規劃、產業發展及 AI 應用經驗，強化城市治理量能，讓臺北與世界接軌與對話。

針對不同族群與年齡需求，臺北推出更多貼近生活的政策，包括敬老卡擴大使用範圍，鼓勵長輩走出家門、實踐樂齡生活；成立「青年局」，協助年輕人職涯探索、參與公共事務，拓展國際視野；也擴增臨時托育據點至21處，減輕家長育兒負擔，讓育兒更有後援。

臺北是一座不斷進化的城市，我們有多元的文化、多樣的族群、也有共同的夢想，安全是基礎、運動是活力、未來是引擎，而市民始終是這座城市的主角。

臺北隊不曾停下腳步，感謝每一位市民朋友的陪伴與支持，和臺北隊攜手前行，我們一起踏出的每一步，都將讓臺北更好！

臺北交通有愛同行

交通，是城市運作的節奏，也是人與人之間的重要連結，在2024年，臺北市把這一年訂為「交通安全年」，從提升行人空間品質開始，全面檢視並優化步行環境，積極處理人車共行帶來的各種安全問題，透過多元策略，全力加強對行人的保護。

除了硬體設施，臺北市政府也從教育和宣導著手，希望交通安全的意識真正走進市民心中，讓大家自然而然轉變行為，走在路上更安全、也更有秩序。同時，搭配更落實的執法機制，維護道路上的公平與安全。這一連串的努力，不只是讓交通治理更升級，更是對市民生活品質的一份真心承諾。

走在臺北，更安心了！

走在城市裡，你是不是也覺得當推著娃娃車、牽毛小孩、或單純散步時，終於不用再跟機車搶人行道了，走起來變得安心又輕鬆？這一切，都是因為臺北市政府在2024年積極推動「機車退出騎樓、人行道2.0」（簡稱「機退2.0」）和人行空間改善計畫，讓走路成為一件舒服又安心的事！

「機退2.0」計畫從2023年就開始上路，針對早期在人行道劃設停車區的路段，進行交通環境大整理。2024年，臺北市特別針對承德路、中正路、南京東西路、忠孝東路……等11條重要道路，加設401處機車停車彎及19處平面停車場，讓機

車有地方停，行人也有自己的專屬空間。調查發現，將近9成的市民朋友都力挺這個措施！市民也紛紛回饋：「以前機車常常擋住整條人行道，現在好走多了！」、

「終於不用再鑽來鑽去了，真的方便很多！」，一位騎機車的爸爸也說：「行人的生命安全最重要，『機退2.0』讓規則變得更清楚，真的很好。我也很願意在騎車時主動禮讓行人，這項政策真的很讚！而且現在的停車格也比以前多，停車更方便了！」即便在地下管線錯綜複雜的地方，臺北市也採用了創新做法，比如用緩斜坡減少挖路、設置導引設施避免機車誤停，讓行人好走、機車好停，一舉兩得。

在人行空間改善方面，2024年也完成將近5.6萬平方公尺的人行道更新，清除了10處道路障礙物，新增20條實體分隔的人行道，還拓寬了18條路段，讓真正屬於行人的空間，一點一滴地回來了！在自行車人車共道的區域，像市府路和忠誠路二段，也劃上了人車分流標線，用白虛線和圖示提醒大家各走各的，經統計，自行車遵循率高達91%、行人也有75%，走路、騎車有秩序，也大幅降低了混亂和意外的發生。不少市民指出，「現在走市府路安心多了，少了很多驚險場面。」、「忠誠路二段以前人車混在一起很危險，現在清楚多了，連小朋友走路都比較放心。」有些民眾也建議未來可以多增加標線清晰度，或在轉角處加上警示，讓行人和騎士都更有方向感。

「機退2.0」和人行空間改善，雙軌並進，從交通設計到使用者感受，通通兼顧到，希望大家走在臺北的每一步，都更自在、更有安全感。未來，臺北市會以學校、醫院等周邊地區為優先，持續擴大成

果，打造一座真正以人為本的友善城市！


路口變身，馬路不再如虎口

還記得以前過馬路，總是提心吊膽，不是夜晚路口昏暗，就是樹叢遮住了駕駛視線，一不小心閃避不及就發生擦撞，令人始料未及。這樣的情況在臺北市正一步步改善中！

這次的交通大改造，從我們腳下的斑馬線開始。鮮豔的行穿線標記，讓行人走起路來更醒目，開車的駕駛也更容易注意到。市民也回應：「新的斑馬線真的很明顯，也覺得駕駛比較會讓人了。」、「尤其晚上或下雨天，這種清楚的標線真的有差！」在2024年，學校周邊就完成290個路口，公園附近也有33個路口完成設置；此外，為了創造更清晰的視線和安全的空間，臺北市政府也在44處路口實施行穿線退縮與庇護島設置，讓過馬路變得更有保障。

不只如此，在人行號誌方面，臺北市延續「臺北交通安心行」政策，貼心設置綠燈早開、早關和行人專用時相。過去發現，清晨5點到7點之間，很多65歲以上的長輩會外出運動，因為天色仍舊昏暗，交通事故的風險也比較高。為了讓大家走得更安心，臺北市政府已經全面盤點各大公園周圍的行人穿越道，接下來會透過加強照明亮度、新增路燈，或調整燈光角度等方式，讓馬路穿越區更明亮。希望大家清晨出門運動時，不只能看得清楚，也能走得更放心！

截至2024年年底，臺北市政府已經在學校、醫院、公園、易肇事路口等處，完

成了一系列照明和植栽的改善工作，努力讓城市變得更安全、更舒適。這些成果，展現了臺北市政府的行動力與效率，讓大家無論上學、就醫、運動、或只是日常散步，都能感受到臺北越來越貼心、宜居！

在城市晨光灑落的街角，行人與車流交織成日常的節奏，街景的每一次改變，都是為了讓移動變得更加輕盈與自在；自從拆除和平新生路口的天橋後，首都客運284路線黃姓駕駛長表示：「原本公車就會有些死角，現在天橋拆掉後，視野更加開闊，遠遠就可以看到路口行穿線的狀態，轉彎時也就更加安全。」除了硬體拆除之外，臺北市政府也透過修剪植栽和樹木的



和平新生路口空橋拆掉後，路口變開闊了，不僅行人和車輛看得更清楚，走路或行車都安全又順暢！

方式，減少行人和車輛的視線遮蔽，提升人車在視覺上的通視度，打造更安全的通行環境。

為了讓「臺北交通有愛同行」的理念更加落實，保障每一位行人的安全，臺北市政府領先全國，推出第一本《臺北市道路設計手冊》。這本手冊不但訂出了合理的道路設計標準，也讓市民朋友更了解道路設計背後的用心與考量，增加彼此的溝通與共識，讓臺北市的道路安全更上一層樓。

從貼心宣導開始，讓交通更有溫度

交通設施的規劃和建設，雖然是第一步，但要真正融入大家的生活，還需要用貼心的說明和宣導，讓市民了解改變前後的差異和學會使用，才能感受到這些調整帶來的方便與安心。唯有把政策說到心裡，才能在日常中累積信任，讓新措施發揮最大效果。

守護長者，高齡駕訓也補助

臺灣已進入高齡化社會，長輩們的交通安全教育至關重要！臺北市政府特別與臺北市區監理所合作，運用交通部路老師計畫，舉辦了多場面對面的交通安全宣導活動，讓長輩們清楚了解最新的交通規則，以及如何保護自己、平安出門。

臺北市政府也深知要向長輩們宣導交通安全，除了需要熱心的鄰里長幫忙外，

透過世代間共學的效果更好。為此，開發了一系列代間交通安全教育活動，像是「交通安全故事劇場」、「老幼共學主題書展」、「交通知能代間講座」等，讓小朋友與爺爺奶奶們在樂趣中，建立交通安全知識與珍惜生命的觀念。

除了加強宣導，臺北市政府也首創高齡駕訓補助，透過專班教學，幫助長輩們重新認識交通規則和安全騎乘技巧，讓大家即使年紀漸長，也能輕鬆又自信地上路，當個「不老騎士」！除了照顧長輩外，為了讓想學騎機車的市民更安心上路，臺北市政府交通局也配合中央交通部，將機車駕訓補助方案全面升級。只要參加機車駕訓或道路安全訓練計畫，就有機會申請補助，減輕學習負擔。不同對象都有貼心補助，從年輕人到銀髮族，真正感受到臺北市政府在提升道路安全上，滿滿的用心與努力！

路老師計畫




「路老師」，全名為「向高齡者宣講道路交通安全知識的老師」，由交通部為改善高齡者的交通安全，以開辦「高齡者交通安全教育-路老師培訓宣講計畫」，透過招募、訓練更多合格「路老師」，教導高齡者如何判別交通事故風險及正確的用路知識，進而提升高齡者外出活動之交通安全性。





交安從小做起，全齡輕鬆學

交通安全不只是道路上的規則，它關係到每個人的生命與安全。臺北市透過不同年齡層的教育設計，把交通安全融入大家的日常生活，讓每個人都能輕鬆學會，成為交通安全的小小守護者。

2024年，臺北市政府以「學校人本交通——停讓文化」為核心，積極深入各級學校舉辦交通安全講習。講習重點包含「交通安全教育5大守則」、「交通安全教育5大運動」、「兒童安全通過路口」以及「機車安全與防禦駕駛」等重要議題。透過實務經驗分享與體驗活動，希望讓老師和同學們都可以開開心心出門、平平安安回家。

除此之外，也積極推動「全齡交通安全教育行動」，針對不同學層量身打造教學內容。對年紀小的小朋友，重點放在養成正確的過馬路習慣，從最簡單的「停、看、聽、想」四字訣開始，教他們過馬路前要先停下來，看清左右車況，聽聽有沒有車聲，再判斷能不能安全通過。小朋友也開心地說：「現在我知道過馬路要先停下來看一看，不會像以前那樣亂跑。」隨著孩子年紀漸長，接觸到自行車、機車等交通工具，交通安全教育也同步升級，強調騎車安全和遵守交通規則。學校還會邀

請交通警察到校宣導，透過真實案例提醒學生，讓他們了解一個小小的疏忽，可能會帶來什麼後果，進一步提升安全意識，讓每一次出門都更放心。

此外，針對不同學級的學生，臺北市也規劃一系列寓教於樂的活動。例如，安排小學生前往臺北市交通資訊中心和捷運高運量行控中心參訪，透過有趣的導覽和互動體驗，了解臺北交通的過去、現在與未來，以及捷運列車如何運轉、調度等；國、高中生則聚焦在越來越常見的微型電動二輪車的騎乘規範，以及如何安全地享受騎自行車的樂趣，甚至還安排了騎乘體驗，從體驗中建立交通安全知識。

在大學方面，臺北市立大學位於市區繁華位置，臺北市政府了解學生多以機車代步，為確保學生安全，每年都會請交通警察大隊到學校實施交通安全宣導，針對騎機車時常見的疏失或應注意事項，透過實際案例來加深學生的印象，就有學生分享：「之前沒注意安全帽要戴好，聽完警察來宣導才知道有多重要。」；在行政體

系及教師研習上，則著重經驗與實務交流，尤其針對幼童交通安全，為了讓幼兒園教保服務人員、司機和隨車人員更容易了解，課程設計運用深入淺出的解釋和真實案例，讓每個人都能輕鬆掌握重要的安全觀念。

除了扎實地辦理宣講外，臺北市政府的宣導方式也越來越有創意，為了讓更多市民朋友在玩樂中學習，特別舉辦了交通安全棒球日，巧妙地將交通安全概念融入棒球賽事與規則中，讓大家在互動遊戲中輕鬆學習，不知不覺就把重要的交安觀念記在腦海中。此外，為了保護默默付出、站在第一線的學校交通導護志工，將其團體意外險從200萬元提高到300萬元，75歲以上的資深志工還會額外投保個人保險，讓這些守護天使們更有保障。

在努力推動各方面的交通安全教育下，2024年，臺北市榮獲了全國交通安全最高榮譽，有交通界奧斯卡獎的「金安獎」11項大獎，為全國之冠。然而，臺北市政府並不因而自滿，未來將持續擴大長者交通安全宣導、深化校園交通安全教育，並加強宣導路口停讓行人及繼續補助機車駕訓，從提升市民交通安全觀念做起，由內而外建立安全的交通文化。

讓科技成為守護行人的力量

你能想到嗎？科技提升生活的便利性，也是守護行人安全的重要力量。臺北市政府巧妙地運用科技執法的優勢，不僅有效提升執法效率，更大幅減輕了第一線警力重擔，展現科技在城市治理中的嶄新角色。

2024年，臺北市政府在「科技執法」及「行人路權」上，為了有效減少交通違規，並防止交通事故，至2024年底，臺北市已啟用了59處科技執法設備，每個月平均開出的違規單比測試期間大幅減少了94.3%，顯示科技執法在嚇阻違規行為方面有顯著的成效。在「車輛不禮讓行人」上，2024年透過路口科技執法取締件數，

也較2023年同期增長5成，為行人帶來更多保障。

在行人路權方面，為了洗刷「行人地獄」惡名，訂定了「113至115年臺北交通安心行細部執行計畫」，針對車輛不禮讓行人、行人闖紅燈或不走行穿線，還有汽機車在人行道及騎樓騎乘或違停等加強取締，光是2024年就已有32萬件，就是希望大家養成禮讓行人的好習慣。

街道安全轉型，從里開始

從車水馬龍的繁忙路口，到社區巷弄間的每一步，交通安全正逐步走進我們的生活裡。2024年，臺北市政府一改過去由政府主導的交通改善方式，轉為更重視地方共識的「由下而上」推動模式，鼓勵以里為單位發起提案，臺北市政府則提供專業規劃協助，這種作法不僅能精準地符合居民需求，也有效提升大家參與交通改善的意願。且這次更著重「行人友善區」結合「行人優先區」的概念，希望藉由全面提升巷道內的步行環境和在特定區域給予行人更高的通行權，讓市民朋友們踏出家門就感到安心。




取締車輛違規轉彎與不禮讓行人，科技執法一起上路，守護行人安全！

以大學里首創全國第一座「交通友善區」為例，實施後車輛降速達26.52%，事故也減少22.22%。這項創新的做法，很快地就吸引其他里的目光。如鄰近的師大生活圈——大安區龍泉里，也跟進推動「行人友善區」行列，結果汽車平均車速下降25%，機車更降低了32%，確實提升了行人通行安全。此外，信義區嘉興里也積極響應，在嘉興街175巷9弄設置全國首處「行人優先區」，實測後，汽車和機車的速度分別下降了31%和24%，成效相當顯著。里長也表示設置優先區後，居民不用擔心走在路側會有車輛高速穿越，也不用擔心走在巷道中間會被車輛按喇叭驅趕，尤其減速丘的設置，可以使車輛減速，真正做到臺北交通安心行。

在規劃過程中，臺北市政府借鏡新加坡交通管理局的「Silver Zone（樂齡安全區）」概念，在里內設置彎曲道路、組裝式減速丘、楔型標線等巧思設計，並結合縮小路口等方式，以具創意又實用的手法來管理車速。這些努力都是以「安全、人本、環境優先」為核心理念，並在社區居民共同「形塑有趣街道」的共識下，翻轉

了過去以行車效率為主的交通環境設計思維。這些由基層發起、社區深度參與的案例，正一步步為臺北市打造更安全、更友善的人本交通環境，展現了城市街道轉型的無限潛力。

截至2024年，已有19個里願意參與交通友善區規劃，臺北市政府將逐一評估改善需求。另也有20個里表達參與行人友善區的意願，臺北市政府將積極與各里合作，給市民一個既安全又舒適的行走環境。



專題報導 1 溫馨食光護健康

當飲食選擇越來越多元、健康成為每個家庭最在意的時候，臺北市政府以貼心且專業的行動把關，讓守護從飲食開始，延伸至全家的健康照護，默默關懷每一位市民。

強化食安，守護您的每一餐

現代工商社會中，外食已成為許多人的日常，你是否曾擔心過食安問題？現在，臺北市政府正全力把關你的每一餐，讓你吃得更安心！

為提升食安檢驗量能，臺北市政府在2024年成立「食因性疾病病因物質檢驗組」，並引進氣相層析串聯式質譜儀、電子低溫培養箱與CO₂培養箱等先進設備，確保食品中的危險物質能被及早發現。在檢驗方面，除了持續精進檢測技術，也逐步蒐集國內外食品中毒的案例，建立病因物質檢驗資料庫。此外，也針對米濕製品、魚肉、紅麴產品等特定食品進行專案檢驗，全面把關食品安全，讓市民能夠安心享用美食。

食品中毒快速處理，保障你和家人健康

在外用餐不慎發生食安問題時，別擔心，臺北市政府在2024年5月修正了疑似食品中毒處理作業流程！除了與檢警合作，強化通報機制外，若發生重症或危及生命的情況，也會立即要求食品業者暫時停業，並擴大採檢相關食品及原料、追溯源頭。另外，臺北市政府也修正了停業復業標準，在業者提出復業申請時，應提供改善報告，且須完成4小時衛生講習後，經臺北市政府衛生局複查確認才能恢復營業，確保每個程序與環節，保障你我的健康。

為了進一步強化食安及衛生稽查與後市場管理，臺北市政府衛生局持續提升稽查人員的專業能力，於2024年3月、8月及11月分別舉辦了3期「衛生稽查實務研習班」，課程總時數達26小時，共計186人次稽查人員參與，展現臺北市政府努力全面提升執法效能、為市民提供更安全的飲食保障；而作為一個以消費為導向的城市，臺北市也將持續以更貼近民眾需求的

方式，逐步檢視並調整每年的抽驗件數，同時也積極加強源頭的風險監控，並透過輔導機制，協助業者落實自主管理，總計在2024年市售食品抽驗共計5,146件，合格率高達93.2%，顯示臺北市政府衛生局在食品安全領域的努力與成效。

細膩守護，讓美味更安心

除了食品安全，良好的用餐環境及餐飲衛生，也是守護市民健康的重要一環。

臺北市政府衛生局積極推動「餐飲衛生管理分級評核認證」制度，2024年更與臺北市商業處合作推廣至「西門」、「臺大公館」等觀光商圈，截至年底共輔導了4,494家餐飲業者通過衛生管理分級評核認證，其中3,959家獲得優級、535家獲得良

級。另外，為了提升餐飲業者對食品衛生自主管理能力及市民的食安信心，臺北市政府製作餐飲分級美食地圖，還舉辦「慢步台北好食趣」抽獎活動，讓市民和遊客一起體驗安全美味的餐飲文化。

多語言食安課程，讓更多人受益

許多來自異鄉的新住民朋友在臺北經營家鄉風味的小餐館，卻常因不熟悉臺灣的食品安全法規而感到困擾。為了協助這些業者安心經營，臺北市政府衛生局於2024年12月30日透過「臺北e大數位學習網」，推出中、英、印尼與越南等4國語言的食品安全衛生教育影音教材，幫助新住民更容易理解相關規範，讓美味更安心，也讓臺北成為國際級的美食安全之都！

食材來源透明，買菜不用擔心

你是否曾擔心自己食用或購買的食材來源不明？為了打造安心又安全的食品消費環境，臺北市政府早已成立「臺北市食材登錄平台」，更持續優化平臺功能，特別設立專區，來幫市民解決這個困擾！

截至2024年，臺北市食材登錄平台已設立17個專區，從賣場專區、連鎖咖啡廳專區、到伴手禮專區等各大面向，逐年增加服務專區，累積已超過200萬人次瀏覽。隨著上市上櫃餐飲業者分店廣布且消費人數擴大，臺北市政府在2024年公告新增「上市及上櫃連鎖餐飲專區」，並自2025年1月1日正式實施，進一步提升食材來源的透明度，無論是外食族或是自行烹煮的民眾，臺北市政府都在背後默默把關，確保市民的飲食安全。



健康加碼，關愛每一刻

食很重要，健康更重要，好消息一定要分享！臺北市「成人健康檢查加碼補助」活動自2024年7月推出後，大受市民歡迎，搭配成人健檢可免費加碼6項檢查，包括尿素氮、尿酸、糖化血色素、全血細胞計數、甲狀腺刺激素及CA-199腫瘤標記，短短4個月就吸引9,941位市民參與，健檢率成長47.39%！

許多市民也開心分享心得，覺得多了6項檢查，讓自己對健康的掌握更全面，感受就像多一層保障，既安心又值得。活

動推廣更結合台北通APP，透過精準比對與推播功能，讓市民第一時間收到健檢通知，輕鬆把握檢查機會。為了讓更多市民能享受這波好康，臺北市政府2025年將全年度提供成人健康檢查加碼補助，讓符合成人健檢資格的大家隨時都能參加，健康不設限！

守護童心，健康同行

除了為成人提供便利的健康檢查服務，臺北市也關注幼兒的成長與健康，積極打造從小開始的健康守護網。

2024年，臺北市政府委託17家合約醫療院所，於幼兒園及社區舉辦764場「學齡前兒童整合性社區篩檢服務」，讓孩子們在熟悉的環境中輕鬆完成身體、口腔、視力、聽力檢查，省時又安心，已經提供5萬6,196名兒童完成健康檢查；此外，2024年增加6次兒童發展篩檢服務，以及視力複檢補助，協助家長於早期掌握兒童健康狀況，及早介入與治療。這項學齡前兒童的健康照護網絡，許多家長給予肯定，因為這樣貼心的安排，讓他們在照顧孩子的過程中，感受到更多支持與安心。

隨著兒童健康保障的提升，家中有國中男生的家長們也能放心！從2024年9月起，臺北市率先提供國中男生免費接種HPV疫苗，及早預防相關感染及口咽癌，減少未來的醫療負擔。至2024年底，已

有8,085名國中男生完成接種，接種率達73.45%，為孩子們的健康再添一層保障，家長們一起努力早預防、早檢測、早治療，讓孩子們健康成長、更安心！

專題報導 2 暖心安居享樂活

一個安全、舒適的家，是每個人生活中最基本的幸福起點。臺北市落實建物全生命週期管理，守護居住安全；延伸到日常，推動幸福住宅與租金補貼，減輕成家與育兒的壓力；進一步擘劃永續藍圖，打造降溫城市的宜居環境，讓生活在臺北更安心、更舒適。

初期檢查階段： 快速反應，守護每一個工地

房子要住得安心，從蓋的時候就要顧好安全。臺北市政府強化施工階段管理，不只定期進行工地總體檢，更推動多項安全新措施，包括地下室開挖階段就請公會來清查、明確規範施工勘驗流程、修訂結構與施工計畫外審原則、公開安全監測數據，還有增設工程放樣勘驗、竣工前加辦透地雷達探測等，層層把關，從源頭提升施工品質，讓大家住得更安心。



臺北市政府規定，工程在放樣勘驗和竣工前，需針對基地周邊 20 公尺內的道路，進行深度超過 3 公尺的地質探測和高程調查，並將結果送交道路主管機關備查，以作為施工與作為後續道路維護的依據。

中長期安全確保階段： 守護建築歲月，延續家的故事

房子蓋好之後，便進入長期使用階段，考量臺北市不少建築已有 30 年以上屋齡，臺北市政府特別重視建築物的安全與維護，從「增設電梯」、「外牆整新」到「結構補強」三方著手，讓老屋不只耐用，還有機會煥然一新。

以「增設電梯」為例，考量到老屋沒電梯對長輩來說很不方便，臺北市推出「增設電梯」補助措施，截至 2024 年底已累計 100 案，全國最多！光是 2024 年就新增 19 案，比前一年成長 46%。其中，第 100 件的富台社區就是成功案例，改善了居民出入的困擾。同年也修正補助規範，首創放寬只要區分所有權人過半數選出代表人就能申請，讓更多人有機會受益，實現「在地共老、共好生活」。

除了內部改善，在外觀方面，臺北市政府率先全國推動「外牆整新」補助及申報制度，針對屋齡已久或有潛在危險的建築物，主動查察、修繕外牆，避免磁磚剝落傷人。為減輕住戶負擔，2024 年起補助



為老屋整修外牆，打造更安全的居住環境。



金額大幅提升，像是外牆剝落修繕補助從10萬提高到20萬元，外牆申報補助也從8萬8,000元增加至12萬8,000元，讓臺北市的建築物既安全又美觀。

而在「結構補強」方面，2024年4月3日發生地震後，臺北市政府更加重視建築的結構安全與耐震力，推出「403震災列管紅黃單建築物修繕補強補助計畫」，紅單每戶補助最高50萬元、黃單最高40萬元，共用區域則每棟最高150萬元，截至2024年底已受理13案，協助市民重建家園、提升安全。

晚期重建階段： 老舊及危險建物注入新生命

對於老舊或危險的建築物，臺北市政府積極推動都市更新與危老重建，優化審議流程及相關制度與配套措施。至2024年為止，累計核定都市更新案已達599件，2024全年新增37件；危老重建核准數也高達982件，2024全年新增77件，不論是都更還是危老，核准件數皆居全國之冠，展現臺北市與市民攜手，讓城市的老建築注入新生命的成果。

為提升重建效率與品質，臺北市政府也有新做法。例如針對耐震能力不足的建物，推出「防災型都市更新專案計畫」，加快危險建物重建，提升整體安全。該專案自2024年3月28日公告後，截至年底已有14件申請，初見成效，也帶動市民更新意願。

針對結構安全風險更高的「海砂屋」，臺北市政府在2024年啟動「高氯離子混凝土建築物575專案」，針對列管需拆除重建的建物並具有50%的意願者，進行可行性評估與財務試算，截至2024年底已有5案申請本計畫，其中內湖康樂街136巷

案已進入招商作業階段。這些政策鼓勵社區自助互助、公私協力，共同推動都市更新，創造更安全宜居的生活環境。

對於有意願但資源不足的社區，臺北市政府也透過「公辦都更7599專案計畫」，鼓勵民間與政府合作推動更新。2024年取消每年僅收10案的限制後，推動更有彈性，截至年底已協助15個社區完成方案評估，受惠超過1,000戶，總面積達6萬多平方公尺。像「信義區虎林街60巷」、「南港產專區單元2-25」等案例，也是在政府協助下順利整合，進入招商階段，為長年無法更新的地區帶來新希望。

支持年輕家庭的幸福夢想家

除了建物問題，臺北市政府也將目光投向年輕族群的居住需求，除了面對生活成本的壓力外，還考慮到居住環境與孩子入學的問題，找到一個理想的家，成為生活中的一大挑戰。

年輕家庭的心聲，臺北市政府聽見了。2024年首度推出的「幸福住宅」專案，正是為了給予結婚2年內及育有6歲以下子女的夫妻最實質的支持。其中位於信義區的永吉都更分回戶，已於2024年12月完成簽約及入住，讓青年族群都能完成「成家、好孕、住進來」的生活願景。

除了提供全新的居住環境，臺北市政府也貼心設計了「加籤」機制，讓育有2名以上0至6歲子女的家庭，有更高機會入住幸福住宅。針對租金部分，也推出每月3,000到1萬1,000元不等的分級折減補貼，減輕家庭負擔。更棒的是，如果設籍在幸福住宅裡，還可享每名育兒加碼1,000元（最多3,000元）的租金補貼！如果孩子於幸福住宅所屬或分發至公立國小就學，更

可延長租期至小學畢業，最長達12年，真正做到長期安穩。根據首波中籤住戶的意見回饋，多數民眾對幸福住宅專案的推動給予正面肯定，顯示這項政策逐步獲得社會大眾的支持與認同，臺北市政府也期盼青年族群安心在臺北婚育成家。

優質社宅好安心，育兒生活有保障

居住在臺北市的幸福不只如此，針對入住社會住宅及臺北市轄管出租國宅的市民，還可享有育兒租金加碼補貼，即育有12歲以下孩子的家庭並設籍者，每月可直接折減租金1,000元，最高達3,000元，減輕育兒家庭的生活負擔，讓家的溫暖更有保障，幸福感也更踏實。

臺北市政府致力於打造兼具品質與溫度的社會住宅，從規劃設計到施工管理，全面導入智慧建築、綠建築、耐震建築與友善育兒空間等理念，不僅強化住宅安全與舒適度，也貼近市民多元的生活需求，在城市安心成家、放心育兒。這些努力屢獲中央肯定，包含工程會第23、24屆公共工程金質獎優等、內政部第12屆優良綠建

築榮譽獎等多項獎項，展現臺北市在推動高品質社會住宅上的具體成果與用心。

綠意城市，迎接涼爽

面對氣候變遷帶來的挑戰，臺北市政府積極邁向永續未來，推動淨零轉型政策，從日常生活到城市規劃，逐步引導改變，為此，臺北市政府提出「降溫城市計畫」，透過體感降溫減碳、建築能效降碳與綠覆調適固碳3大面向，為城市降溫，也為生活加分，希望建構更宜居、永續的城市樣貌。

在「體感降溫減碳」方面，透過增加開發基地的綠化、設置連續遮簷和強化通風設計，讓戶外環境更涼爽、更舒適。臺北市政府也在2024年11月12日正式公告實施「擬定『臺北市開發基地體感降溫專案』細部計畫案」，提供建築物立體綠

化和連續遮簷等設施的設置誘因，鼓勵大家一起打造更宜人的都市空間；在「建築能效降碳」部分，目前也正積極研訂「臺北市建築物能源耗用管制辦法」，明定建築物的能源耗用標準、評定方式，以及資訊標示的內容，從建築外觀設計、節能設備配置，到使用太陽能等再生能源，目標是全面降低建築用電與空調所產生的熱排放，一步步邁向節能減碳的理想生活；而在「綠覆調適固碳」部分，則是打造綠意盎然的開放空間與透水鋪面，建構起城市的綠色基盤設施，讓市民無論在公園、綠地或廣場，都能感受到涼爽綠蔭和自然微風。街道兩旁的行道樹如天然空調，有效減少熱氣、過濾塵土，讓整體城市環境更舒適宜人。

全民社安網，溫暖接住每個人

忙碌的生活中，當遇到家庭難關、情緒低潮或意外變故時，你是否曾感到徬徨無助？別擔心，「全民社安網」就像一張無形的守護網，在你需要幫助時，第一時間提供最溫暖的協助。

臺北市積極落實「強化社會安全網第二期計畫」，增聘社工人力，執行全面守護的4大策略，及3大精進策略，讓每個年齡層的需求都能被看見。其中，最關鍵的是「以預防為優先」，臺北市主動出擊，及早辨識出可能面臨困難的脆弱或危機家庭，爭取在事情惡化前伸出援手，跨網路協力使悲劇減少發生的可能。

「強化社會安全網第二期計畫」

4+3大策略



守護幼兒，專責醫師計畫啟動

孩子的健康，是每個家庭最重視的事。面對少子化時代，臺北市全面啟動「幼兒專責醫師計畫」，讓每位3歲以下嬰幼兒都能在社區就近獲得最即時、貼心的醫療照護。2024年起，更開放各級醫院加入計畫，針對社會安全網個案，與基隆、新北、桃園一起討論高風險家庭幼兒的跨區收案流程，打造跨縣市合作的新模式。

這項計畫不只提供疫苗接種、健康檢查、發展評估，也提醒爸媽們及早注意幼兒健康的警訊，必要時及時轉介早療或社會資源介入。特別針對6大族群：早產兒、B肝高風險家庭子女、父母使用非法或成癮物質的孩子、疑似發展遲緩幼兒、領有中重度身心障礙手冊者之幼兒，以及逾期未接種預防針幼兒，優先納入關懷名單。推動過程雖然也遇到跨區收案缺乏固定聯繫人、個案資料不齊等問題，但也透過加強宣導，同步提供社工所需資訊，未來，臺北市也將持續擴大合作，讓每個孩子都能健康成長、安心長大，也讓家長們更有依靠！



2024年，臺北市推出了全方位的青少年自殺預防計畫，從「前端預防」開始，結合網紅製作動畫短片，用輕鬆的方式幫助青少年更了解自己的情緒，並學會辨識可能的自殺警訊，並與HBL球員合作拍攝影片，鼓勵青少年透過運動紓解壓力；

「後端協處」則增設青少年心理諮詢門診及青少年心理健康門診，讓每位青少年知道永遠有人願意伸出手，陪你走過低谷，迎向充滿希望的未來。

警政治安，跨域守護

除了社區、醫師、學校，我們的人民保母——波麗士大人，也是在守護網中一股重要的力量。

2024年，臺北市政府警察局以「落實淨樓專案，強化社安網絡」為重點，藉由執勤時走入社區，主動發覺需要協助、救護、關懷的個案，並即時通報、轉介相關社政單位。

波麗士大人也積極推動法治教育向下扎根，除每學期入校宣導外，也舉辦「療癒

犬團體輔導」、「情緒對話卡工作坊」及「青春演歌祭——拒毒反詐動漫演唱會」等多元宣導活動，以青少年感興趣的方式，讓他們輕鬆學會保護自己、遠離犯罪。

淨樓專案：為防範臺北市各大樓發生治安事故，有效預防犯罪，警察局各分局針對轄內環境複雜且暫住人口眾多之集合式住宅、出租套房及曾有案件發生或破獲及明顯有治安顧慮之對象與場所，治安顧慮人口暫住處所、被他轄查獲案件地點，列為查察目標，編排勤務加強清查。

臺北市輔導中輟多管齊下，亮眼有成

榮獲2024年中輟生預防及復學輔導工作績優縣市的臺北市，一直致力於輔導中途輟學及離校的學生，能夠重新回到學習軌道，其中一位原本就讀於蘭州國中的學生——大翁，曾因拳擊訓練受挫而逃離學校、歷經收容，重返校園後，學校為他安排過渡性教育課程，才讓他從街舞重新找回自信。



從街舞課程開始，踏出重返學習的第一步。

為協助每一位中輟或中離的學生，臺北市規劃了多元服務方案，包括：2024年設置5所中輟資源中心學校，提供輔導與行政諮詢服務，定期追蹤失聯學生；針對不同學生需求，推出客製化的彈性課程，113學年度已有77所學校參與。另外，為不適應一般體制的學生也提供多元選擇，辦理合作式中途班，安排適性課程協助完成學業，並設立4處學生社區關懷據點，如「星光書苑」、「職人町」、「南青陣」等。透過職涯探索、技能培訓與心理輔導，最後結合臺北市學生輔導諮詢中心，整合心理師、社工等專業人力，深入校園與家庭，追蹤高關懷學生，落實三級輔導機制，不放棄每一位孩子。

幸福保衛站，即時庇護及溫暖

為了加強原有的愛心服務站機制，臺北市政府在2024年特別推動「幸福保衛站」

計畫，攜手北臺灣7個縣市（基隆市、新北市、桃園市、新竹縣、新竹市、宜蘭縣、苗栗縣）以及4大超商，共同照顧18歲以下的兒少，擴大社會安全網的守護範圍。

這項計畫自2024年1月起正式啟動，只要孩子陷入困境，就能到附近超商取餐，獲得麵、飯、麵包等熱食與飲料。例如A生因家中經濟困難，每天僅有100元生活費，透過幸福保衛站不只滿足溫飽，更獲得安置與寄養協助。截至2024年底，總計已協助兒少419人次。

這項計畫的背後，是臺北市政府努力整合各方資源，與超商簽約、訓練人員，並與學校、社區、里長攜手宣導，如今全市1,789間超商、超過1萬名門市人員、500所學校、5萬名教育人員皆投入這場愛的行動，讓困境中的兒少感受到社會的溫暖和希望。

從托嬰托育到兒安，安全網全面啟動！

當爸媽把心肝寶貝交給幼兒園或托嬰中心時，這張安全網就已經開啟！為了遏止幼兒園性平事件的發生，臺北市建立「三階段知會SOP」，當幼兒園發生性平案件時，臺北市將整合社會局、家防中心和教育局的資訊，確保各單位能即時掌握狀況並聯繫處理；對於有問題的園所，則啟動預防性督導機制，從案件發生到判決前，持續追蹤疑似違法人員和該園所的狀況；如果調查後確認違法，將在幼兒園不適任人員公告專區公告違法人員的姓名和任職機構，讓社會大眾知道；若案情重大，還會成立府級跨局處緊急應變小組，加強處理和應對。

另外，為降低托育人員負擔、提高托育品質，社會局提供公辦民營托嬰中心增聘托育人員達1比4薪資補助，鼓勵托嬰中心降低照顧人數比例，1位老師最多照顧4位孩子，不只讓照顧更細緻，也減輕托育人員的壓力。同時為了加強國小輔導資源，2024年特別推動校園醫療入校方案，讓心理師與身心科醫師走進國小，提供學生、家長和老師心理與情緒諮詢，幫助孩子安心學習，目前已在23所學校展開服務。

另一方面，由於現代孩子越來越早接觸網路，面臨不少潛在風險，像是網路霸凌、網路成癮、網路性剝削等。為此，臺北市舉辦兒童安全日宣導活動「祕寶傳說

網海爭霸戰」，結合實體體驗、情境關卡與線上互動遊戲，提升家長及孩子的網路安全意識，活動吸引超過5,000人參加，收穫滿滿。

臺北市自推動全民社安網以來，串聯就學、健康、就業、福利、區里關懷、緊急救護、治安維護、社宅關懷8項網絡，建立起跨局處合作機制，讓每個角落的需求能夠被發現與支援。不管是來自鄰里的溫暖，讓困境中的家庭不再害怕，或社區警民的援手，讓走上歧路的你我有了重新回頭的機會，社安網就像一張溫暖的保護傘，成為彼此的守護者，也讓這座城市變得更有溫度。

首創模式讓全民一起動起來

不用選時間、也不用挑地點，只要帶著手機就能一起動起來，因為2024年臺北市政府已經幫市民升級「臺北健走趣」系列活動，首創全國、跳脫實體的活動模式，融合科技與智慧行動APP，並結合「臺北大縱走」、「環騎臺北」等熱門活動，讓超過123萬人加入運動行列，不僅要讓運動變得更便利、更有趣，而且隨時隨地都能動起來。

根據教育部體育署的數據顯示，其實近4成的市民平常都有運動的習慣，只是科技讓生活變得太方便，導致日常活動量也跟著下降，為了讓市民可以重新愛上運動，臺北市政府特別打造「時時能運動，處處可運動」的環境，透過APP，除了可貼心記錄喜歡的健走路線外，還有結合數位科技的健康知識問答，完成目標後可以

跟著軌跡尋寶集點，一邊開心運動、一邊闖關學習新知識。

從幼到老 全民動起來

年紀稍長的市民朋友也可以參加嗎？當然可以，因為臺北市政府不只在活動平臺呈現數位載具的使用步驟，還特別針對長者們設計簡單明瞭的活動懶人包，並透過社區健走班，請教練直接帶著長者走起來，成功提升長者參與率，創造運動無齡感。沒有智慧載具的兒童及青少年族群也不用煩惱，未來將走入校園，教導學童們身體活動及健康飲食的正確知能。臺北市政府希望藉由創新科技，帶動市民養成日常運動的好習慣，並以整座城市都是我的運動場的概念，激勵市民隨時隨地動起來，讓臺北市成為動感之都。

U-Sport 智慧化服務，動越多、賺越多

還記得上次運動是什麼時候嗎？沒關係，臺北市政府體育局的「U-Sport臺北樂運動」，要幫市民朋友找回運動的幸福感！運動不僅可以幫悠遊卡儲值，還可以換咖啡券、捷運票！這麼多好康跟福利，說什麼都要動起來。

2024年，U-Sport全面升級，最大亮點就是推出超實用的手機APP，首創與運動中心的系統串接整合，市民朋友只要持手機到合作的運動場館掃碼入場，就可以折抵及累積U幣，另外，APP也會不定時推出結合臺北市政府其他賽事或活動的限時任務贈點，動愈多、賺愈多。

由臺北市政府自行開發的U-Sport APP，透過有趣的遊戲化設計和簡單易懂的操作介面，成功吸

引更多市民加入運動行列，尤其是每日5U幣的回饋，真的很吸引人！因為累積的U幣不僅可用於折抵場館入場費、運動課程或場地租借費，還可兌換悠遊卡儲值金，不管是搭乘大眾運輸工具、騎YouBike、超商買咖啡都能使用。為了鼓勵大家下載U-Sport APP註冊，臺北市政府在2024年更特別推出限量的1,500元運動抵用金，提供符合資格的市民申請，反應非常熱烈。

為了將U-Sport臺北樂運動系統擴展到各民間運動場館，臺北市政府體育局親自走訪各大連鎖民營業者，向其說明，逐一了解其需求並彙整各方意見，再制定各家廠商的共通標準，並配合現場POS系統進行程式設定修改，達到整合U-Sport的目標。

自2024年4月17日U-Sport APP正式上線以來，截至2024年底，已有238家公、民營運動場館、超過9.4萬市民朋友一起動起來，達到151萬次以上的U幣集點人次，U幣兌換悠遊卡儲值金總額也超過1,780萬元，成功打造運動生活圈。

宣傳的效益也讓2024年4月創立的U-Sport臺北樂運動粉絲專頁短短8個月就收到1萬1,000人按讚、吸引1萬3,000位粉絲關注，留言或私訊中，皆不乏對這項計畫的支持。臺北市政府將持續努力，創新開發更多功能，例如於2025年3月起，推出「計步集點」功能，連動手機健康數據，便能累積獎勵點數，讓健康與好禮一起帶著走！

一場館一特色：臺北特色運動館計畫起跑！

為了滿足市民越來越多元的運動需求，臺北市政府體育局發起「臺北特色運動館」計畫，目標就是讓全民都能「樂在運動、動出健康」。

這項計畫透過整合公有資源、活化老舊建物，以及跨局處合作，鎖定運動資源較少的地區，逐步規劃9座各具特色的運動場館。每一座場館都融入「一場館一特色」的理念，搭配智慧永續、特色運動與綠色環保，讓運動成為城市生活中最自然、最有趣的一部分，也吸引民間力量一

同參與，推動運動產業發展，實現臺北市成為運動城市的願景。

兩大亮點開工！兒童體適能 × 射擊專館搶先登場

首先是在2024年4月率先辦理克強公園游泳池動土典禮，改建為臺北市首座以兒童體適能中心為特色的「克強運動館」，這座場館可讓小朋友在遊戲中運動、在運動中成長，幫助孩子從小打好健康基礎，不但適合親子一起活動，也將打造「兒童遊戲室、兒童戲水池」等特色設施，對想帶孩子運動的爸媽來說，根本是首選！

另外還有讓年輕人眼睛為之一亮的「公館運動館」（自來水園區）預計建置為電競運動館，將結合電子競技與虛擬運動，打造新世代的運動場域。該場館已啟動整修計畫，未來，臺北市將成為電競與科技運動的新熱點。

除了已啟動施工或規劃設計的4座場館外，其餘「臺北特色運動館」也正積極規劃中。希望透過嶄新的運動空間，讓市民有更棒的運動環境，進而愛上運動，養成規律運動的好習慣。臺北市正努力邁向「運動之都」的目標，未來擁有的不只是別具特色的運動館，更是結合科技、創新與全民參與的頂尖運動場所。讓我們一起期待臺北特色運動館，開啟健康新生活。

在創意巧思上，象徵「運動精神，薪火相傳」的聖火啟動儀式，也首次以虛擬實境投影到臺北市政府大樓牆面，呈現科技與傳統結合的無限可能。

這次賽會特別邀請在國際上大放異彩的臺灣之光——王冠閎、王齊麟、李洋及黃筱雯擔任代言人，共同點燃運動的熱情。為了鼓勵學生一同參加賽事盛會，臺北市政府安排所屬公、私立中等學校，在比賽期間停止上課，讓大家有更多機會進場觀賽、為選手打氣。另外，本次運動賽會還首創數位集章活動，讓臺北市境內國、高中生可持數位學生證刷卡進場觀賽，並累積點數兌換精美獎品；就連幼兒園與國小學生也能攜帶探索手冊，前往各競賽場館的服務臺蓋章、兌換限量好禮，在大家的熱情參與下，選手們實力也大爆發，共計10人次突破歷屆大會紀錄。

此次賽會是臺北市睽違12年再次擔任主辦城市，對於無法親臨現場為小選手加油的民眾，也提供賽會官網及YouTube平臺等多元管道，供民眾線上參與精彩賽事、共同感受比賽的熱血氛圍，並見證臺北市政府的用心與努力。

回顧過去2年，臺北市在全中運表現卓越，無論是金牌數、總獎牌數，還是總錦標成績，皆稱霸全國。為了延續這份榮耀，臺北市政府將投入更多資源，發掘與培育更多臺北市優秀的運動人才，助他們在競技場上再創巔峰！

重返全民運王座，擦亮「運動之都」招牌

在臺北，不僅年輕人熱愛騎單車、慢跑和健身運動，清晨公園的空地上，還有樂齡長者身手矯健地舞動，處處展現市民朋友一起來運動的活力！

累積的運動能量，終於在2024年全民運動會中綻放光芒，雖然辦理地點在屏東，但臺北市代表隊仍有選手及教練等隊職員，共1,075人南征，整體賽事成績也在睽違10年之後，再度重返王者寶座。團隊分別獲得藤球1金3銀、慢壘男子組金盃、女子拔河540公斤組金牌5連霸、男女混合合球金牌4連霸，以及龍舟女子組100公尺直道競速冠軍，由臺北市樂齡長者組成的

隊伍，更一舉在元極舞項目勇奪5金，總共獲得64金51銀及65銅，成績亮眼。不僅如此，「臺灣蝶王」王冠閎首次跨項挑戰水上救生，獲得200公尺障礙賽金牌、滑輪溜冰選手劉巧兮完成大會第一4連霸，以及女子花式溜冰選手洪筱晴在個人並排自由型奪金，都是臺北市運動員的最佳代表。

為了更進一步將臺北打造為名符其實的「運動之都」、支持選手斬獲好成績，臺北市政府設有基層訓練站，提供各項輔導與補助，並提高國光獎章獎勵金與訓練補助金，挹注選手在國內外賽場上持續發光發熱。

大巨蛋首度登場，點燃國球熱情！

臺北市的體育熱情持續延燒！2024年11月13日至18日，由臺北市政府體育局與中華民國棒球協會，共同主辦的2024年第3屆世界12強棒球錦標賽（臺灣區預賽），在臺北大巨蛋和天母棒球場熱烈開戰！這不僅是臺北大巨蛋啟用後，舉辦最高級別的頂級國際棒球賽事，更見證了中華隊以驚人的實力，一路過關斬將，以分組第2的優異成績晉級決賽，最終以完美的表現勇奪賽事冠軍，這一刻，讓全臺球迷再次陷入「國球瘋」，激情再燃！

突破創新，讓全世界都看見臺北

2024年第3屆世界12強棒球錦標賽（臺灣區預賽）吸引超過18萬人湧入現場觀賽，並在各大平臺累積超過1,500萬人次觀看，成為國際焦點，每場平均吸引超過2.8萬名觀眾。

賽事期間，媒體報導高達3,567篇，總媒體價值超過5.4億元！繼世界棒球12強錦標賽後，大巨蛋將繼續迎來2025年第6屆世界棒球經典賽臺灣區資格賽及雙北世界壯

年運動會等國際賽事。臺北市將藉此機會展現強大的運動實力，並向世界展示舉辦高規格國際運動賽事的能力。

馬拉松就像是一場體力的持久戰，在2019至2020年取得世界田徑總會銅標籤認證、2021至2023年升級為菁英標籤之後，臺北馬拉松於2024年首度晉升為金標籤，成為全臺第一個世界田徑總會認證的金標籤市區型馬拉松賽事。

2024年，臺北馬拉松結合市區24個特色地標：從國父紀念館、中正紀念堂、4座古城門、臺北車站、總統府、臺北光



點、美術公園、環東高架、臺北小巨蛋及臺北田徑場等，透過運動宣揚臺北城市風貌及在地特色人文，吸引運動選手日後造訪觀光。

此外，2024年臺北馬拉松的主視覺也融合在地意象、時空背景與年度主題標語，展現獨特性並強化國際感，使主視覺與賽事主題緊密相連。專屬賽事 Logo 以「梅比斯環」為靈感，象徵跑者的「呼吸」、「堅持」與「意志力」，彰顯臺北馬拉松帶來的生命力與希望。

適逢臺北建城140週年，賽事首次推出結合城市風貌的指引牌，同時攜手百年老店推出專屬優惠，賽道途中也特別在百年廟宇松山慈祐宮設置「跑者祈福牆」，不僅為活動祈願順利、也祝福每位參與者取得佳績，更凸顯出臺北市深厚的人文底蘊與地方信仰。另一項針對肢障輪椅組的賽程，還提供專屬帳篷、殿後車、輪椅檢修站及協力人員，讓許多身障和視障跑友能一圓參與國際賽事的夢想，打造出多元共融的馬拉松賽事，實踐運動平權的舞台。

專題報導 6 新穎之光智能城

隨著數位化時代的來臨，臺北市政府積極打造智慧城市，將人工智慧與創新科技融入日常生活，從校園到企業，臺北市不斷拓展智慧應用，讓學習與創業都得以升級，也透過創業政策和平臺支持創業者，讓創新科技不僅造福學校，也滲入企業與市民的日常生活，讓都市充滿便民的科技服務，創造更智慧的生活方式。

酷AI學習，讓自主學習更輕鬆！

在數位學習浪潮的帶動下，臺北市政府教育局於2024年全面升級優化「臺北酷課雲——酷AI學習系統」，且進一步擴充2023年推出的「AI口說練習」功能，除了更貼近親師生的教學與學習需求，也能引導學生隨時隨地運用科技自主學習，不僅拓展學習的無限可能，也讓教學更智慧化。截至2024年底，酷AI學習系統已舉辦248場研習、培訓7,220位教師，並發布173包市本課程，累積超過21萬人次使用，平均每天都有700多人透過酷AI學習系統探索新知，一步步邁向學習適性化的願景，讓學習變得更聰明、更有趣！

老師的神隊友，學生的學習神器

許多學生從小學習英文，但開口說總是緊張不安，用英文寫作更是一項挑戰！為了善用科技提升學生學習效率，並以多元方式練習作文、降低教師教學負擔，2024年，酷AI學習系統特別新增「AI圖像辨識（OCR）」功能，讓學生能透過紙本書寫、拍照上傳、手寫後上傳或直接輸入文字等方式練習作文外，同時也導入「AI生成對抗網路（GAN）」功能，協助教師依據難易度、題型、關鍵字等條件靈活出題，不僅提升出題品質與效率，也能精準掌握學生學習狀況，有效減輕教學壓力。成效分析顯示，參與AI學習的學生測驗成績顯著提升！這項創新科技不僅幫助學生學習，也讓老師的教學更輕鬆。志清國小的李衿綺老師分享道：「老師的火眼金睛固然重要，但AI的作文給分功能讓人輕鬆多了！它幫助我們快速檢視學生寫作細節，提出修正建議，減輕批改負擔，提升學生學習成效。」未來，臺北市政府將持續傾聽師生的反饋，關注需求，讓AI成為數位時代的得力助手。

創業不是夢，新創三箭全力助攻！

你是否心中懷抱著創業熱情，卻因資金短缺、人才難尋、市場開拓不易而卻步呢？別灰心，臺北市政府早已為有志創業的民眾設想到。

臺北市政府在2024年持續擴大並深化「新創三箭」的政策，透過資金、人才、市場3個面向，為創業者提供全方位的支援。針對資金需求，推出「擴大獎勵補助計畫」，除原有補助項目外，2023年9月新增「主題式研發」項目，聚焦於「綠色創新」與「AI創新應用」等領域；2024年則進一步推出與民間創投及天使投資機構合作「新創拔尖補助」，公私協力助具國際潛力的頂尖新創拓展海外市場，通過審核者可獲最高1,500萬元補助，首次徵件以「資通訊軟硬體」與「生技醫療」領域為徵件主題；截至2024年2項新增補助項目共已核准52案，補助金額達1億2,370萬元，提供創業團隊資金支持，讓產品有機會順利進軍市場。

然而，光有資金還不夠，人才更是關鍵，針對不同階段的創業團隊開設創業初階、進階課程，從創業初期所需的核心知識，到創業有成對接創投資金，打造臺北

創業家練功升級模式；更透過與政大、北科大、大同大學等學術機構合作校園創業營隊，對於擁有創業夢想的應屆畢業生來說，不僅可以學習如何撰寫商業計畫書和投資簡報，還能將原本只是課堂作業的學習專案，轉化為創投關注的潛力計畫，讓學生的創業夢想從校園階段就開始萌芽，也幫助每位學生為未來的職涯發展做好充分準備，而這正是臺北市政府將創業服務觸角延伸至校園的重要成果。不只如此，臺北市政府更於「2024 TRENDY TAIPEI 潮臺北」活動期間首次辦理「StartSphere Taipei台北創新創業總匯」的新創盛會，以「今日科技、明日潮流」為主題，邀請到8國、20家以上國際創投、獨角獸、跨國AI新創及國際媒體創辦人，活動總計超過760人次參與。

當資金與人才到位後，市場才是創業的致勝關鍵，為了協助新創團隊拓展市場、邁向國際，臺北市政府在2024年推出了「創業家護照」，串聯全球10國、21座城市，為新創企業搭建成跨境發展的橋梁，讓優質產品走向世界！此外，也推出了「TOPS台北好購推廣平台」，幫助企業對接政府與企業採購需求，短短4個月內便促

成4,126萬元交易額，未來期待透過TOPS平臺，讓更多新創產品接觸到政府和大企業，提升營收並獲得更多合作機會。從資金補助、人才培育到市場拓展，臺北市政府提供全方位的創業支持，協助新創加速規模化與國際化，成為國內外人才在臺北實現創業夢想的最堅實後盾。

智慧客服新體驗，1999熱線AI助攻！

「1999臺北市民熱線您好，很高興為您服務。」過去，臺北市政府1999話務人員在接聽市民來電時，總是擔心會漏記重要資訊，或聽不清楚反映的內容而備感壓力，雖然總能提供有效的便民服務，但工作效率也因此有所限制。

在2024年，臺北市政府研考會及資訊局聯合啟動「運用語音即時轉文字技術及FAQ結合AI提升1999服務品質」實證計畫，利用AI技術的導入，不僅能精準記錄市民的來電內容，更可以讓話務人員專注聆聽需求及快速回應，從根本解決長期以來的作業痛點，也讓整體服務更有溫度。

實證顯示，來電內容能即時轉換為約達90%辨識準確率的文字；針對常見問題，AI小幫手也能提供話務人員參考答案，縮小資深與資淺人員的經驗差距。此

外，系統還具備緊急案件自動標示及熱門關鍵字提示功能，讓1999熱線的服務品質提升至新高度，致力成為全球智慧城市的典範。

2024臺北市AI-Driven 智慧城市 未來感爆棚

為因應人工智慧技術快速發展，臺北市政府於2024年率全國之先發布「使用人工智慧作業指引」，適用對象為臺北市政府及所屬各機關，包括人工智慧架構、9項應用情境、4個使用風險級距、6大應承擔的責任原則及4項應遵守法律規範等提供明確原則、操作流程與檢核機制，確保AI技術在市政運作中的效率與安全，讓市民可以放心地享受智慧科技的便利與升級服務。

另外，臺北市政府首度舉辦的「2024臺北生成藝術節」，以先進AI技術結合多元文化與當代藝術，用全新的生成藝術詮釋不同的藝術創作，讓大眾認識並了解獨特生成藝術的樣貌，也成功吸引跨世代族群的參與，從國中生到退休老師皆報名參加，尤其是樂齡族群分享與年輕人的共同創作，所獲得的成就感與接觸AI科技的驚喜，成功展現臺北市智慧與人文共融的現代城市風貌。

懂創新、開源與應用，智慧城市亮眼也有感

想快速融入臺北生活嗎？透過臺北城市儀表板，所有城市資訊一目了然，這個清晰的視覺化平臺彙整了捷運、交通、共享單車、城市規劃等重要數據。截至2024年，臺北市已開放2,800多項資料，不僅讓市民即時掌握城市動態，也讓政府機關更精準高效地推動工作。

為了促進臺北市政府與民間開發的交流互動，資訊局在2024年舉辦2場臺北程式設計節大黑客松，邀請各路程式設計高手共聚一堂，攜手開發能真正解決市民日常需求的便民數位服務，同時也啟動以建立服務型政府為目標的「臺北城市儀表板開源計畫」，不僅全力支持開放原始碼，也逐步將開源技術導入市政服務，期望降低成本之餘，也提高政府經營效率。該首發計畫同時也榮獲政府服務獎「數位創新加

值」獎項，「台北通APP」也跟進「臺北城市儀表板開源計畫」逐步將服務架構開源與民共享，並支持其他各地方政府挑選適用功能進行開發，打造專屬城市APP。臺北市政府以「共創」與「共益」為核心理念，致力推廣開放原始碼計畫，期待台北通因此改善並有效提升資訊系統服務品質，實現便民共榮的智慧城市願景。

透過不斷推陳出新的創舉，臺北市不僅在數位服務和開源合作方面，取得顯著成效，也在全球舞臺上展示卓越的智慧城市實力。根據瑞士洛桑管理學院IMD所公布的「2024年全球智慧城市指數」調查報告，臺北市在142個城市中躍居第16名，榮耀的成績不僅證明臺北市在推動智慧城市發展方面的努力和成果，也讓全世界看見臺北市在數位治理和創新領域的領先地位。

為實現2050淨零排放目標，臺北市全面啟動淨零轉型行動！從鼓勵市民節電抽獎、補助住宅與企業汰換節能設備、推動綠色運輸與回收機制，到成立永續人才院、發行永續發展債券，臺北市以政策、資源與創新作為後盾，全面打造低碳永續城市，讓全體市民都能透過多元方案參與節能減碳，一同為臺北的未來努力！

淨零獎百萬，從個人做起

你知道節電也能拿獎金嗎？為了邁向2050年淨零排放目標，臺北市推出「淨零拚轉型 節電3%獎百萬」活動，鼓勵市民從日常生活做起，只要在家用電比去年同期省下3%，就有機會抽中3萬元甚至10萬元獎金！

活動在2024年已有超過1萬2,000戶參加，光是全年就創造了294萬度的總節電量，相當於減碳1,450公噸。除了大型抽獎，內湖區直接透過端午佳節，邀請里民攜帶自家電費單至現場，登錄活動、兌換小禮，可謂是全民一心，逐步養成良好的節電習慣。

「我是租屋族，是不是就不能申請了？」，只要租客能取得屋主的同意書，也可以參加活動。如是社會住宅住戶，只需由管委會在同意書上蓋章即可。活動未來也會結合社區節慶活動等多元管道，擴大民眾參與，讓「淨零」不再是口號，而是融入市民的生活日常。

積極迎向淨零，鼓勵發展綠能

為了邁向淨零新生活，臺北市推出「113年度臺北市住宅社區及團體創能儲能及節能補助計畫」，擴增補助對象至「團



為配合本市2050淨零排放目標，並提升市民創能減碳意識，臺北市辦理113年度「淨零拚轉型 節電3%獎百萬」抽獎活動，藉此鼓勵市民從日常生活省電做起，透過家戶節能，逐步邁向淨零目標。

體」，並新增補助「電梯電力回生裝置」與「落地式箱型冷氣」等項目，鼓勵住家或社區裝設太陽能板、省電設備、玻璃隔熱膜等，發展綠能自給自足供電。2024年總計補助11處住宅、3處社區及18處團體設置創儲節能設備，1,701處住宅貼玻璃隔熱膜，並協助236戶低收入戶汰換節能冰箱、冷氣，預估每年節電約158萬度，減碳約780公噸。



財團法人天主教失智老人社會福利基金會經過汰換冰水主機後，不僅改善了耗電問題，長輩的生活品質也提升了。

另外臺北市社福及宗教團體，像臺北市私立愛愛院，因為補助更換了老舊冷氣，電費省了，長輩的生活品質也提升了；葫蘆寺則安裝節能冷氣，為信徒打造更舒適的低碳集會環境。同時，臺北市政府更積極舉辦說明會，讓市民了解「淨零新生活」其實離我們不遠，從換一臺節能冷氣、貼一片隔熱玻璃膜做起，就能改變城市的未來。

鼓勵企業節能，省電省錢又減碳！

現在電費節節高升，許多店家、企業都感受到荷包壓力。為此，臺北市政府推出「服務業汰換節能設備補助」，已成功補助1,484件申請案，比如內湖某咖啡店汰換冷氣後，每月電費少了2,000元，相當於半年網路費；中山區某銀行更換LED燈具與高效冷氣，每年省下19萬元電費，成為節能標竿！還有甜品店業者分享：「原本擔心申請麻煩，後來發現有專人協助，流程非常簡單。加裝空氣門簾與循環扇後，每年省下6,000度電，約2萬元電費，環境更舒適，顧客也很滿意！」

臺北市政府深知節能減碳不僅是環保趨勢，更能為服務業帶來實質的經濟效益，進而提升企業競爭力。因此，臺北市政府設立了0800諮詢專線及節電辦公室，

專門協助民眾釐清補助規定，積極推動「服務業汰換節能設備補助」。至2024年補助已達1.67億元，未來還要擴大補助，讓更多企業受惠。歡迎設籍於臺北市的中小企業撥打免費諮詢電話0800-580-037，讓我們一起來節能減碳、共創商機。

臺北淨零101計畫，一起為環保出力！

減碳不是口號！臺北市政府與臺北市商業會攜手發起「臺北淨零101計畫」，目標是3年內完成101個淨零排放示範場域，透過社會共同參與，讓綠色生活真正走入日常。

就像龍山寺，裝設太陽能板和儲能系統，每年預估可發電5,900度，減碳3,000公斤；市立大學、超市等地設置智慧回收機，讓民眾回收寶特瓶、鋁罐、廢電池，還能累積悠遊卡儲值金，既環保又實用；萬華商圈舉辦舊衣回收活動，鼓勵大家循環利用，減少浪費。內湖區週美里自從設置智慧回收機後，孩子們開心投瓶子換零用錢，從小養成環保習慣，家長也樂見其成。

所有生活中的改變都需要市民共同的參與！一起從日常小事做起，為臺北打造永續宜居的未來！

減碳換抽獎，全民環保一起來

個人「碳有價時代」來了，你跟上了嗎？臺北市自2024年首創「我的減碳存摺」大獲肯定，進而連結北部4個市共同推出「基北北桃我的減碳存摺全民運動」，運具範圍擴及北北基桃的公車、捷運、YouBike、臺鐵、公路及國道客運等，已超過33萬人參與，累積減碳量達4萬公噸。

「我的減碳存摺」就像幫我們記錄減碳功勞的小幫手，只要透過專屬平臺或App登錄你的減碳行為，利用全球首創通過BSI查核的電子票證碳盤查系統（悠遊付）計算減碳量，還可透過「月月抽」、「滿額抽」、「週五加碼抽」、「減碳英雄榜」等活動拿大獎。2024年臺北市還新增了模範企業及減碳響應區，讓減碳響應更普及，不僅個人能養成環保習慣，企業也能展現永續價值，政府更能推動碳中和目標，形成三贏局面。

綠色運輸升級，減碳更便捷

你今天YouBike了沒？隨著臺北市在2024年重新啟動YouBike前30分鐘免費政策，現在大家出門不管是上學、購物都好方便，加上站點與車輛的積極擴充，至2024年，全臺北市已有1,505個租借站、超過2萬

輛腳踏車，每天使用次數突破19萬次，是全球規模數一數二的公共自行車系統。

為確保大家租得到YouBike，臺北市政府運用大數據分析，優化YouBike調度，首創全國推出「見車率」指標，哪裡有車一目了然，這項創舉不只提升YouBike使用率，和市民出行的便利性，更鼓勵市民以YouBike作為綠色運輸的選擇，幫助城市減少碳排放，努力往2030年減碳40%、綠運輸使用率達70%的目標邁進。

不只如此，臺北市也加快推動電動公車，讓新公車配備高科技安全系統，行駛更安靜、平穩，截至2024年底有712輛上路，數量全國第一，讓乘客和居民都感受暨安全又舒適的通勤品質。

培訓淨零先鋒，城市淨零轉型

您可能不知道，為了城市永續、為了臺北市民，臺北市政府正積極培育更多綠色專家，全力推動淨零減碳。

2024年，臺北市政府成立了「永續人才院」，課程內容兼具學理與實務，除了探討城市治理的專業知能，還有生活中能輕易實踐的作法，第一屆培訓48位專業種子人員，還有12名菁英去丹麥學習，擬定9項永續行動方案；除此之外，還跟中央政府、學校、企業一起舉辦工作坊和研討會，透過政策、法規與人才的「零碳鐵三角」，讓臺北市成為真正的低碳模範城市！

不僅如此，臺北市舉辦37場跟綠生活有關的課程，近2,000位公務同仁參訓滿意度高達9成以上；臺北e大數位學習平臺提供25門數位課程讓大家自主學習，累積學習已經超過 7萬8,252人次、13萬小時，可見不只市府同仁，市民們也都為臺北市的永續未來打拼，厚植永續的軟硬實力！

首發政府永續債與國際接軌

2024年臺北市政府率各級政府之先發行「永續發展債券」，總金額達新臺幣100億元，這筆資金專用於具環境友善、帶動區域建設發展及平價便捷等社會效益之捷運建設，不僅符合聯合國永續發展目標（SDGs），每年亦可為市庫節省逾7,000萬元利息支出，兼顧永續與財政效益。

為促成此項創舉，臺北市積極主動與櫃買中心溝通協調，說明政府預、決算審查流程制度特色，為公部門爭取更具彈性的發行條件，並促使該中心修正永續債發行規範，賦予各級政府發行永續債的依據；同時辦理多場會議與說明會，邀集市府相關機關、櫃買中心及市庫代理銀行共同參與協力推辦。

經不斷努力推動、排除各項困難與挑戰，臺北市政府於2024年成功發行全國首檔政府永續債券，不僅為地方政府開創多元財務工具、樹立新典範，亦創造城市、企業、市民的永續三贏，為社會、環境帶來正向及長遠的影響。

專題報導 8 繢情國際展魅力

深化國際交流，拓展全球連結

面對國際局勢快速變化與城市交流需求日增，2024年的臺北市不只專注於市政工作，更踏上國際舞臺與世界各地建立連結，走訪多座重要國際城市、參與論壇、簽訂協議。同時，也熱情接待了來自不同國家的貴賓，讓整座城市更貼近世界脈動，為市民朋友帶來多元的國際視野與合作機會。

智慧防災傳遞臺北經驗

當全球城市齊聚一堂共商未來願景時，臺北當然不會缺席。2024年5月，蔣萬安市長應東京都知事小池百合子（Koike Yuriko）的熱情邀請，率團出席「2024東京永續高科技論壇市長峰會（SusHi Tech Tokyo 2024 City Leaders Program）」，與來自全球40多個城市的首長共議永續、智慧與防災等重要議題。

也由於臺北市擁有面對地震的豐富經驗，蔣萬安市長受邀在開幕式後的「安全城市」論壇中發表「Building a Safe City through Innovation（創新思維・安全之都）」專題演講，分享臺北市在2024年4月3日大地震發生後，如何運用「災害應變雲端協作平臺」迅速整合通報、調度資源、降低災損，體現「市長在哪裡，EOC就在

哪裡」的智慧防災思維。除出席論壇外，市府團隊也拜會日本自民黨青年局、東京都議會、日本前首相麻生太郎（Aso Taro）與多位政要，就防災、少子高齡化等議題深入交流，拓展臺日城市外交。

市府團隊此行特別造訪東京巨蛋，就大型活動與賽事的安全管理、危機應變等議題，與東京巨蛋團隊交換寶貴經驗。觀光推廣方面，蔣萬安市長出席東京晴空塔「台灣祭」，現場親手製作蚵仔煎，與民眾熱情互動，生動行銷臺北的美食與夜市文化。大阪府知事吉村洋文（Yoshimura Hirofumi）亦親赴東京與市府團隊會晤，針對即將各自主辦的2025年雙北世界壯年運動會與大阪・關西世博會的共同宣傳、觀光文化交流等主題，展開合作對話。此次出訪行程結合科技、防災、觀光與文化，實為一次成果豐碩的國際交流。

美東深度交流，民主與創新並行

2024年9月，臺北市政府團隊與市議會代表團前往美國東岸，展開為期11天的深度交流，足跡遍及紐約、波士頓、費城與紐澤西等地，主要聚焦「都市治理」、「產業發展」、「青年事務」與「智慧應用」4大主軸，並強調臺北的民主價值與國際競爭力。

美東行程中，蔣萬安市長一行拜會紐約城市規劃局與交通局，深入了解紐約「City of Yes」住房政策，包括土地使用分區鬆綁、推動大眾運輸導向的開發等實務經驗，作為臺北都更與交通規劃的參考藍圖。

在城市外交方面，蔣萬安市長與姊妹市波士頓市長吳弭（Michelle Wu）會面，重申雙方共有著包容、友善的城市願景，兩市將持續針對氣候變遷、極端氣候、城市災害應變措施及企業創新應用等議題廣泛交流，並在教育、醫療、生物科技及文化藝術等領域深化合作。

在產業創新與智慧應用層面，團隊參訪麻省理工學院旗下的多個頂尖實驗室，包括媒體實驗室（MIT Media Lab）、電腦科學與人工智慧實驗室（MIT CSAIL）等，考察智慧城市及人工智慧於市政領域的相關應用，並簽署合作意向書，進一步引入先進研究、制度與系統。

在麻州期間，蔣萬安市長受邀於哈佛大學甘迺迪學院發表「Global Taipei: Bridging Tradition and Innovation（全球臺北：連結傳統與創新）」專題演講，並與現場學生進行互動問答。內容強調臺北是一座包容的城市，且民主是臺北的核心價值，將繼續以這樣的信念，帶領臺北前行。

臺北市政府團隊在費城拜會賓州大學國際事務部門Penn Global，宣傳臺北市青年局實習生計畫，也與華頓商學院洽談選送高階公務人才赴美進修機制，促進雙邊人才流動與知識交流。不僅強化臺北市與國際頂尖學府的合作關係，也為培育具國際視野的人才奠定堅實基礎。

拓展國際網絡 落實制度性合作

除了重要的國際城市訪問行程，臺北市政府也積極透過簽署合作意向書（MOU），與其他城市建立長久制度化的交流管道。2024年3月21日，李四川副市長代表臺北市政府與瓜地馬拉市馬丁涅斯副市長（Víctor Manuel Alejandro Martínez Ruiz）簽署合作意向書，內容涵蓋城市規劃、水資源、垃圾處理與智慧交通等領域。

這份協定的簽訂，將幫助臺北市與瓜地馬拉市在城市永續發展方面相互交流學習，實踐城市間互助的精神，並增進兩市的實質關係。而瓜地馬拉市運輸處長莫拉塔亞（Eddy Leonel Morataya Ortiz）對臺北的捷運系統與交通建設讚譽有加，表示他們正計畫興建第一條地鐵線，希望能參考臺北的經驗，打造便捷又宜居的城市樣貌。

深化城市外交，厚植國際人脈

你知道嗎？2024年臺北市迎來加勒比海的金石城（Kingstown）與日本愛媛縣的松山市（Matsuyama City）2位新的夥伴。

2月，松山市與臺北市政府觀光傳播局及藝術家蜷川實花（Ninagawa Mika）合作，於松山文創園區舉辦「殘照：光影生命」攝影展，作為兩市簽署友好交流協定10週年紀念活動。10月11日，兩市進

而協議簽訂「友誼市」協定，新協定納入新創產業、青年交流、環境永續等交流主題，象徵雙方關係邁入新階段。

5月21日，聖文森及格瑞那丁（Saint Vincent and the Grenadines）總理龔薩福（PM. Ralph E. Gonsalves）親自來臺，見證臺北市與金石城（Kingstown）締結為姊妹市，成為蔣萬安市長上任以來首個正式締結的姊妹市，也為臺北在中南美洲開展外交打下基礎。

小池百合子（Koike Yuriko）知事來訪，與蔣市長就防災、人口對策與永續發展深入對談，除了討論2025年東京聽障奧運及雙北世壯運等體育賽事的相關合作，也特別參觀了市府災害應變中心，對臺北的防災準備留下深刻印象。5月，聖文森及格瑞那丁總理龔薩福（PM. Ralph E. Gonsalves）率團來臺，出席姊妹市簽署儀式，雙方都期盼未來能在文化、教育及基礎建設方面有進一步的合作；7月，馬紹爾群島國會議長瓦西（Brenson Wase）也來訪，雙方共同回顧成果並展望未來交流；法國參議院外交暨國防委員會副主席卡迪克（Olivier Cadic）拜會臺北市政府，與蔣萬安市長就教育等各項市政議題相互分享交流。

另外，第16屆城市網（CityNet）災害小組會議暨國際研討會也在臺北市舉辦，來自亞洲13國的城市代表與專家齊聚探討「以人為本的韌性城市」主題，並實地參訪臺北市災防設施與重要建設，讓與會者感受臺北防災與都市規劃的實力。

臺北 × 上海，兩岸城市務實交流

作為年度重點的兩岸城市交流平臺，「臺北上海城市論壇」於2024年12月17日舉辦，這次論壇以「智慧治理、永續未來」為主題，針對友善交通、河川治理、人文城市3大領域進行深入的討論。論壇期間，雙方簽署了「臺北市與上海市推動智慧醫療合作備忘錄」及「臺北市立動物園與上海動物園小貓熊物種交流及保育合作備忘錄」2項合作備忘錄，共同分享城市治理的經驗。

臺北市與上海市透過雙城論壇進行多元領域交流、持續追求共榮共好。蔣萬安市長在論壇中強調「雙城好、兩岸好」，並認為兩岸間應該「多一點對話、少一點對峙」，相信兩岸城市持續推展務實交流，才能為兩岸市民帶來更多福祉。

安全守護新進化

智慧車隊管理系統，高效精準的消防英雄


每當消防車的鳴笛響徹臺北市街頭時，市民總能看見那一身紅衣的城市英雄穿梭巷弄、奔赴現場，街頭氣氛也隨之緊繃。然而，今日的消防團隊早已不同以往，不僅憑藉訓練有素的專業與應變能力，背後挾帶著強大的智慧支援，有無數科技化的結晶作為最堅實的後盾。

2024年，臺北市政府消防局積極推動「消防智慧車隊管理系統」，導入物聯網(IoT)技術並結合大數據分析，全面升級消防與救護車輛管理模式。消防車輛除配備行車視野輔助系統、駕駛員生理監測等先進安全設備外，更可即時傳輸災情現場影像，提供第一手資訊給指揮端判斷，並且透過車載360度環景攝影機與遠端操作功能，第一線消防人員得以將現場畫面即時回傳至臺北市政府消防局救災救護指揮中心，使指揮端得以快速掌握態勢、精準判讀災情，並依實況即時調派最適當的人力與車輛資源。

這套系統不僅提升了車輛調度效率與緊急應變精準度，更奠定智慧應變基礎。未來，消防局將持續擴充系統功能，朝向全市車隊數位整合與智慧化運作邁進，為市民打造更安全、即時且有感的消防服務網絡。

視訊影音與協作平臺：讓救援更迅速

2024年，臺北市政府消防局正式建置完成「119視訊影音平臺」，將高科技應用導入緊急通報流程，翻轉傳統報案模式。當民眾撥打119報案時，指揮中心可透過簡

訊發送視訊連結，由報案人點選後，立即建立視訊通話，協助指揮人員第一時間掌握現場狀況，在視訊過程中，值勤人員可即時引導民眾逃生或施以初步急救，也能透過畫面輔助災情判讀，加快派遣決策並提升資源調度準確度。視訊報案機制不僅提升了報案效率，更讓受困民眾在危急時刻獲得即時回應與陪伴，強化市民在災難中的安全感。

消除高層建築消防安全隱憂

高樓大廈密集座落於臺北市都會區，一旦發生火警，救災難度高且人命風險極大。為杜絕潛在危害、確保居住安全，臺北市政府消防局自重大火災事件中汲取教訓，全面盤點臺北市高層建築，並強化消防設備檢查及制度落實。截至2024年底，全市列管高層建築共計924棟，其中已完成檢查的集合住宅593棟、非集合住宅326棟。經檢查結果顯示，除17棟集合住宅消防設備不符規定，消防局已啟動持續督導與限期改善機制外，其餘建築均符合規範。

消防局並透過持續列管、定期查核與責任回報等制度，強化高風險建築的火災預防與應變能力。每一次的實地檢查，都是對市民生命財產的守護；透過制度落實與責任追蹤，讓臺北市民在高樓中也能安心居住、夜晚無虞入眠。

急重症整合系統：與時間賽跑，守護生命

與時間賽跑的不只是消防專業，還需具備基本的醫療知識，在面對心肌梗塞與急性腦中風等急重症時，急救的處置往往攸關生死。

「急重症整合系統」正是臺北市政府消防局推動的智慧醫療創新，目的是提升急救效率與患者存活率，過去急救流程中資料分散、重複登錄且仰賴人工作業，如今透過此系統整合OHCA、腦中風、重

大創傷與心肌梗塞等重症資訊，不僅減少輸入錯誤，也與醫院系統無縫串聯，確保資料即時且完整，此外系統也結合了CPR+AED教學平臺、急重症App與院前儀表板，讓救護人員能即時上傳患者資訊，醫院能掌握醫病狀況，提早做準備，2024年更積極籌備導入藍牙監視設備與強化統計報表分析，能減輕前線人力負擔，為患者爭取黃金救援時間，讓急救從與時間賽跑的艱困行動，更進化為高效率與精準的市民守護。

智慧系統升級：科技再加碼，守護更全面

臺北市政府消防局持續強化智慧防災布局，積極導入無人機、感測設備及多項先進科技，擴展城市在災害監測與應變上的即時性與精準度。透過科技化裝備的升級與整合，無論是街角的突發火警、密閉空間內的濃煙，或是高樓層火場監控，皆能即時傳回現場資訊，輔助指揮決策，強化應變部署效率。這些宛如城市「隱形翅膀」的智慧工具，使第一線人員獲得更堅實的後盾，也讓臺北市的災防體系從預警、應變到復原全面提升。未來，消防局將持續整合前瞻科技，完善各類型風險的即時監控與應對能力，致力打造一座讓市民真正安心生活的智慧安全城市。

樂活親水漾逍遙

河岸重生，生態、綠意與人和的完美平衡

原本只是冰冷水泥堤岸的指南溪，隨著「景美溪及指南溪匯流口護岸再造工程」的完成，如今已經煥然一新，成為一條充滿生命與綠意的生態河流，如今這條河不再沉默不語，水景潭、瀨、灘交替變化，成為動植物的家園，食蟹獴和臺灣藍鵲在這片水域中自由穿梭，附近的居民和路過的遊客也能親身體驗這片重生的自然綠意。從麻網植生護坡到打椿編柵護坡，每一個設計細節都圍繞著生態保護，甚至拆除的混凝土被回收利用，減少碳排放，這不僅僅是一場工程，更是周圍生態的重生，這條新生的河岸步道也串聯了北政國中和政大校園，居民再也不用穿越校園，可以直接擁抱大自然，享受綠意盎然的生活樂趣。

關渡碼頭貨櫃市集：河岸間的人文薈萃

2024年關渡碼頭貨櫃市集的開幕，將這片以防洪為主的河岸，變成市民的休閒

天堂，如今眼前不僅有波光粼粼的河面，還有14個富有異國風情的美食攤位，讓每位遊客都可以享受味覺的全球旅行。

對於遊客來說，關渡碼頭不僅有好吃的美食小吃，還有愜意的氛圍與直覺性的娛樂藍圖，輕食區附近也增設了YouBike 2.0及機車停車格，增加接駁車和公車次數，此外，更結合航運業者推出河上交通服務，遊客可以搭乘遊船，穿梭於關渡和大稻埕之間，一邊欣賞美麗的河景，一邊探索關渡宮與北投溫泉等景點。

水岸空間從單一的防洪設施，轉型為兼具親水性與友善氛圍的休閒場所，一直是臺北市政府努力推動的目標。同時，市府也沒有忘記生態永續的重要性，在貨櫃市集周邊建置地下電纜系統和先進的污水排放設施，營造出與環境和諧共生的整體環境。不僅為水岸注入新活力，也讓原本冷清的防洪區域，搖身一變成為市民與遊客能夠放慢腳步、細細品味生活的地方。

臺北河濱花海：繽紛四季的浪漫畫卷

2024年的臺北河濱，依然充滿色彩與活力，隨著四季更迭，像一幅美麗的畫卷，每逢假日，隨處可見民眾推著嬰兒車悠閒賞花，河濱公園早已成為市民假日休憩、親近自然的最佳去處。

大佳河濱公園的1萬平方公尺秋日金黃花海、洲美大橋下的河雙21河濱花海，一如既往地散發美麗，2024年美堤河濱花海加碼在壘球場旁灑播約4,600平方公尺的大波斯菊，搖身一變成野花系的特色花海；延平河濱夜晚的蒲公英和蘆葦燈飾，為寒冷的冬天增添溫暖色彩；古亭河濱花海則營造出鄉村原野風，並打造帆船眺望臺；與過往相比，2024年的花海設計更加多元精緻，融合藝術裝置與現代景觀設計，帶來視覺上的全新震撼與情感共鳴，每個角落都充滿創意與驚喜，讓這座城市的風貌更加多彩多姿。

台北水舞嘉年華：城市夜間燦爛聲光饗宴

當彩虹橋蛻變成藝術之橋時，以「水耀錫口·霓彩虹影」為題的「2024台北水舞嘉年華」便成為夜晚最耀眼的城市盛事。值得一提的是，於橋梁施放水舞更是全臺首創，讓彩虹橋成為全場最吸睛的焦點。

這場水舞嘉年華串聯饒河街觀光夜市、五分埔商圈、松山慈祐宮等熱門景點，並結合2024錫口文化節、幸福單身聯誼、毛孩夏日派對及閉幕青春樂團演唱會等多元活動，吸引超過79萬人次參加，創造了新臺幣9億元觀光產值。

當水柱從彩虹橋落下，燈光也隨著音樂節奏閃爍，讓觀眾沉醉於水舞炫麗的視聽饗宴中。在活動滿意度高達96.6%的背後，其實凝聚了臺北市政府的諸多努力。這是臺北市第一次舉辦的水舞嘉年華，籌辦過程中面臨不少挑戰，包括基隆河水量不足、河中障礙物清除等技術問題，經臺北市政府觀光傳播局多次跨局處協調及會勘，克服了種種困難，讓彩虹橋再次閃耀並帶動了周邊商圈人潮和買氣，讓市民與遊客在親水的氛圍中，感受臺北城市的多樣性魅力。

潤澤節流構韌性

完善供水管網 邁向永續城市

為了讓臺北在永續發展的路上更穩健前行，臺北市政府積極強化供水系統，以「降低漏水率」作為重要目標，參考國際水協會建議作法，持續推動「汰換老舊管線」、「主動控制漏水」、「辦理水壓管理」及「提升修漏效率與品質」等管理措施。截至2024年底，成功汰換2,770公里老舊管線，不僅達成原有目標，更超越國際建議的年汰換率1.5%，漏水率從2005年底26.99%下降至2024年底10.27%，年漏水件數由1萬1,283件減少至2,156件，路面開挖次數減少逾8成，每日平均配水量減少約57.9萬公噸水資源，節省的水量可配合中央水資源調度政策，有效跨區支援與紓解旱象。目前臺北自來水事業處轄內的供水管網總長超過6,000公里，經過逐步扎實地改善漏水管線問題，臺北市政府也獲得了豐富的成果。臺北市政府2024年8月於加

拿大多倫多IWA國際水協會世界大會榮獲「最傑出氣候智慧型公用事業獎」及台灣永續能源研究基金會「2024台灣永續行動獎銀級及銅級獎」的肯定，同年7月於美國聖地牙哥榮獲「Special Achievement in GIS Award」，未來也將持續聚焦在漏水率較高的區域，集中施工量能進行改善，將臺北市打造為用水安全、智慧管理的永續城市。

翡翠原水管上線 強化大臺北供水防線

臺北人的日常用水仰賴臺北自來水事業處，每天供應超過200萬公噸的水量，服務約600萬人，主要的水源來自新店溪，但在氣候變遷與極端天氣愈發頻繁的今日，單一水源的風險也逐漸浮現，特別是在颱風或豪雨來襲時，原水濁度往往急遽上升，為淨水處理帶來不小壓力。

為了提升供水彈性與安全，臺北自來水事業處啟動「翡翠原水管工程」，在北勢溪的翡翠水庫下游增設取水口，並新建長達2.8公里的原水輸水隧道，當南勢溪水質不穩時，便能轉用較清澈的北勢溪水源，每日可穩定提供270萬公噸的原水。

在隧道施工過程中，團隊面臨岩層堅硬與斷層地帶帶來的抽坍與湧水等技術挑戰，經過多次的專家研討，透過加大施工機具與預裂孔對策，終於在2024年6月通水，緊接著在3次颱風期間成功提供1,294萬公噸低濁度原水，節省淨水處理成本1,672萬元，這項工程不僅增強了臺北自來水事業處的備援能力，也支援經濟部水利署板新地區供水，有效提升整個大臺北地區的供水韌性，為高濁度原水抗災再添一道堅實防線。

以綠色基盤結合都市新生活

在氣候環境日益劇烈的變遷下，臺北市政府正積極應對城市的熱島效應，加速都市綠化的腳步。到2024年底，已經開闢了1,831公頃的公園綠地，並針對17條道路

進行綠美化工程，不少民眾發現，在通勤路上，出現許多療癒身心的綠化區，這些都是臺北市推動綠化的重要成果，讓街道不再只是灰濛濛，多了許多綠意和生機。

在人行道、公園廣場等公共空間，也悄悄換上了會呼吸的「透水鋪面」藉由雨天吸水、晴天蒸散的特性，提供舒適的行走環境，2024年光是新增的面積就超過3萬5,000平方公尺，全市累計更高達40萬8,079平方公尺。

不只政府努力，臺北的綠化靠大家一起來！「田園城市」的計畫從公部門延伸到民間企業，鼓勵大家善用屋頂、牆面等打造自己的綠色天地。截至2024年，已經創造了約21萬4,634平方公尺的綠化成果。

透過這些實際行動，不僅有效提高了臺北市對氣候變遷的調適能力，也營造出更宜人的城市景觀和健康的生活環境。下次出門時，不妨多留意一下身邊的綠色角落，你會發現，生活在臺北，真的越來越幸福了！

育愛之森溉希望

臨托安心有愛 家長育兒好幫手

許多家長奔走於工作與事業之間，當突發狀況發生卻無法請假時，托育問題讓人倍感頭痛，為了減輕育兒壓力，臺北市積極推動育兒友善園臨托服務，2024年已設立21處據點，幾乎涵蓋全市行政區，讓家長能就近尋求協助，臨托服務不僅提供專業照顧，更安排趣味課程與親子活動，讓孩子快樂學習，有家長分享初次送托的經驗，孩子因語言不通及環境陌生、情緒不穩，托育人員以不同安撫方式建立信任，隨著多次接觸，幼兒逐漸適應環境，從不願分離到能主動與媽媽道別，牽著老師的手快樂進教室探索世界。而2024年首創的「友善育兒事業獎」，更藉由對職場上提供育兒支持的企業給予表揚，以6項育兒指標選拔友善事業單位，打造臺北市成為友善育兒、工作與生活平衡的宜居城市。

為了解決更多0至2歲嬰幼兒家長的托育需求，臺北市首創「十時好神托家園」，提供週一至週五10:30至22:00的創新托育服務，自2024年開始，4名幼兒入托後，家長普遍給予正向回饋，尤其是雙胞胎媽媽更反映，此服務解決了因工作時間較晚找不到合適托育場所的困擾。為了提供更好的托育品質，臺北市政府也提供托育人員的薪資加成補助，聘用夜間保全，並積極運用媒體宣傳以擴大知名度，解決廣大家長的托育困境。

補助升級+園所擴增，有感輕鬆育兒

「孩子的學費實在太貴！」這是許多家長的心聲，如何負擔私立幼兒園的學費，成為眾多家長的難題。

對此，臺北市政府推出一系列的托育補助和優惠政策，來減輕家長們的負擔。從2到4歲幼兒的「寶貝我愛你」方案，最高每學期補助2萬6,000元，到5歲的「助您好孕」就學補助方案，每學期可領2,543元至1萬2,543元不等的補助，真的幫荷包大大加分！

除了補助政策外，臺北市還推出「臺北版準公共幼兒園3.0」，鼓勵優質的私立幼兒園加入準公共行列，並提升教保人員待遇。113學年度共有172所私立幼兒園受益，至114學年度，臺北市政府再調高合作金額至1萬7,660元，讓孩子受教環境更穩定、品質更升級。同時，市府也首創「部分負擔薪資提升與營運補助方案」，從人力、設施到員工福利全方位支援，2024年已補助119所幼兒園，補助金額高達4,600萬元，進一步強化幼兒園整體營運品質。

不僅如此，為了擴大服務量能，臺北市也持續增設幼兒園班級，113學年度新增公立及非營利幼兒園共21班，提供超過500位幼兒就讀機會，尤其設置2歲專班，真正做到貼近市民需求，讓孩子快樂成長、家長安心上班。



永續智慧校園，綠意盎然的學習天地

想像一下，孩子每天上學的地方，不只是教室和黑板，而是一座充滿綠意、智慧又永續的校園！從呵護孩子成長的每一步，到啟發未來想像的每一課，臺北市加速推動校舍改建，結合SDGs的理念，打造新世代綠建築的校園，讓學習空間變得更安全、更環保也更有趣。其中，內湖國小的新孝悌樓就是一個典範，在2024年11月落成啟用，不僅榮獲鑽石級綠建築認證，還設有太陽能板、屋頂建置小田園等，從節能減碳到水資源各方面，已經成為臺北市綠建築校園標竿。

未來，臺北市政府將持續規劃編列經費，預計至2030年每年編列40億元來推動30案的學校改建，每項校舍改建計畫均致力打造黃金級以上的綠建築認證，以孩子學習為中心來設計，努力創造綠意健康的新世代校園。

跨時代科技、智慧、技職教育創新模式

跨時代的教育模式是臺北市教育發展的重點，全國首創成立的臺北市STEAM及新科技發展辦公室於2024年3月18日正式啟動，開啟了一段跨時代的教育旅程，除了安排師生前往國際學校交流，透過實際互動，激發更多創意思維與學習靈感外，在2024年臺北市首度辦理「AI教育節」活動中，學生們也在舞臺上展現自己的學習成果。無論是人工智能的應用還是新科技的實作，都展現出驚人的創造力與解決問題的能力，並透過與高科技企業的合作，理解科技在真實生活中的運用，成為連結世界、啟發學生視野的橋梁。

在專業人才培訓上，2024年6月1日臺北市政府教育局正式成立了「技職教育科」，以「深化生涯探索」、「推動創新協作」、「增進國際視野」、「提升數位素養」為4大政策，同時深化12所技術教學中心開發創新跨域課程，更推出全國首創的「臺北市技術型高中長照人才培育獎助計畫」，並於2024年率先辦理「臺北首都盃國際技能競賽」，看著孩子在課堂上的創新，在國際舞臺上自信發光，對下一代的教育抱持進步希望。

實驗教育，探索教育的新未來

實驗教育打破傳統框架，鼓勵學校設計多樣化課程，讓學生有更多發揮的空間。2024年，臺北市政府將忠義國小轉型為首座公辦蒙特梭利實驗國小，並與萬華幼兒園合作，創建一個從2歲到12歲的蒙特梭利實驗教育基地，從專題報告中就能涵蓋多元豐富的主題，從自然界到各地文化至環境保護，都能提出獨具見解的分享，讓臺北市的教育環境朝向更多元、智慧和永續的未來邁進。

臺北同婚，彩虹閃耀

臺灣作為亞洲首個同婚合法化國家，至2024年已迎來5週年，為紀念這個具有歷史意義的時刻，臺北市政府舉辦「愛情的模樣——同婚五週年紀念市集」，讓平權的光芒與多元的愛在城市每個角落綻放。

現場活動在同志友善歌手接力演出顯得熱鬧非凡，加上彩虹市集的助攻之下，吸引約1,600人次參與。現場還有同志伴侶分享愛的旅程環節，不少民眾聽得熱淚盈眶，深刻體會「愛」超越性別與框架的真諦。其中，Chris與羽伶這兩組同志伴侶分享愛的旅程故事，都是闡述橫跨兩岸的愛情，溫柔而堅定地存在著，儘管面對法規制度上的挑戰，他們以實際行動告訴大家：真正的愛，能夠穿越國界、等待改變，也為跨國同志婚姻的平權之路，注入勇氣與希望。

為了營造多元性別友善的社會環境，臺北市政府將持續推動同志友善政策，透過遊行、論壇、影展、展覽等活動形式，讓彩虹光芒照亮每個人的生活。

另一場文化盛宴「2024 Eid-al-Fitr in Taipei 尋味臺北 齊賀開齋」，2024年4月也在大安森林公園展開！這天，不論是穆斯林的朋友們，還是臺北的在地居民，大家齊聚一堂，共同慶祝開齋節。

為積極推動臺北成為穆斯林友善城市，並打造友善旅遊環境，臺北市政府觀光傳播局舉辦臺北開齋節歡慶活動，當天不僅有精彩舞台表演、穆斯林文化體驗、草地同樂區及逾30家的清真市集，也首次邀請超商於現場設置「FamiMobi智慧零售車」，販售穆斯林友善商品與「馬尚煮」熱食，呈現具異國風情且貼心友善的城市氛圍。

此外，亦攜手臺北市勞動力重建運用處合作策劃「相遇南風 移工多元文化展」，展區內容涵蓋臺北移工學校的語言學習課程、照護技能培訓、文化交流活動等面向。臺北開齋節歡慶活動更首度榮獲2024美國繆思創意獎——文化活動類金獎，展現臺北持續以創新視角推動各式異國文化活動，讓民眾更深入認識並感受臺北為一座共融城市。

愛與支持，安心依靠

即使愛情跨越國界，新住民仍面臨許多挑戰。「離婚後，我會被遣返回越南嗎？」來臺5年的阮小姐因看見臺北市政府為推廣「新住民法律諮詢及生活適應諮詢服務」，與越南在臺YouTuber阮秋姐合作拍攝的宣導影片，從影片中得到家暴求助、監護權、語言隔閡等關鍵問題的答案，讓她鼓起勇氣撥打免費法律專線，為未來尋求更多保障。

另外還有來自越南的阿芳為子女收養問題煩惱，也在臺北市新住民會館找到解答。「我的孩子還能在這裡上學嗎？」，透過志工及駐館人員細心地聆聽及翻譯，並經由臺北市政府民政局協助轉介請教育局協助後，短短1個月孩子終於順利入學，她感動地說：「這裡真的像家一樣！」

新住民會館不只是諮詢站，更是文化交流的新橋梁，藉由與市民互動，讓新住民不再只是被幫助的人，更能成為分享文化、傳遞溫暖的種子。

陪伴從「懂你」開始，語言與關懷的雙重守護

為了促進臺北市的多元文化與包容性，臺北市政府在2024年委託財團法人台灣賽珍珠社會福利基金會，辦理衛生保健服務通譯人力庫，培訓24名外語通譯人員，涵蓋7種語言，並首次納入日語、擴大服務對象，全年在12個行政區共提供了2,455小時通譯服務，服務人次達3萬8,013人，協助新住民獲得更友善、無障礙的溝通支持。

在關注成人通譯服務的同時，也透過親子共學團體課程，協助新住民家庭認識「早期療育」，強調兒童成長與發展的重要性；並結合民政局新住民會館及社會局新住民關懷據點的資源，持續推動新住民健康促進，不僅提供語言協助，也主動關注新住民的心理適應與情緒支持，陪他們一同面對環境轉變與生活挑戰，成為穩定生活的重要助力。

友善毛孩的交通不僅只有捷運的安排，臺北市公共運輸處也配合這次的活動，特別設置「GoGo Bus狗狗巴士 X MODEL T 電動公車」專車體驗活動，開放民眾、毛孩免費搭乘，體驗寵物友善交通。

共襄盛舉的還有臺北市動物保護處，也在熱鬧的信義廣場狗活動區同步舉辦「狗狗fun電趣」闖關活動，規劃「跳跳TEMPO」、「狗狗障礙挑戰」、「腳掌拓印紀念」、「毛孩知多少」等4大關卡，讓

飼主與毛孩在互動中增進感情。現場更邀請林奕華副市長親自擔任關主，出5道與動物教育及飼養知識相關的趣味題目，考驗飼主對毛孩照護的了解，現場氣氛溫馨又充滿歡笑。

為了打造更加友善的寵物出行環境，臺北市公共運輸處已開放19路臺北市狗狗友善公車，於平日及假日提供飼主攜帶狗狗輕鬆前往各地的狗運動公園與狗活動區，也會隨著新設公園同步增設路線，貼心提升遛狗便利性，讓沒有汽機車的飼主也能自在展開城市小旅行。如今，一群毛孩在寵物公園盡情奔跑的溫馨畫面，已融入臺北街頭風景中，為持續推動動物友善城市，臺北市也積極營造多元共融空間，目前全市已有21處狗運動公園及狗活動區，分布於12個行政區，並依功能規劃為「練功型」、「放電型」與「親子同樂型」，讓毛孩與飼主都能找到最適合的放風天地。

長照有愛，我們一起好好到老

臺北市在2022年已正式邁入超高齡社會，長照服務需求與日俱增，過去，家人住院後的照護銜接常讓人感到焦慮不安，為了讓有需要的長者能安心獲得照顧，臺北市政府在2024年新增了124床長照床位，臺北市立聯合醫院也已經累積設置230床，隨著長照床位的逐步充實，許多家庭那份被妥善照顧的安心，成了生活中最溫柔的依靠。

此外，為提升住宿式長照機構涵蓋率，臺北市率先推動全國首例BOO模式，並透過BOT方式促進民間參與，引入更有效率與創意的營運機制。同時，積極於社會住宅基地與都市更新地區，爭取設置長照服務設施，並以補助計畫獎助民間投資，協助申請與籌設，逐步擴大長照資源，讓更多需要的人，在熟悉的臺北市安心好好到老，是臺北市政府努力的方向。

八一原住民族週，文化交織心靈相繫

2024年8月1日適逢原住民族日正名30週年，臺北市政府原民會盛大舉辦「八一原住民族週」，活動橫跨中山站、圓山花博等地，超過5場主題活動與60個市集攤位，集結原住民舞蹈、音樂、服裝走秀及手作體驗，總計超過5,000人參與，成功拉近都市與部落的距離。

「八一原住民族週」活動亮點多，包括：心中山線形公園的潮流族服走秀、市集與音樂表演；臺北市市政大樓1樓中庭舉辦的不插電音樂會與原住民文化特展；凱達格蘭文化館的南島文化特展與成果展，以及花博公園的南島飲食文化交流，結合主廚聯名宴席與文化市集，都讓民眾從歡樂中感受最純粹的文化魅力。

有來自南投的媽媽分享，活動讓她對原住民文化有全面理解，孩子也在互動遊戲中學會了原住民傳統手工藝。這不僅展現臺北市政府推動族群共榮的用心，也深化市民對原住民族文化的認識與尊重。

傳統時尚創新，年輕人更投入

2024年臺北市「八一原住民族週」邁入第2年，主打「SALAMA！都會遊祭」，以結合音樂、時尚、手作與市集，於7月27日起一連舉辦9天。其中，首度將秀場搬至心中山線形公園的原住民服飾走秀，邀請實踐大學服裝設計系學生合作，一共超過20位模特兒身穿融合當代設計風格的傳統原住民服飾走秀，最為驚艷！

除了精彩走秀，現場還有原住民歌手與團體熱力演出，以及60攤來自全臺各地的原住民市集，從經典竹筒飯、馬告檸檬茶、到小米醃肉與融合傳統手法的手工飾品，都讓民眾感受最道地的部落風。

為吸引更多人加入，活動也透過社群媒體和KOL^{*}推廣，並設計互動遊戲，吸引各年齡層參與。原住民朋友感慨指出：「以前擔心文化會流失，現在看到這麼多孩子來學，心裡真是踏實，文化一定會代代相傳！」

客家文化，永續共榮新篇章

多元族群融合的臺北市擁有一座臺北市客家文化主題公園，以「客家文化、永續生活、友善農業、綠色餐飲」主軸，結合文化與環保概念，也是實踐食農教育的示範園區！在財團法人台北市客家文化基金會主導下，客家公園善用開放空間，2024年6月推出一系列野菜課程、9月「永續推廣站」講座，都讓民眾深刻了解客家文化面對氣候變遷的重要資源，並有近3萬人次參與。

同時為響應地球日「Planet vs. Plastics | 地球與塑膠」主題，臺北市政府於2024年4月透過跨局處合作，集結客委會、環保局、民間社團、新創企業等舉辦「永續城市·不塑之客」園遊會，齊聚140個永續市集攤位，讓大小朋友透過親子闖關、手作體驗等趣味活動學習環保知識，鼓勵市民減塑愛地球，讓永續生活從日常做起。

建立客家語言友善環境，體驗客語文化溫度

客語學習可以很生活化、活潑化、年輕化！臺北客家書院以推廣客家語言文化為核心，透過5大主軸課程多元規劃，從語言、技藝到表演藝術，吸引各年齡層、不同族群參與。像是結合永續觀念的藍染課，將自然植物印染轉化文創設計，反映都會客家的新樣貌，還受邀遠赴澳洲展出，讓世界看見臺北的文化力量。

客語文化的推廣也向下扎根走進幼兒園，除了針對2至6歲幼兒，補助開設客語課程，並設立示範幼兒園如樟新、思高幼兒園，臺北市政府也出版《小花》等客語繪本並改編為動畫，獲得多項國際影展大獎，成功讓客語故事走向世界。而每年全臺最大客家慶典「臺北客家義民嘉年華」，活動以全客語進行儀式與表演，結合市集與親子活動，3天吸引超過12.5萬人參與。透過這些多元又貼近生活的方式，使客語更成為「日常的語言」，讓文化傳承有感又有趣。

青年活躍臺北式

青年翻轉臺北，你的城市夥伴來了！

臺北市青年有福了！蔣萬安市長兌現承諾，2024年成立的青年局，就像專屬青年的智慧型手機——內建國際實習、藝術交流、職涯充電等多元APP，開張首月就迎來哈佛實習生，還把天母棒球場變成教室，帶著5,000多名青年玩出跨領域學習新高度。

2024年6月1日，臺北市政府青年局正式誕生，成為臺北市第一個「以青年為核心」的官方推手。首創六都青年事務相關單位中唯一的「國際發展科」，成立1個月內便推動「國際學生實習計畫」、啟動「國際青年藝術家交流計畫」，積極為青年打開國際新視野。

除了國際發展，青年局也關注職涯、心理與居住等問題，設立「職涯支援科」並推動「青年斜槓商店實驗計畫」，首創計畫更推出「青年學堂」全新品牌，鼓勵青年跳出原本專業框架、跨領域學習，發掘第二專長。「青年學堂Youth+」系列課程首堂與職棒球團味全龍合作，分別邀請教練、球員、啦啦隊到球團，分享賽事調度、職涯訓練與球團經營心法。自此，系列課程便開始

在天母棒球場、大巨蛋、松菸，甚至電影院開課，總計超過40場課程，活動資訊吸引近5萬人瀏覽，近2,700人成功報名參加，熱烈程度讓不少人敲碗加開名額！

青年公民力，讓改變從參與開始！

想讓城市更好，當然少不了青年的聲音！臺北市政府青年局自2024年6月成立以來，積極推動青年公共參與，9月公開招募「青年事務諮詢委員會」青年委員，吸引來自不同背景的年輕人報名參與，開啟青年走入政策、參與市政的第一步。委員會下設6大工作小組，涵蓋AI科技、永續發展、社會平權等重要議題，讓青年針對關心的議題，親自參與討論與提案。

除了制度設計，青年局也舉辦政策辯論賽、公共事務營隊、議題沙龍等多元活動，鼓勵青年發聲、練習表達與參與公共事務，讓公共參與變得親民、好玩又有成就感。

推動國際學生實習計畫：哈佛學生走進臺北

臺北市政府青年局啟動「國際學生實習計畫」，首梯迎來哈佛大學的Janet與



Isabelle兩位實習生，帶著電腦科學、統計與經濟等專業背景，加入青年局實習，參與青年政策規劃，並針對AI心理健康、理財素養等議題進行研究，提出青年觀點。

Janet與Isabelle也走訪臺北捷運、大數據中心、拜會馬來西亞駐臺代表，深入了解城市治理與國際合作，並到東吳大學與國際志工社的同學們進行深度交流，分享彼此在海外服務與學習的經驗，激盪許多感動與共鳴。

街頭藝術變身社區寶藏

國際交流的火花不只在校園內燃燒，也慢慢走入街頭。百年老街上，國際的塗鴉大師教年長阿公阿嬤如何使用噴漆，隨著顏料噴濺，斑駁牆面綻放出跨世代對話。

這精采的世代交流，是臺北市政府青年局推動的「國際青年藝術家交流計畫」。2024年，青年局邀請來自荷蘭的FLEKS、比利時的ENOFone，及西班牙的ORBITA等3位國際塗鴉藝術家來臺駐村創作3個月，攜手市民於萬華頂磚里、天母棒球場及臺北市立動物園展開塗鴉創作，透

過創意為臺北市地景注入全新活力與文化內涵，讓城市街角成為文化對話的舞臺。

實習津貼助攻，探索職海勇敢追夢！

為了鼓勵青年提早認識職場，減少學用落差，臺北市政府青年局推出全國首創的「青年實習津貼計畫」，只要設籍在臺北市且參與實習的在學青年，每月可領取5,000元津貼，最多領取3個月，低收或中低收入戶者更可領到每月1萬元。參與這項計畫的同學們分享，實習不僅能了解產業運作，也能提早探索自己是否適合，逐步確立未來方向。計畫短短3個月就有超過1,100名的青年申請。

同時，青年局也推動「青年社會創新培育計畫」，協助有志從事社會創新的青年在臺北市實踐夢想，青年局於2024年辦理企業媒合會，邀請知名企業以及社會創新組織進行媒合交流，其中組織提出不乏像是環保毛線包、早療公益等多項創意提案，透過媒合會成功串連企業資源，也陪伴更多臺北青年勇敢投入社會創新志業。

春甦繁華好熱絡

翻轉老街，萬華廊帶新氣象

是不是發現臺北經典的老街區和過去不一樣了呢？從人行道不再被機車占據開始，行人環境被改造得越來越友善了！這些轉變，是臺北市政府推動「萬華商圈廊帶」計畫的成果，整合了超過20個局處力量，匯集專家及在地意見，進而為這個充滿歷史底蘊的區域注入新活力。

漫步在萬華的街頭，你會發現嶄新的觀光地圖牌座提供了便捷的數位查詢服務，過去雜亂的廢棄招牌已不復見，取而代之的是行人安全設施的整體優化。剝皮寮前方廣州街路段（康定路至昆明街）將進行鋪面更新，遊客可以悠閒漫步，感受老城魅力。這些也都是臺北市政府以「多

元特性展現、減法美學及安全人本環境」3大策略為基礎，努力改造的結果。

除了硬體環境升級，臺北市也傾聽在地的聲音。透過每月舉辦的「萬華小聚」，與在地商圈組織、自治會凝聚共識，確立了「美食為主、文化為輔」的主題，規劃出萬華地區遊程、推薦特色店家及製作多國語言的文宣。同時，也針對在地店家提供客製化的輔導方案，協助他們在各方面提升經營能力。2024年，透過「台北造起來」及「數位轉型」等計畫，臺北市已經輔導10家廊帶範圍的店家轉型升級，並持續與地方攜手擘劃商圈的未來發展，讓更多人看見萬華不只是老街區，更是文化與商業的新亮點。

老街區逛完，來感受一下位於時尚鬧區的綠廊帶空間吧！為了讓東區商圈找回昔日榮景，臺北市啟動「忠孝東區振興計畫」，從人行空間優化、主題活動行銷到地下街活化三管齊下。2024年成果豐碩，不僅將SOGO後方停車場改造成綠意盎然的開放空間、串連人行步道，提供逛街民眾舒適又友善的休憩環境，也持續舉辦超人氣活動，提振商圈商機。

像是「2024混東區潮FUN夏日趴」集結百家店家祭出優惠，吸引上萬人線上參與；年底再推「2024東區週年慶 東區Here We Go（購）！」送出超過百萬好禮，抽獎人次破5萬。耶誕、元宵節還特別妝點瑠公綠廊與龍門廣場等地燈飾，增添節慶氛圍，帶動人潮遊逛。

大巨蛋逆襲 東區錢潮熱

你是不是也發現，自從臺北大巨蛋啟用後，東區變得更加熱鬧了呢？光是2024年，大巨蛋舉辦了多場棒球賽事及超人氣的演唱會，就吸引眾多球迷及歌迷前來，也為周邊的東區商圈帶來了前所未有的經濟效益。

看中大巨蛋帶來的人潮與商機，臺北市政府在多場棒球賽事及國慶晚會舉辦期間，趁勢推出「大巨蛋Home Run遊東

區」的活動，超過百家特約店家提供優惠，並推出「100元遊東區折抵券」給民眾消費抵用，吸引大量人潮前往消費，配合世界12強棒球錦標賽比賽期間，帶動商圈買氣飆升！

2024年底，臺北市政府首度結合市府跨年活動與張惠妹大巨蛋演唱會，推出「大巨蛋歡慶聖誕跨年YA」活動，成功炒熱年末氣氛！不僅阿妹5場演唱會吸引近20萬人朝聖，更帶動全市超過22億元的消費，其中東區商圈就貢獻了約1.7億元，成為展演經濟的亮眼代表。更重要的是，它點燃了城市活力，東區的魅力，正隨著一波波精彩的活動持續綻放光彩。

創意盛典歡樂城

新年好運從賞燈開始

「2024台北燈節」展期長達31天，創歷年之最，並首創分兩階段展出，從過年前就開始點燈，讓民眾提前感受年味。主燈「城現光龍」以金屬打造、搭配聲光秀，氣勢磅礴；還首創巡遊燈組「九小龍」化身活潑小龍穿梭燈區，讓小朋友超開心；互動式光雕「北門映像」，讓民眾掃QR Code就能把心願投影上北門；「紅樓紀事」燈組更勇奪義大利設計大獎「A' Design Award」，讓臺北登上國際舞台。

本屆燈節串連北門、西門、中華路3大展區，邀集日本藝術家及在地創作者，共展出逾120件創意燈組，還有50場以上舞台表演及40組街頭藝人演出，整體吸引超過574萬人次到場參與，民眾滿意度高達92.7%。活動也與商圈、宮廟合力規劃燈海隧道、燈謎擂台、攝影比賽及燈飾串聯等，讓整個西區亮起來。

花 IN 台北，繽紛賞花全年不停歇

2024年「花IN台北」規劃了8場花展活動，首場「臺北茶花展」運用創新催花技術，讓60種、115盆茶花同步綻放，創下歷年之最，吸引逾2萬人參觀。夢幻的茶花隧道與1萬2,000株鬱金香、6,000株風信子營造出歐風園藝氛圍，成為熱門拍照打卡點；「樂活夜櫻季」則以浪漫夜櫻結合電音派對，打造最潮春季賞花派對。

春天還有3大花展，包括2024年「北投三層崎花海」，以浪漫紫海再度吸引萬千目光！臺北市政府運用GPS定位放樣技術，打造出大冠鷲地景圖騰，展期更搭配商圈推出賞花優惠；「士林官邸鬱金香

展」則首次結合元宵賞燈，創造了全新的民眾參與模式，從傳統的靜態賞花轉變為動靜結合的互動式體驗；著名的「陽明山花季」，除了賞花，還有熱情的街舞比賽和充滿歷史感的館舍串聯活動。

此外，還有「2024臺北玫瑰展」展出超過800個品種、5,000株以上玫瑰花，這也是全臺最大的玫瑰花展；另外，「2024台北杜鵑花季」共舉辦31日，超過21萬株的杜鵑及醉蝶花、瑪格莉特等季節花卉，吸引超過66萬人次參與；年末重頭戲，「士林官邸菊展」以「菊伴動物派對」為主題，將菊花打造成可愛的動物造型，並首次開放菊花溫室和夜間觀展，吸引超過59萬人次參與。

除了賞花，還可以來場花伴野餐！「2024台北花伴野餐」首度在大安森林公園登場，吸引超過2萬5,000人次共襄盛舉！活動設有5大主題野餐區，從親子、寵物到樂活族群都能找到專屬空間，還有文青市集、趣味體驗活動，整天熱鬧又有趣。

愈夜愈美的「2024大稻埕夏日節」，為慶祝臺北建城140週年，打造超過500公尺水岸光廊，光廊起點以「TAIPEI 140」字樣結合大型燈飾裝置，成為打卡熱點。每場煙火施放日還邀請樂團或知名藝人演出，讓民眾一邊賞煙火、一邊聽音樂、逛市集，嗨到不想走！

活動也串聯藍色水路業者，推出遊船體驗優惠券，並與大稻埕商圈超過80家在地店家合作，推出消費滿額禮活動。除了吸引近25萬人次參加夏日節，也成功帶動商圈生意成長。

運動跨年超吸睛！臺北 HIGH 翻迎新年

「臺北最HIGH新年城-2025跨年晚會」呼應2025雙北世界壯年運動會，特別

以「運動」為主題，於市府周邊布置「跑動」、「跳動」等運動風燈飾，傳達了臺北城市「動」的精神。

這場盛會吸引了超過22萬人參與，臺北市政府更貼心規劃公益專區，讓行動不便者也能在現場觀賞跨年晚會，活動結束後也安排復康巴士，溫馨接送身心障礙者及陪伴者回家。

臺北市政府將持續打造「臺北最HIGH新年城」成為「一生必去，亞洲必遊」的跨年品牌，吸引更多國內外旅客，一起感受臺北的熱情與活力。

眾所矚目的「跨界時尚大秀」，在時尚一級戰區——信義區舉辦，近百套時裝作品令人驚豔，更跨界邀請流行音樂藝人及奧運選手們力挺。除了精彩大秀，也舉辦了「一夜臺北 百人走秀」活動，讓民眾從後臺裝扮到上臺展演，親身體驗模特兒日常。

時裝週成功吸引近7萬人參與，並串聯大稻埕、東區、信義區等商圈風格店家，讓時尚不僅在伸展臺上閃耀，更融入市民的日常生活。

用音樂和創新點燃城市熱情

你能想像短短7天內，臺北就舉辦超過280場的音樂表演與論壇嗎？2024年9月，臺北市政府透過跨局處合作，並整合公私部門資源，首次舉辦「潮臺北 TRENDY TAIPEI-Music X Innovation」，集結流行音樂、數位科技、影視娛樂和藝術展演，邀請來自40多個國家的表演團隊與產業專家同台交流，吸引10萬人次參與，成功地將臺北推上國際舞臺。

漫遊白晝之夜，夜行動物派對登場！



首演就選在臺北！現場匯聚61組國內外藝術家，帶來超過百場的展演活動與視覺藝術，吸引超過45萬人次參與。

臺北白晝之夜每年皆選在不同區域跨夜舉行，而2024年規劃在大安森林公園舉辦，臺北市政府考量到活動地點鄰近住宅環境和多元生態特色，為了減少演出音量對附近住戶的影響，也儘量不打擾公園裡的生態，因此活動時間特別調整為當天下午2點至凌晨2點。這場免費、跨夜、全民參與的藝術祭，讓大人、小孩都能在熟悉的城市空間中，輕鬆親近藝術，更展現臺北作為國際文化都市的創意與溫度。

◆土地面積與氣候

1967年7月臺北市改制為院轄市，後經多次界線調整，截至2024年底臺北市土地面積為271.7997平方公里，人口密度為每平方公里9,164人，居臺灣地區之首，遠超過其他縣市，若與其他亞洲城市相較，則高於香港、福岡、伊斯坦堡等城市。

臺北市位於亞熱帶地區，終年有雨，無明顯乾季，冬天受東北季風影響，較為濕冷，夏季因屬盆地地形，散熱不易，溫度較高；2024年臺北市平均溫度為攝氏24.0度，月平均溫度以7月30.1度最高，而1月16.9度最低，兩者相差13.2度；全年降水日數151日，降水量2,393.0毫米，較2023年降水量增加33.87%。

◆人口概況

1968年臺北市改制之初，戶籍登記人口共160萬人，至2024年底已增為249萬人，增加約56%。人口性比例大致逐年下降，2024年底每百位女性相對的男性人數不及90人，為國內各縣市中最低，與東京、香港等城市同為女性多於男性。就年齡結構而言，老年人口比率逐年上升，幼年人口比率逐年下降，2024年底扶養比為54.39，高於首爾、新加坡等城市，人口老化指數則增加為189.57。

影響總人口增減的因素可分為自然增加（出生、死亡）及社會增加（遷入、遷出）兩方面，2024年臺北市自然增加率為-1.04‰，社會增加率為-7.36‰，致2024年底總人口較2023年底減少2萬1,017人，人口增加率為-8.37‰。

◆教育文化

113學年度臺北市各級公私立學校共303所，學生數近年來呈逐年遞減趨勢，至113學年度學生為50萬3,833人，較112學年度減少1.11%。另就國中、小學分析，113學年度平均每位教師教導學生數為11.54人，平均每班學生數27.12人，分別較112學年度減少0.06人、增加0.03人。

113學年度臺北市國小教育粗在學率為88.62%，15歲以上人口受大專以上教育比率逐年上升，2024年底為65.72%，較2023年底增加0.60個百分點，15歲以上人口識字率則為99.73%。

臺北市政府文化局所屬機關近年來辦理藝文展演活動場次與出席人次逐年增加，2024年辦理藝文展演活動計1萬4,805場次，較2023年增加2,609場次；出席人次為1,276.1萬人次，較2023年增加201.9萬人次。

◆公共安全

在交通安全部分，2024年臺北市發生造成人員受傷或30日內死亡之道路交通事故計2萬1,876件，平均每萬機動車輛發生123.69件，造成每萬人有0.48人死亡，較2023年每萬人增加0.04人。

在消防安全部分，2024年底臺北市計有消防人員（含義消）3,869人，各型消防車輛717輛，平均每萬人消防人員數（含義消）、消防車輛數分別為15.53人、2.88輛。2024年臺北市發生火災計1,137次，每千戶發生火災1.06次，造成6人死亡、60人受傷，251戶房屋損毀，財物損失約新臺幣1,168萬元；與2023年相較，火災發生次數、損毀房屋數及財物損失均減少。

◆交通運輸

2024年底臺北市汽車登記數為84萬17輛，平均每千人擁有汽車337輛；機車92萬8,634輛，平均每千人擁有機車373輛。公私有汽車停車位計有81萬8,928格位、機車88萬5,547格位，均較2023年底增加。

臺北市政府致力發展公共運輸、完善交通路網，截至2024年底，捷運平均每日載客202.7萬人次，較2023年增加8.1萬人次；公車每日載客則有109.0萬人次，較2023年增加2.0萬人次。另臺北市透過YouBike微笑單車的租借服務打造「單車城市」的環保綠都，截至2024年底租借站及自行車輛數分別為1,505站、2萬2,265輛，平均每日公共自行車租借次數達17萬8,727車次，較2023年增加5萬2,357車次。

◆環境保護

臺北市自2000年7月實施垃圾費隨袋徵收政策起，一般廢棄物產生量大致呈減少之勢，資源回收量則呈增加之勢；2024年臺北市平均每人一般廢棄物產生量為431.79公斤，較垃圾費隨袋徵收實施前之1999年減少109.64公斤（-20.25%），平均每人資源回收量為286.10公斤，則較1999年增加277.41公斤（31.9倍）。

在空氣品質方面，2024年臺北市每平方公里空氣落塵量之月平均值為2.68公噸，較2023年增加0.32公噸；每立方公尺懸浮微粒為29.75微克，較2023年減少1.57微克。在事業廢水檢驗方面，2024年臺北市事業廢水水樣檢驗合格率96.20%。在污水處理方面，2024年底臺北市污水處理率為89.17%，較2023年底增加0.69個百分點。

◆公共建設

臺北市近年來道路、綠資源與自來水等公共建設，多呈穩定小幅成長，2024年底臺北市道路面積為2,238.20萬平方公尺，較2023年底2,238.03萬平方公尺增加0.17萬平方公尺；綠資源面積1億3,911萬平方公尺則較2023年底增加84萬平方公尺；另每人每月自來水配水量為2.01萬公升。

臺北市為維持道路品質及用路安全，持續辦理道路路面及人行道更新工程，2024年一般道路路面更新75.85萬平方公尺，人行道更新5.59萬平方公尺。另截至2024年底臺北市污水下水道門牌戶數接管普及率為82.80%，較2023年底增加0.79個百分點。

◆家庭生活

依最新臺北市家庭收支訪問調查結果2023年臺北市平均每戶可支配所得為新臺幣144萬8,219元；依可支配所得高低將家庭戶數分為5組，最高與最低所得組所得差距倍數為4.70倍，每人可支配所得則為新臺幣54萬380元。在家庭消費結構方面，以飲食費（含家外食物）占28.53%最高，住宅服務、水電瓦斯及其他燃料占28.38%為次之。另平均每人居住面積為10.58坪，市民住宅自有率則為84.17%。

2024年臺北市每人每日生活用水量為331公升，每人每月用電量為255.40度，分別較2023年增加1公升及5.10度。消費者物價總指數為108.73（基期2021年=100），較2023年增加1.80%。

◆數位城市

臺北市為擴大便民服務，在智慧城市基礎建設上，致力推動行動市政、行動交通、行動學習、行動導覽、行動休閒等應用服務，讓民眾即時享受無所不在之市政服務，至2024年底臺北市政府行動應用服務App累計下載人次為1,493.65萬人次；另Taipei Free有2億3,861.89萬使用人次。

另在臺北市政府網站服務方面，2024年臺北市政府網站平均每日造訪人次為2萬5,777人次，較2023年增加6,823人次。基於資訊公開共享之理念，臺北市進行資訊整合，建立公開資料（Open Data）平臺，鼓勵民眾利用政府開放資料加值應用，至2024年底計有2,857項介接服務，累計42.31億使用次數。臺北市政府智慧支付平臺「pay.taipei」提供Web、App及臨櫃繳費方式，2024年收繳單數及金額分別為2,286萬張、47億8,262萬元。

Preface by the Mayor

Taipei Yearbook 2024 faithfully documents the dedicated and diligent efforts and achievements of Team Taipei under the policy vision of “Sustainability and Inclusion: Capital of Hope.” We are grateful for the trust and companionship of our citizens, which has enabled each step taken by Taipei City to be steady and resolute, continuously advancing toward the vision of a city of safety, sports, and the future, and moving toward a better Taipei!

Safety is the cornerstone of a city’s stable development. In 2024, Taipei City set “The Year of Traffic Safety” as its core, addressing five major aspects of people-centric transportation: smooth pedestrian environments, pedestrian safety at intersections, traffic safety education, strengthened law enforcement, and promotion of traffic-friendly zones. Proactive measures were implemented, such as the advancement of Removal of Scooters from Arcades and Sidewalks 2.0, the setback of pedestrian crossings, and the installation of pedestrian refuge islands. As a result, the number of traffic accidents considerably declined, allowing citizens to experience a safe and friendly traffic environment.

In the face of the challenges posed by climate change, Team Taipei has upheld the attitude of “anticipate the worst, respond with rigor,” launching the “City Cooling Plan.” From reducing perceived temperature and improving building energy efficiency to increasing green coverage, the initiative comprehensively promotes urban cooling and environmental transformation, with the goal of creating a low-carbon, livable homeland. At the same time, to address safety concerns surrounding aging buildings, the city has officially entered the “Era of Grand Urban Renewal,” promoting the reconstruction of old school buildings, subsidies for elevator installation, disaster prevention urban renewal, and the renovation of concrete buildings with high levels of chloride ions. Tangible actions are taken to strengthen urban resilience and build a safe, livable, and sustainable city of the future.





Sports are not only the foundation of a healthy lifestyle, but also a manifestation of a city's vitality. In 2024, Taipei continued to pursue the goal of promoting sports for all by launching an upgraded version of U-Sport and initiating the Taipei Specialty Sports Venue Project, making exercise a part of citizens' daily lives. At the same time, our home stadium—the Taipei Dome—welcomed the exciting opening of the WBSC Premier12 baseball tournament and a series of popular concerts. These events not only ignited the city's energy but also boosted the tourism economy, showcasing Taipei's vibrant, dynamic, and diverse appeal.

The future is a key indicator of a city's competitiveness and sustainable development. In 2024, Taipei began implementing the policy of free YouBike rides for the first 30 minutes, connecting the last mile of green commuting and contributing to carbon reduction and sustainability efforts. At the same time, Taipei issued the nation's first-ever Sustainable Bonds to raise resources for major infrastructure projects and alleviate the long-term financial burden on citizens. The 1999 Taipei Citizen Hotline also embraced AI technology, effectively enhancing response efficiency and service quality, and continuously advancing the creation of a real-time and caring smart city.

Taipei has also actively stepped onto the international stage by participating in the SusHi Tech Tokyo 2024 City Leaders Program, sharing with the world its practical achievements in the field of smart disaster prevention. At the same time, Taipei visited cities such as New York and Boston in the United States to exchange insights and learn from advanced practices in transportation planning, industrial development, and AI applications, thereby strengthening its urban governance capacity and fostering greater connectivity and dialogue with the world.

In response to the needs of different groups and age brackets, Taipei has introduced more policies closely aligned with daily life. Examples of such policies include the expanded use of the Senior Citizen Card, encouraging older adults to step out of their homes and embrace active aging; the establishment of the Department for Youth, which assists young people in exploring career paths, participating in public affairs, and broadening their international horizons; and the expansion of temporary childcare service locations to 21 sites, reducing the burden of parenting and providing stronger support for childcare.

Taipei is a city that continues to evolve. We are home to a diverse culture, a variety of communities, and shared dreams. Safety is the foundation, sports are the vitality, and the future is the driving force—while citizens remain the lead characters of this city.

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
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

Taipei Traffic: Moving Together with Love

Transportation reflects the rhythm of a city's daily life, serving as a crucial link connecting people and places. The Taipei City Government designated 2024 as the "Year of Traffic Safety." Accordingly, the government has begun improving the quality of pedestrian spaces, comprehensively reviewing and optimizing the walking environment, and actively addressing various safety concerns arising from spaces shared between pedestrians and vehicles. Through diverse strategies, every effort is being made to improve protection for pedestrians.

In addition to physical infrastructure, the Taipei City Government also focuses on education and advocacy to foster traffic safety awareness among residents and encourage behaviors that make walking on roads safer and more orderly. These efforts are paired with more rigorous enforcement mechanisms to maintain fairness and safety on roads. The upgrades to traffic governance represent the Taipei City Government's sincere commitment to residents' quality of life.

Walking in Taipei is Now Safer!

When pushing a stroller, walking your dog, or simply taking a stroll through the city, do you feel that you no longer need to compete with motorcycles for sidewalk space? Walking has become more relaxed thanks to the Taipei City Government's active promotion of the "Removal of Scooters from Arcades and Sidewalks 2.0" (abbreviated as "Removal of Scooters 2.0") and pedestrian space improvement plans in 2024, making walking a safe and comfortable activity!

The "Removal of Scooters 2.0" plan was first implemented in 2023 to reorganize busy road sections where parking areas were previously marked on sidewalks. In 2024, efforts were focused on 11 major roads, such as Chengde Road, Zhongzheng Road, Nanjing East-West Road, and Zhongxiao East Road. A total of 401 motorcycle parking bays and 19 surface parking lots were added to give motorcycles places to park while providing dedicated pedestrian spaces. Nearly 90% of survey respondents expressed strong support for this

measure. Residents also provided positive feedback: "Motorcycles often used to block entire sidewalks; now it's much easier to walk!" "Finally, I don't have to weave around anymore; it's really much more convenient!" A motorcycle-riding father also said, "Pedestrian safety is most important. The 'Removal of Scooters 2.0' plan makes the rules clearer, which is really good. I'm also very willing to actively yield to pedestrians when riding my motorcycle. This policy is really great! And now more parking spaces have been added, making parking more convenient!" In areas with complex underground utilities, innovative approaches have been adopted, such as using gentle slopes to reduce road excavation and installing guidance facilities to prevent motorcycles from parking incorrectly. These efforts make walking easier for pedestrians and parking easier for motorcycles—a win-win situation.

As part of pedestrian space improvements in 2024, nearly 56,000 m² of sidewalk were renewed, 10 road obstacles were removed, 20 physically separated sidewalks were added, and 18 road sections were widened, gradually returning space that belongs to pedestrians. In areas shared between pedestrians and cyclists, such as City Hall Road and Zhongcheng Road Section 2, pedestrian–vehicle separation markings were painted in the form of white dashed lines and pictograms to remind commuters to stay in their designated spaces. Statistics have revealed cyclist and pedestrian compliance rates reaching 91% and 75%, respectively. Orderly walking and cycling can considerably reduce chaos and accidents. According to numerous residents, "Walking on City Hall Road feels much safer now, with far fewer hazards." Another remarked, "Zhongcheng Road Section 2 used to be dangerous when people and vehicles were mixed together; now it's much clearer, and even children can walk more safely." Some citizens have also suggested future improvements, including clearer markings or warnings at corners to provide better directions for both pedestrians and cyclists.

The dual-track "Removal of Scooters 2.0" plan and pedestrian space improvements consider everything from traffic design to user experience to make every step taken in Taipei safer and more comfortable. In the future, the Taipei City Government will prioritize areas around schools, hospitals, and similar locations, expanding its efforts to build a friendly and people-centered city!

Intersection Transformation: Roads Are No Longer Like a Tiger's Mouth


Do you remember how nerve-wracking it used to be to cross roads? Intersections were often dimly lit, or bushes would block drivers' lines of sight, and just one misstep could lead to collisions before anyone had time to react. Thankfully, Taipei City is gradually improving these conditions!

The major traffic transformation currently underway began with the zebra crossings under our feet. Bright line markings for pedestrian crossing areas make pedestrians more conspicuous for drivers to notice. According to city residents, "The new zebra crossings are very obvious, making me feel drivers are more likely to yield to pedestrians." "Especially at nighttime or on rainy days, clear markings like these really make a difference!" In 2024, markings were added to 290 intersections around schools and 33 intersections near parks. Additionally, to create clearer sight lines and safer walking spaces, the Taipei City Government set back pedestrian crossing lines and installed refuge islands at 44 intersections, making road crossing safer.



Lighting around the Postal Hospital was previously dim, making pedestrians feel unsafe walking at night. Since the lighting was upgraded, the roads are brighter, and walking is safer!

Improvements in pedestrian safety at intersections:



To improve pedestrian signals, under the "Taipei Pedestrian Safety Plan" policy, traffic signals now include leading pedestrian interval, early pedestrian phase termination, and pedestrian scramble. Between 05:00 and 07:00 in the morning, many residents over 65 years old go outside to exercise, but the dim lighting during these early hours increases their risk of traffic accidents. To make walking safer for everyone, the Taipei City Government has comprehensively reviewed pedestrian crossings surrounding major parks and made these crossings brighter by strengthening existing lighting, adding street lights, or adjusting lighting angles. These efforts are aimed at ensuring that anyone who goes out to exercise in the early morning can see clearly and feel at ease while walking!

By the end of 2024, the Taipei City Government completed a series of lighting and landscaping improvement projects at schools, hospitals, parks, and

accident-prone intersections, among other locations, to make the city safer and more comfortable. These achievements demonstrate the capability and efficiency of the Taipei City Government, which hopes all residents can experience living in an increasingly thoughtful city, whether they are going to school, seeking medical care, exercising, or just enjoying a walk.

As the light of the city falls on street corners in the morning, the pedestrian and traffic flow weaves into a daily rhythm. Every change made to the streetscape promotes light and comfortable movement. After the overpass at the Heping-Xinsheng intersection was removed, Driver Hwang from Capital Bus Route 284 stated, "Originally buses on this route had some blind spots, but now that the overpass has been removed, the view is more open. We can see the condition of crossing lines at each intersection from far away, which also makes turns safer." In addition to overpass removal, the

Taipei City Government has reduced visual obstructions for pedestrians and vehicles by trimming plants and trees, improving mutual visibility between people and cars to create a safer transportation environment.

To better protect every pedestrian's safety in alignment with the "Taipei Traffic: Moving Together with Love" initiative, the Taipei City Government led the nation in launching the first *Taipei City Road Design Manual*. This manual establishes reasonable road design standards and helps residents better understand the care and considerations behind road design to increase mutual communication and consensus, taking Taipei City's road safety to the next level.

Improving Traffic through Thoughtful Policy Promotion

The planning and construction of facilities is the first step to improving traffic, but to truly integrate these changes into everyone's lives, careful explanation and promotion are necessary to help residents understand and adapt to the changes, enabling them to feel the convenience and reassurance these adjustments bring. Only through efforts to make policy reach the public's hearts can trust be built, allowing the new measures to achieve maximum effect.

Subsidizing Senior Driving Training to Protect Older Adults

As Taiwan's population ages, traffic safety education for older adults is increasingly crucial. The Taipei City Government has cooperated with the Taipei City Motor Vehicles Office to hold many face-to-face activities promoting traffic safety through the Ministry of Transportation's Road Teacher Program, ensuring older adults clearly understand the latest traffic rules and how to protect themselves when going out.

The Taipei City Government also understands that to promote traffic safety among older adults, apart from enthusiastic assistance from neighborhood leaders and

village chiefs, intergenerational colearning can produce better effects. Accordingly, a series of intergenerational activities to promote traffic safety education were developed, such as the "Traffic Safety Story Theater," "Young and Old Colearning Theme Book Exhibition," and "Intergenerational Lectures on Traffic Knowledge," allowing children and grandparents to enjoy themselves while developing traffic safety knowledge.

In addition to improving promotion, the Taipei City Government has pioneered driving training subsidies for older adults. Through specialized classes, older adults can once again understand traffic rules and safe driving and riding techniques. These classes allow residents to easily and confidently get on the road even as they age, becoming "ageless riders!" In addition to caring for older adults, the Taipei City Government Department of Transportation has cooperated with the Ministry of Transportation to upgrade subsidy programs for motorcycle riding training, making citizens more comfortable on the roads. Eligible applicants in motorcycle riding or road safety training programs have the opportunity to apply for subsidies to reduce the learning burden. Subsidies are targeted at different groups, from younger to older adults, allowing residents to feel the Taipei City Government's full care and effort in improving road safety!

Road Teacher Program



"Road Teachers," referred to in full as "teachers who provide lectures on road traffic safety to senior citizens," are part of the "Senior Citizen Traffic Safety Education: Road Teacher Training and Lecture Program" established by the Ministry of Transportation to improve traffic safety for older adults. Through the recruitment and training of qualified "Road Teachers," the program helps older adult citizens learn how to identify traffic accident risks and learn correct road usage behaviors, thereby improving traffic safety for older adults going out.



Traffic Safety Starts from Childhood: Easy Learning for All Ages

Traffic safety does not just include rules on the road—it relates to everyone's life and safety. Through educational activities designed for different age groups, Taipei City integrates traffic safety into daily life, allowing everyone to learn easily and become guardians of traffic safety.

In 2024, the Taipei City Government affirmed its commitment to yielding culture and human-centered traffic in school areas, actively holding traffic safety lectures in schools of all levels. Key lecture topics included the five major principles and five major exercises of traffic safety education, child safety when crossing intersections, and motorcycle safety and defensive driving. Through practical experience-sharing and hands-on activities, we hope teachers and students can return home happily and safely.

The Taipei City Government also promotes all-ages traffic safety education tailored to different school levels. For young children, the content focuses on the development of correct road-crossing habits, beginning with the simple four-word reminder "stop, look, listen, think." This phrase teaches children to first stop before crossing roads, clearly look left and right to evaluate traffic conditions, listen for car sounds, and finally judge whether they can cross safely. A child who participated in these lessons said, "Now I know to first stop and look when crossing roads and not run around wildly like before." As children grow older and learn to ride bicycles and motorcycles, the traffic safety education provided emphasizes safe riding habits and the need to obey traffic rules. Schools also invite traffic police to promote safety education on campus. Officers use real cases to remind students of the consequences a

small oversight might bring, further improving safety awareness to make every outing more reassuring.

A series of educational and entertaining activities have also been planned for students of different grades. For example, visits to the Taipei City Traffic Information Center and Taipei Metro Operations Control Center have been arranged for elementary school students. Interesting tours and interactive experiences allow these students to understand the past, present, and future of Taipei traffic and the operation and dispatch of MRT trains. For junior and senior high school students, activities focus on regulations surrounding increasingly common micro electric two-wheel vehicles and how to safely enjoy cycling. These activities include riding experiences arranged to build practical traffic safety knowledge.

Among universities, the University of Taipei is located in a bustling downtown area. The Taipei City Government understands that many students commute by motorcycle. To ensure student safety, Traffic Division officers are invited to schools annually to promote traffic safety by discussing actual cases, thus deepening students' impressions of common oversights or precautions when riding motorcycles. A student shared, "I didn't pay attention to wearing my helmet properly before, but after listening to the police

officer, I realized how important it is." In administrative systems and teacher workshops, experience-sharing and practical exchange are emphasized, especially regarding children's traffic safety. To make traffic education easier for kindergarten staff, drivers, and accompanying personnel to implement, courses incorporate easy-to-understand explanations and real cases to introduce key safety concepts.

In addition to lectures, the Taipei City Government's methods of promoting traffic safety are becoming increasingly creative. To allow more citizens to learn through entertainment, a "Traffic Safety Baseball Day" was held. This event integrated traffic safety concepts into baseball games and rules, allowing participants to subconsciously memorize crucial traffic safety concepts through interactive games. Additionally, to protect traffic guides volunteering outside schools, who silently contribute to safety and stand on the front lines, group accident insurance for these volunteers was increased from NT\$2 million to NT\$3 million, and senior volunteers over 75 years old receive additional personal insurance, giving these "guardian angels" greater protection.

For these comprehensive efforts to promote traffic safety education, in 2024, Taipei City led the nation with 11 major Golden Awards — the highest traffic safety honor, often regarded as the “Oscars” of the field. Instead of becoming complacent, the Taipei City Government will continue to expand traffic safety promotion for older residents, deepen traffic safety education on campuses, further encourage vehicles to yield to pedestrians at intersections, and continue subsidizing motorcycle riding training. These efforts will improve residents’ understanding of traffic safety, fostering a safe traffic culture from the inside out.

Protecting Pedestrians Through Technology-Driven Enforcement

Can you imagine how technology can become a crucial force protecting pedestrian safety in addition to making life more convenient? The Taipei City Government leverages the advantages of technology to effectively improve enforcement efficiency while greatly reducing the burden on frontline police forces, demonstrating the innovative role of technology in city governance.

In 2024, to effectively reduce traffic violations and prevent traffic accidents through technology-driven enforcement of pedestrian right of way, 59 enforcement devices were activated. The average number of monthly violation tickets issued decreased dramatically by 94.3% compared with the testing period, demonstrating that technology-driven enforcement can effectively deter violations. To address vehicles refusing to yield to pedestrians, technology-driven enforcement increased enforcement cases at intersections by 50% in 2024

compared with the same period in 2023, providing greater protection for pedestrians.

Regarding pedestrian right of way, to address Taipei’s reputation as a “pedestrian hell,” the “2024–2026 Detailed Implementation Plan for Taipei Pedestrian Safety Plan” was established. This plan strengthens enforcement against vehicles not yielding to pedestrians, pedestrians running red lights or not using crosswalks, and cars and motorcycles driving or illegally parking on sidewalks or under arcades. In 2024 alone, 320,000 cases were recorded. The Taipei City Government hopes everyone can develop the good habit of yielding to pedestrians.

Starting from Villages to Transform Street Safety

From busy intersections with heavy traffic to community alleys, traffic safety is gradually becoming a visible part of daily life. In 2024, the Taipei City Government transitioned from a government-led approach to traffic improvement to a bottom-up model that emphasizes local consensus through proposals initiated by village units, for which the Taipei City Government provides professional planning assistance. This approach meets residents’ needs and increases their willingness to participate in traffic improvements. This approach also emphasizes the combination of “pedestrian-friendly zones” with “pedestrian priority zones” to improve the walking environment within alleys and give pedestrians the right of way in specific areas, making residents feel at ease as soon as they step out of their homes.




In one notable example of this approach, Daxue Village pioneered the nation's first "traffic-friendly zone." After this zone was established, vehicle speed was reduced by 26.52%, and accidents also decreased by 22.22%, quickly attracting attention from other villages. The nearby Longquan Village in Daan District, which surrounds National Taiwan Normal University, followed suit in establishing pedestrian-friendly zones, resulting in average car and motorcycle speed reductions of 25% and 32%, respectively, improving pedestrian safety. Additionally, Jiaxing Village in Xinyi District established the nation's first pedestrian priority zone in Lane 9, Alley 175 of Jiaxing Street, decreasing car and motorcycle speeds by 31% and 24%, respectively. The village chief reported that the establishment of the priority zone ensures residents need not worry about vehicles speeding through when they are walking on roadsides or being honked at by vehicles when walking in the middle of alleys. In particular, the installation of speed bumps slows down vehicles, fostering peace of mind among pedestrians.

In planning such spaces, the Taipei City Government borrowed from the Land Transport Authority of Singapore's "Silver Zone" concept to combine the installation of curved roads, composite speed bumps, and wedge markings within neighborhoods with efforts to narrow intersections, managing vehicle speeds through creative and practical approaches. These efforts are guided by the core principles of safety, human-centered design, and environmental priority. Through shared consensus among community residents on creating interesting streets, the traditional prioritization of driving efficiency within design thinking has been

overturned. The examples provided were initiated at the grassroots level and involve deep community participation to gradually ensure a safer and friendlier human-centered traffic environment in Taipei City, demonstrating the unlimited potential of urban street transformation.

As of 2024, 19 villages have expressed willingness to plan traffic-friendly zones, and the Taipei City Government will evaluate improvement needs individually. Another 20 villages have expressed willingness to create pedestrian-friendly zones, and the Taipei City Government will actively cooperate with each village to provide a safe and comfortable walking environment for residents.



After improvements to the pedestrian-friendly zone in Longquan Village, measured car and motorcycle speeds decreased by 25% and 32%, respectively, effectively improving pedestrian safety.

Pedestrian-Friendly Zone

A pedestrian-friendly zone is a publicly announced area that provides pedestrians with a continuous, barrier-free walking environment in which vehicle usage behavior is regulated.



Pedestrian Priority Zone

A pedestrian priority zone is a road segment designated through public announcement as a pedestrian walkway and equipped with dedicated signs and vehicle speed reduction facilities.

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Special Report 1 Protecting Our Health and Food Safety

Dietary choices have become increasingly diverse, and health has become a top concern for families. In consideration of this, the Taipei City Government has taken thoughtful and professional measures to protect citizens, with these measures starting with food and extending to comprehensive family health care.

Improving Food Safety and Protecting Every Meal

In modern industrial and commercial societies, eating out has become part of daily life for many people. Have you ever been worried about food safety when you eat in a restaurant? The Taipei City Government is working hard to ensure the safety of every meal you eat, allowing you to dine with greater peace of mind!

To increase food safety inspection capabilities, the Taipei City Government established the Foodborne Disease Etiologic Agent Testing Unit in 2024. Advanced equipment, including gas chromatography-tandem mass spectrometer (GC-MS/MS) electronic low-temperature incubators, and CO₂ incubators, were introduced into government food testing to ensure early detection of hazardous substances. In addition to continually improving the technology used to detect unsafe substances, the new unit has established a pathogen testing database of domestic and international food poisoning cases. Moreover, the unit conducts specialized inspections of specific foods, such as rice-based products, red yeast rice products, and fish to comprehensively improve food safety and thereby ensure Taipei residents can enjoy delicious meals at ease.

Expedited Processing to Food Poisoning Protects You and Your Family's Health

Food safety problems sometimes occur when people dine out. However, you no longer need to worry about this—the Taipei City Government revised its response procedures for suspected food poisoning in May 2024. Apart from cooperating with the police and strengthening its reporting mechanisms, the Taipei City Government developed requirements indicating that businesses associated with severe or life-threatening food poisoning cases must immediately temporarily suspend operations, and it has expanded food sampling during source tracing to include related foods and raw materials. The Taipei City Government has also revised its standards for business suspension and resumption. Once operators apply to resume business, they must submit improvement reports and complete 4 hours of hygiene training, after which the Taipei City Government Department of Health will conduct reinspections to resume operations, ensuring that each step in every procedure effectively protects public health.

To further enhance food safety, sanitation inspections, and postmarket management, the Taipei City Government Department of Health has continually worked to improve inspectors' professional capabilities. In March, August, and November 2024, the department held three sessions of Sanitation Inspections Practical Training Classes, which involved 26 hours of training for 186 participating inspectors. This demonstrates the Taipei City Government's efforts toward comprehensive improvement of the efficacy of enforcing food

regulations, ensuring the safety of the food Taipei residents consume. Taipei is a consumption-oriented city, and the government plans to continue reviewing and adjusting its annual sampling quantities to ensure it meets public needs, actively strengthen its source risk monitoring, and to establish guidance mechanisms to improve self-management among operators. In 2024, 5,146 market food samples were tested, and the compliance rate was recorded as 93.2%. This reflects the effects and results of the Taipei City Government Department of Health's efforts regarding food safety.

Careful Measures Ensure People Can Enjoy Delicious Food Confidently

In addition to food safety, proper dining environments and restaurant hygiene are key aspects of protecting citizens' health.

The Taipei City Government Department of Health has actively promoted the implementation of Food Service Hygiene Rating System. In 2024, the department collaborated with the Taipei City Office of Commerce to expand the promotion of this certification to commercial districts with high levels of tourism, including Ximending and Gongguan. By the end of the year, the department had guided 4,494 restaurants to pass the Food Service Hygiene Rating System, with

3,959 restaurants receiving excellent grades and 535 receiving good grades. Additionally, to improve the food hygiene self-management capabilities among restaurant operators and food safety confidence among residents, the Taipei City Government created gourmet maps listing restaurant grades and held the "Taipei Delicacy" lottery activity, which has enabled Taipei's residents and tourists to safely experience Taiwan's dining culture together.

Multilingual Food Safety Courses Benefit More People

Many new immigrants operate small restaurants featuring hometown flavors in Taipei, but they may be unfamiliar with Taiwan's food safety regulations. To help these operators run their businesses with peace of mind, the Taipei City Government Department of Health developed audio-visual materials regarding food safety and hygiene in four languages—Chinese, English, Indonesian, and Vietnamese—with these materials first provided on the Taipei e-Campus Digital Learning Network on December 30, 2024. These materials make understanding relevant regulations easier for new immigrants and therefore allow customers to feel reassured while they enjoy delicious food, helping Taipei to become the international capital of culinary safety!

Transparent Food Source Origins: Shop for Groceries Without Worrying

Have you ever been worried because the origin of the foods you consume or purchase is unclear? To create a reassuring and safe environment for food consumption for the people of Taipei, the Taipei City Government established the Taipei Food Ingredient Registration Platform, the functions of which are continually being optimized, with dedicated sections created to help citizens address their food safety concerns!

As of 2024, the Taipei Food Ingredient Registration Platform contains 17 specialized sections, including those focused on supermarkets, coffee shop chains, and souvenir stores. The number of service sections has gradually increased each year, and the platform has accumulated over 2 million page views since its launch. As publicly listed and over-the-counter restaurant chains regularly open new branches and the number of customers visiting such restaurants has increased, the Taipei City Government added the "Listed and Over-the-Counter Chain Restaurant Section" to the platform in 2024. This section was officially launched on January 1, 2025, to increase the transparency of food ingredient sources at such restaurants. Regardless of whether you eat out frequently or cook at home, the Taipei City Government is working behind the scenes to ensure the safety of the food for all residents.



Health Bonus Program: Caring for Every Moment

Food is important, but health is even more important. Considering this, we have good news to share! Taipei City launched the Adult Health Examination Bonus Subsidy program in July 2024. The subsidy program provides six additional free tests as part of adult health examinations, including blood urea nitrogen, uric acid, glycated hemoglobin, complete blood count, thyroid-stimulating hormone, and CA-199 tumor marker tests. Within just 4 months of the start of the program, 9,941 people participated, and health examination rates grew by 47.39%.

Many participants have happily shared their experiences with the program, reporting that the additional six tests provided them more comprehensive control over their health and a reassuring extra layer of protection from illness. The program has been integrated with the TaipeiPASS app, and it immediately notifies users of health examination reports through precise matching and push notification functions. To ensure more citizens can enjoy these benefits, the Taipei City Government will provide bonus subsidies throughout all of 2025 to those eligible for adult health examinations. Such individuals can participate in the program at anytime—health has no limits!

Protecting Children's Health: A Collaborative Journey

Besides providing convenient health examination services for adults, Taipei City has promoted the growth and health of young children through active investment in a health protection network that begins protection at childhood.

In 2024, the Taipei City Government commissioned 17 contracted medical institutions to hold 764 "Integrated Community Screening Services for Preschool Children" sessions at kindergartens and community centers. These sessions enabled children to easily complete physical, oral, vision, and hearing examinations in familiar environments, saving time and providing peace of mind. This service has already provided health examinations for 56,196 children. Extra 6 times of child development screening services and vision re-examination subsidies were added to the program in 2024, with these additions helping parents better understand their children's health conditions early and intervening with appropriate treatment. The health-care network for preschool children has received positive feedback from many parents, who have reported that it provides them with more support and peace of mind in caring for their children.

Improvements are being made to children's health care that can also reassure parents of junior high school boys! In September 2024, Taipei City began providing free human papilloma virus (HPV) vaccinations for

junior high school boys to prevent related infections and oropharyngeal cancer, reducing future medical burdens. By the end of 2024, 8,085 junior high school boys had been vaccinated, with this corresponding to a vaccination rate of 73.45% and adding another layer of protection of children's health. Parents are working together on early prevention, detection, and treatment to ensure peace of mind about their children's health.

Special Report 2

Enjoying Life in Warm and Caring Residential Environments

A safe and comfortable home is the foundation of happiness in everyone's life. Taipei City seeks to protect residential safety through comprehensive building lifecycle management. In daily life, the city promotes social housing and rental subsidies to reduce the pressure of starting a family and raising children. Furthermore, the city has drafted sustainable blueprints to create a livable environment and a self-cooling city, making life in Taipei more secure and comfortable.

Initial Inspection Phase: Protecting Every Construction Site Through Rapid Response

For peace of mind among residents, safety must be ensured from the construction stage. The Taipei City Government has strengthened construction phase management through regular, comprehensive construction site inspections and multiple new safety measures. These measures include inspections conducted by professional associations during basement excavation phases, clearer definition of construction inspection procedures, revision of external review principles for structural and construction plans, public disclosure of safety monitoring data, and

additional construction layout inspections and ground-penetrating radar detection before project completion. Through layer-by-layer oversight, construction quality can be improved from the bottom line, allowing everyone to live with greater peace of mind.

Medium- to Long-Term Safety Assurance Phase: Protecting Buildings Across Time to Continue the Story of Home

After houses are built, they enter the long-term occupancy phase. Given that many buildings in Taipei City are over 30 years old, the Taipei City Government prioritizes building safety and maintenance, adopting a three-pronged approach involving elevator installation, exterior wall renovation, and structural reinforcement to make old buildings more durable and create opportunities for renewal.

Regarding elevator installation, old buildings without elevators are very inconvenient for elder adults, prompting the Taipei City Government to launch elevator installation subsidy measures. By the end of 2024, a total of 100 cases had received subsidies—the highest in the nation. Nineteen new cases were granted subsidies in 2024 alone, a 46% increase from the previous year. The 100th case, which involved the Fu-Tai Community, is a successful example of how these measures mitigated residents' building access difficulties. In 2024, subsidy regulations were revised, and the requirements were

relaxed so that an application can be made as long as a representative is elected by a majority of unit owners, allowing more people to benefit from the program and realize the goal of aging in place and living well together.

In addition to internal improvements, to improve the exterior appearance of buildings, the Taipei City Government leads nationwide promotion of exterior wall renovation subsidies and reporting systems. For old or potentially dangerous buildings, proactive inspections and exterior wall repairs are conducted to prevent tile detachment injuries. To reduce the burden on residents, subsidy amounts were considerably increased starting in 2024: the city's exterior wall detachment repair subsidies increased from NT\$100,000 to NT\$200,000, and the exterior wall reporting subsidies increased from NT\$88,000 to NT\$128,000. These measures can make Taipei City's buildings both safe and esthetically pleasing.

Regarding structural reinforcement, following the earthquake on April 3rd, 2024, the Taipei City Government further increased its focus on promoting structural safety and seismic resistance, launching the 403 Earthquake Repair and Reinforcement Subsidy Program for Buildings with Red and Yellow Notices. Within this program, buildings with red notices can receive subsidies of up to NT\$500,000 per household, buildings with yellow notices can receive up to NT\$400,000 per household, and common areas can receive up to NT\$1.5 million per building. By the end of 2024, 13 subsidy cases had been processed, helping citizens rebuild their homes and improving residential safety.

Late-Stage Reconstruction Phase: Injecting New Life Into Old and Dangerous Buildings

For old or dangerous buildings, the Taipei City Government has actively promoted urban renewal and reconstruction and optimized review processes, systems, and supporting measures. In 2024, the cumulative total of approved urban renewal cases reached 599, with 37 new cases added throughout that year. Additionally, reconstruction approvals for dangerous buildings reached 982 cases, with 77 new cases added throughout 2024. In terms of both urban renewal and dangerous building reconstruction, the number of approved cases in Taipei City ranks

first nationwide, demonstrating how the Taipei City Government has worked collaboratively with citizens to inject new life into the city's old buildings.

The Taipei City Government has introduced new approaches to improve reconstruction efficiency and quality. For example, to target buildings with insufficient seismic capacity, the government launched the "Disaster Prevention Urban Renewal Special Project" to accelerate the reconstruction of dangerous buildings and increase overall safety. Between the project's announcement on March 28, 2024, and the end of that year, 14 applications were received, demonstrating the project's initial effectiveness in encouraging renewal intentions among citizens.

For sites with high structural safety risks, referred to as "concrete cancer buildings," the Taipei City Government launched the "High Chloride Ion Concrete Building 575 Project" in 2024, under which feasibility assessments and financial calculations were conducted for buildings that are listed for demolition and reconstruction and have 50% consent. By the end

of 2024, five cases had applied for this project, among which Neihu Kangle Street Lane 136 has reached the investment solicitation phase. These policies encourage community self-help, mutual assistance, and public-private cooperation, facilitating the joint promotion of urban renewal to create safer and more livable residential environments.

For communities with willingness but insufficient resources to renovate, the Taipei City Government also encourages public-private cooperation on renewal through the "Government-led Urban Renewal 7599 Project Plan." After the annual acceptance limit of only 10 cases was lifted in 2024, promotion became more flexible. By the end of 2024, 15 communities had been assisted in completing the program evaluation, benefiting more than 1,000 households with a total area exceeding 60,000 square meters. Multiple sites, such as Xinyi District Hulin Street Lane 60 and Nangang Industrial Zone Unit 2-25, have been successfully integrated with government support and entered the investment solicitation phase, bringing new hope to areas that were previously unable to participate in urban renewal.

Supporting Young Families' Dreams of Happiness and Home

In addition to building-related concerns, the Taipei City Government has focused on the housing needs of young people, who face the pressure of high living costs and must also consider the living environment, along with their children's education. For these people, finding an ideal home has become a major life challenge.

The Taipei City Government has heard the voices of young families. The "Newlyweds And Parenting Family Social Housing" project, which was first launched in 2024, provides substantial support to couples who have been married within 2 years

and those with children under 6 years of age. In Xinyi District, the Yongji urban renewal project allocated units for this project, and signing and move-in procedures were completed in December 2024, allowing young people to fulfill their life vision of starting a family, having children, and moving into a new home.

In addition to providing brand-new living environments, the Taipei City Government has thoughtfully designed a lottery mechanism that provides families with two or more children aged 0-6 years with a greater chance of being allocated a Newlyweds And Parenting Family Social Housing unit. Tiered rent subsidies ranging from NT\$3,000 to NT\$11,000 per month are offered to reduce the burden placed on families. Moreover, families with Newlyweds And Parenting Family Social Housing as their registered residence can enjoy an additional NT\$1,000 rental subsidy per child (up to NT\$3,000). If children attend public elementary schools belonging to or assigned to Newlyweds And Parenting Family Social Housing, the rental period can be extended until elementary school graduation for up to 12 years maximum, promoting long-term stability. Most residents from the first wave of selection who provided feedback positively affirmed the Newlyweds And Parenting Family Social Housing project, demonstrating that this policy is gradually gaining communal support and recognition. The Taipei City Government hopes that young generation can feel secure starting families in Taipei City.

Quality Social Housing for Peace of Mind Among Families With Children

The happiness of living in Taipei City does not stop there. Citizens residing in social housing or municipal public rental housing under the city's jurisdiction also be eligible for additional childcare rental subsidies. Specifically, registered residents who are parents of children under the age of 12 can receive bonus subsidies in the form of monthly rent reductions of NT\$1,000 to NT\$3,000 maximum, reducing the burden on families with children and allowing them to enjoy warm, secure, and happy homes.

The Taipei City Government is committed to combining quality and warmth in social housing development. The planning, design, and construction management of social housing projects incorporate smart and green design principles, earthquake-resistant construction, and child-friendly spaces. This

approach improves housing safety and comfort while addressing residents' diverse needs in daily life, allowing them to settle down and raise children in Taipei City with peace of mind. These efforts have been repeatedly recognized by the central government, receiving the 23rd and 24th Public Construction Golden Quality Awards (Excellence Level) from the Executive Yuan's Public Construction Commission and the 12th Excellent Green Building Honor from the Ministry of the Interior, among other awards. This recognition demonstrates Taipei City's concrete achievements in and dedication to promoting high-quality social housing.

Promoting Coolness Through Green City Design


To face the challenges brought about by climate change, the Taipei City Government actively promotes net-zero transition policies, gradually guiding the transition toward a sustainable future in urban planning and daily life. The Taipei City Government has therefore proposed the "City Cooling Plan," which outlines efforts to achieve carbon reduction and sequestration through thermal comfort cooling measures, architectural energy efficiency, and green coverage expansion efforts. These efforts promote a cooler, more sustainable, and more livable city.

Regarding carbon reduction through thermal comfort cooling measures, the Taipei City Government is increasing greenery in development sites, installing

continuous canopies, and improving ventilation design to make outdoor environments cooler and more comfortable. On November 12, 2024, the Taipei City Government officially announced its implementation of a detailed plan for the Taipei City Thermal Comfort Cooling Project for Development Sites. This project provides incentives for the installation of vertical greenery and continuous canopies on buildings, encouraging the collaborative creation of more pleasant urban spaces. Regarding carbon reduction through building energy efficiency, active research into and formulation of the Taipei City Control Measures for Building Energy Consumption are currently underway to clearly define energy consumption standards for buildings, evaluation methods, and required information content. Through the optimization of exterior design and energy-saving equipment configuration and the use of renewable energy sources such as solar power, heat emissions from building electricity and air conditioning can be reduced, contributing to energy saving and carbon reduction measures. Regarding carbon sequestration through green coverage expansion, lush open spaces and permeable pavements are being created to promote green infrastructure, allowing citizens to cool themselves through shade and natural breezes in parks, green spaces, and plazas. Trees lining both sides of a road serve as natural air conditioning, effectively reducing heat and filtering dust, making the overall urban environment more comfortable and pleasant.

Special Report 3 Inclusion Weaves a Safety Net

Universal Social Safety Net: Warmly Catching Everyone

While facing family difficulties, emotional lows, or unexpected setbacks during your busy life, have you ever felt lost and helpless? Do not worry! The Universal Social Safety Net is similar to an invisible protective net that provides warm-hearted assistance in moments of need.

In Taipei City, social worker staffing has been expanded under the Second-Phase Plan for Strengthening the Social Safety Net, which outlines four comprehensive protection strategies and three advancement strategies. This plan ensures that the needs of every age group are understood and addressed. Notably, the government adopts a "prevention as priority" approach to proactively identify vulnerable or at-risk families early on and to offer a helping hand before the situation deteriorates, working across networks to reduce the occurrence of tragedies.

4 Comprehensive Protection Strategies +3 Advancement Strategies



Protecting Young Children: Dedicated Pediatrician Program Launched

Children's health is what every family values most. In response to the declining birth rates, the Taipei City Government has launched the Dedicated Pediatrician Program for Young Children to ensure that children under 3 years of age can receive timely and caring medical services in their community. In 2024, the program expanded to include hospitals at all levels. For social safety net cases, the Taipei City Government works with personnel in Keelung, New Taipei, and Taoyuan to discuss cross-regional case management processes for children in high-risk families, creating a new model of intercity cooperation.

This program not only offers vaccinations, health examinations, and developmental assessments but also reminds parents to pay early attention to their children's health concerns, facilitating timely referrals to early medical or social resource intervention when necessary. Particularly aimed at six groups: premature infants, children from families with high hepatitis B risk, children whose parents use illegal or addictive substances, children with suspected developmental delays, children of parents with moderate to severe disability certificates, and children who are overdue for preventive vaccinations. Several challenges have emerged during the program's implementation, including a lack of fixed contact personnel for cross-regional cases and incomplete case data, which have been solved through greater advocacy and provision of necessary information to social workers. In the future, Taipei City will continue to expand cooperation to ensure that every child can grow up healthily and safely while providing parents with greater support.

You Are Not Alone: We Are Always Here

Among the top 10 causes of death among Taipei City's adolescent population, intentional self-harm (suicide) ranks first. This ranking underscores the urgency of mental health support and suicide prevention for this age group.

In 2024, Taipei City launched a comprehensive adolescent suicide prevention program. For front-end prevention, program staff collaborate with influencers to create animated short films as an approachable medium that can help adolescents better understand

their emotions and learn how to recognize potential suicide warning signs. Additionally, videos featuring High School Basketball League players have been filmed to encourage adolescents to relieve stress through sports. To address back-end intervention, adolescent psychological counseling and mental health clinics have been expanded to ensure that all adolescents know that someone is always willing to reach out and accompany them through their low moments toward a future filled with hope.

Police Security: Cross-Domain Protection

In addition to communities, doctors, and schools, police officers serve as people's guardians and are a key force within the protection network.

In 2024, the Taipei City Police Department focused on implementing the Building Clean-Up Project and strengthening the social safety network to proactively identify cases requiring assistance, rescue, or care while on duty in communities and promptly reporting and referring individuals to relevant social welfare units.

Taipei City police officers actively promote legal education from the ground up. In addition to advocacy in schools every semester, the department organizes diverse promotional activities, such as Therapy Dog Group Counseling, Emotional Dialogue Card Workshops, and the Youth Music Festival: Anti-Drug and Anti-Fraud Anime Concert. This approach leverages activities that interest adolescents to help them easily learn how to protect themselves and stay away from crime.

Building Clean-Up Project

To effectively prevent security incidents and crime in Taipei City's many buildings, police precincts target complex environments with large transient populations, including congregate housing, rental suites, locations where crimes have previously been reported or solved, and locations with clear security concerns, such as temporary residences of individuals with security issues and locations where cases were discovered by other jurisdictions. These sites are listed as inspection targets, with duty assignments arranged to strengthen investigations and inspections.

Taipei City's Multipronged Approach to Dropout Guidance Achieves Outstanding Results

In 2024, Taipei City won the Outstanding City Award for Dropout Prevention and Return-to-School Guidance Efforts, and the city government has consistently dedicated itself to helping students who have dropped out or left school while attempting to return to school. One such student is Da-Weng, who was originally enrolled at Lanzhou Junior High School but dropped out due to setbacks in boxing training and later experienced detention. After returning to campus, he received transitional education courses from the school, which allowed him to regain his confidence through street dance.

To assist every student who has dropped out or left school, Taipei City established five dropout resource center schools in 2024 to provide guidance, deliver administrative consultation services, and regularly track students who have lost contact. The city also launched customized flexible curricula targeting different student needs, which were used by 77 participating schools during the 2024 academic year. Additionally, for students who cannot adapt to the general educational system, multiple options are provided in the form of cooperative transitional classes, which feature adaptive curricula to help these students complete their studies. Four community care centers have been established for these students, including Starlight Academy, Craftsman Residential District, and Nan Ching Jhen. Career exploration, skills training, and psychological counseling are integrated with the Taipei City Student Guidance and Counseling Center, through which psychologists, social workers, and other professional personnel deeply engage with schools and families, track high-concern students, and implement a three-tier guidance mechanism.

Happiness Safeguarding Stations: Immediate Shelter and Warmth

To improve existing service station mechanisms, in 2024, the Taipei City Government promoted the "Happiness Safeguarding Station" program. Through this program, Taipei City partners with seven counties and cities in northern Taiwan (Keelung City, New Taipei City, Taoyuan City, Hsinchu City, Hsinchu County, Yilan County, and Miaoli County) and four major convenience store chains to jointly care for children and adolescents under 18 years of age, expanding the protective scope of the social safety net.

This program was officially launched in January 2024. Within this program, children encountering difficulties in life can receive meals from nearby convenience stores, such as noodles, rice, bread, and beverages. For example, Student A had only NT\$100 in daily living expenses because of family financial difficulties. Through the Happiness Safeguarding Station program, the student's hunger was satisfied, and foster care and placement assistance was also obtained. By the end of 2024, a total of 419 children and adolescents had been assisted.

Behind the scenes, the Taipei City Government is signing contracts with convenience stores, training personnel, and working with schools, communities, and chiefs of village to promote awareness and integrate resources. Currently, the Happiness Safeguarding Station program has 1,789 participating convenience stores citywide, including more than 10,000 store staff members, 500 schools, and 50,000 education personnel, allowing children and adolescents experiencing difficulties to feel warmth and hope.

From Infant Daycare and Nursery Care to Child Safety: Full Safety Net Activation

For peace of mind among parents entrusting their children to kindergartens or infant daycare centers, the social safety net has been activated. To prevent gender equality incidents in kindergartens, the Taipei City Government has established a "Three-Stage Notification Standard Operating Procedure." When gender equality incidents are reported in kindergartens, information from the Department of Social Welfare, Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault Prevention Center, and Department of Education is combined to ensure that all units can immediately grasp the situation and coordinate its management. For institutions where incidents emerge, a preventive supervision mechanism is activated to continuously track suspected violators and the institution's status from case emergence until evaluation. If violations are confirmed through investigation, the violators' names and their institutional employers are announced on the list of unsuitable personnel for kindergartens to ensure public awareness. For serious cases, a city-level cross-departmental emergency response team is established to improve case management and response.

To mitigate the burden on childcare personnel and improve childcare quality, the Department of Social Welfare subsidizes salaries at privately operated public infant daycare centers to facilitate the hiring of additional childcare employees in a 1:4 staff-to-child ratio, encouraging centers to ensure one teacher cares for at most four children. This model promotes more thorough care while reducing stress among childcare personnel. Additionally, to improve elementary school guidance resources, in-school medical programs on campuses were promoted in 2024 to bring psychologists and psychiatrists into elementary schools to provide psychological and emotional consultations for students, parents, and teachers. This program allows children to learn with peace of mind, with

services currently established in 23 schools.

Given that children increasingly access the internet at younger ages, they tend to face the related risks of cyberbullying, internet addiction, and online sexual exploitation. Therefore, the Taipei City Government held the Child Safety Day advocacy event "Treasure Legend: Cyber Sea Battle," which combined physical experiences, scenario challenges, and online interactive games to increase internet safety awareness among parents and children. The event provided benefits to more than 5,000 participants.

Eight Safety Nets: Protecting Everyone in Need

Since launching its universal social safety net, Taipei City has integrated eight networks. Education, health, employment, welfare, district and village care, emergency medical service, public security maintenance, and social housing care. These connections enable cross-departmental cooperation mechanisms for discovering and supporting needs in every corner. From the warmth of neighbors for families experiencing difficulties to citizen and police assistance for residents who have gone astray, the social safety net is similar to a warm protective umbrella that enables city residents to become each other's guardians and makes Taipei a warmer city.

Radiant and Joyful Sports: Leaping into Youth

A Pioneering Model Gets Citizens Moving

No need to choose a specific time or place to exercise—just bring your phone and everyone can get moving together! In 2024, the Taipei City Government upgraded the “Fun Walk in Taipei” series of activities for citizens, pioneering a nationwide model that goes beyond traditional methods of promoting physical activity by integrating technology with smart mobile apps to highlight popular activities like the Taipei Grand Trail and “Cycling Around Taipei” challenge. So far, over 1.23 million people have participated in these activities, making sports more convenient, interesting, and accessible at any time and place.

According to the Ministry of Education Sports Administration, nearly 40% of Taipei citizens exercise regularly. As technology has made life more convenient, daily activity levels have declined. To help citizens fall in love with sports again, the Taipei City Government is working to create an environment where everyone can exercise anytime, anywhere. Through the app, users can conveniently record their favorite walking routes and participate in health knowledge quizzes integrated with digital technology. After users complete their

goals, they can hunt for treasure and collect points in the app, encouraging citizens to exercise happily and learn through challenges.

From Young to Old, Everyone Gets Moving

Can older citizens also participate in these activities? Of course they can! On the activity platform, the Taipei City Government provides step-by-step instructions on how to use digital devices to participate and has designed simple and clear activity guides for seniors. During community walking classes, coaches directly lead seniors in walking activities, successfully increasing senior participation rates and breaking through age barriers in sports. Children and teenagers without smart devices don't need to worry either—future plans involve in-school lessons on accurate information about physical activity and healthy eating for students. The Taipei City Government hopes to use innovative technology to help citizens develop good daily exercise habits. When the entire city is viewed as an athletic space, citizens are motivated to exercise anytime, anywhere, making Taipei a more dynamic city.

U-Sport Smart Services: Move More to Earn More

Do you remember when you last exercised? If you don't, no problem—the “U-Sport Taipei Happy Sports” initiative by the Taipei City Government Department of Sports will help citizens rediscover the joy of exercise. Participants who exercise can earn EasyCard value, coffee vouchers, and even MRT tickets! With so many benefits, everyone can get moving.

In 2024, U-Sport underwent a complete upgrade, the biggest highlight of which is the launch of a practical mobile app. This app includes pioneering integration with sports center systems—citizens can use their phone to scan entry codes at participating sports venues to offset costs and accumulate U-coins. The app also launches occasional limited-time missions combined with other Taipei City Government events or activities, allowing users to earn bonus points. The more you move, the more you earn!

The U-Sport app, which was independently developed by the Taipei City Government, has successfully encouraged more citizens to participate in sports activities through gamification

design and simple, easy-to-understand user interface. The daily reward of five U-coins has been particularly effective. U-coins can be used to offset venue entry fees, sports courses, or facility rental fees or exchanged for EasyCard top-up credits, which can be used for public transportation, YouBike rentals, or convenience store purchases. To encourage citizens to download and register for the U-Sport app, in 2024, the Taipei City Government launched limited sports credit vouchers worth NT\$1,500 that eligible citizens could apply for, which received an extremely enthusiastic response.

The Taipei City Government worked behind the scenes to expand the U-Sport system across private sports venues, personally visiting major operators of private chains to explain the program, assess their individual needs, and collect opinions from all parties. The government then established common standards for each vendor and coordinated with onsite point of sale systems for programming modifications, enabling U-Sport integration.

Between the official launch of the U-Sport app on April 17, 2024, and the end of that year, 238 public and private sports venues and over 94,000 citizens joined the initiative, achieving over 1.51 million U-coin collection instances. The total amount of U-coins exchanged for EasyCard top-up credits has exceeded NT\$17.8 million, demonstrating the program's success in promoting active lifestyles.

The app promotion campaign also involved the creation of the U-Sport Taipei Happy Sports fan page in April 2024, which received 11,000 likes and attracted 13,000 followers in just 8 months. Comments and private messages reveal enthusiastic support for this program. The Taipei City Government continues to innovate with new features in the app. For example, a "step counting and point accumulation" function will be launched in March 2025, syncing with mobile health data to let users earn rewards.

One Venue, One Feature: Launching the Taipei Specialty Sports Venue Project

To meet citizens' increasingly diverse athletic needs, the Taipei City Government Department of Sports has launched the "Taipei Specialty Sports Venue" project to enable all citizens to enjoy sports and improve their health through exercise.

This project leverages public resources to revitalize old buildings and promote cross-departmental cooperation, targeting neighborhoods with fewer sports facilities for nine distinctive new sports venues. Each location has been planned around the "one venue, one feature" concept, combining sustainable smart technology, specialty sports, and environmental protection to make sports a natural and interesting part of city life. The project has also attracted private sector participation to promote sports industry development and transform Taipei into a sports-focused city.

Two Key Venues Under Construction: Debut of Children's Fitness and Shooting Practice Facilities

The groundbreaking ceremony for the Keqiang Park Swimming Pool was held in April 2024. This venue, which is undergoing renovation to become the Keqiang Sports Center, will be to feature a children's fitness center. Children will be able to exercise through play, building a healthy foundation for their future growth from an early age. In addition to parent-child activities, the venue will facilities, such as children's playrooms and swimming pools. The center will be a top choice for parents who want to bring their children to stay active and healthy!

In July 2024, renovation commenced to transform the former Xinsheng Park tennis court management office into the Xinsheng Sports Center shooting practice. This center will host Taipei's first 10 m and 25 m electronic moving target shooting range, featuring bullet velocity measurement, trajectory testing, near-target misfire display, and equipment certified by the International Shooting Sport Federation. The venue will also be integrated with the surrounding Wheelchair Dream Park for barrier-free sports. In addition to preserving the original swimming pool and basketball court, the facility will include multipurpose courts, a fitness center, and multi- function sports classrooms — offering citizens more diverse athletic options and high-quality sports experiences!

Boxing Passion and Esports Future: Two Rising Stars Take the Stage

The Qihu Sports Center, scheduled to break ground in 2026, will feature boxing and sports exhibition functions. The project has entered the basic design stage. Moving forward, through visits and in-depth communication with local groups, it will be developed into a flexible, multifunctional sports space — transforming the venue into a vibrant new hub for the local community.

Additionally, the Gongguan Sports Center (Taipei Water Park), a newly planned esports facilities, will make young people's eyes light up. The venue will combine esports and virtual sports to create a next-generation sports arena. The venue has already launched renovation plans. In the future, Taipei will become a new hotspot for e-sports and technology-related sports.

Sports Never Stop, Excellence Continues

In addition to the four venues currently under construction or being designed, the remaining facilities in the Taipei Specialty Sports Venues project are being actively planned. Through these new spaces, the Taipei City Government hopes to provide better athletic environments for citizens, encouraging them to fall in love with sports and develop regular exercise habits. The government is working hard to make Taipei into a capital of sports. In the future, Taipei will have distinctive, top-tier sports facilities that combine technology, innovation, and universal participation. Let's look forward to Taipei's specialty sports venues together, opening up a new healthy lifestyle!





Special Report 5 Writing Glory, Pursuing Excellence

Continuous Amazement at the 2024 National High School Games in Taipei

Every April marks the perfect time for secondary school students from across the nation to showcase their talents. The 2024 National High School Games featured 20 required competition categories, such as swimming, gymnastics, table tennis, and badminton, and 2 optional categories, martial arts and roller skating. The games allowed young athletes to exert themselves in pursuit of glory, providing them with the opportunity for self-development through athletic challenges.

Taipei City hosted the 2024 National High School Games. While making preparations for the 22 sports categories and coordinating various competition processes and venue arrangements, the Taipei City Government leveraged its team capabilities to actively overcome all difficulties.

For the first time, the sacred flame lighting ceremony, which symbolizes the transmission of athletic spirit, was projected onto the Taipei City Government building through virtual reality. This creative innovation

demonstrates the infinite opportunities to combine technology with tradition.

For the 2024 competition, Taiwan's international sports stars, including Wang Kuan-Hung, Wang Chi-lin, Lee Yang, and Huang Hsiao-Wen, were invited to serve as ambassadors, jointly igniting the passion for sports. To encourage students to participate in this grand sporting event, the Taipei City Government arranged for all affiliated public and private secondary schools to suspend classes during the competition period, giving everyone the opportunity to attend and cheer for the athletes. During the competition, a pioneering digital stamp collection activity allowed junior and senior high school students in Taipei to enter venues with their digital student IDs and accumulate points to exchange for prizes. Additionally, kindergarten and elementary school students could bring exploration booklets to service counters at the competition venues to collect and exchange stamps for limited-edition gifts. Enthusiastic spectator participation inspired athletes to reach their unlimited potential, and tournament records were broken in 10 instances.

National High School Games: Two Consecutive Championship Victories, Continuing Taipei's Glory

In the 2024 National High School Games, Taipei City won 147 gold medals, 123 silver medals, and 144 bronze medals, setting a new record for the city's representative team with an outstanding total of 414 medals. The athletes maintained Taipei's consecutive national championship in the medal count, ensuring Taipei remained victorious.

This competition marked Taipei's return as the host city after a 12-year absence. Multiple participation channels were made available for citizens who couldn't attend the events in person, allowing them to cheer on the young athletes via the official competition website and YouTube platform. These channels allowed the public to participate in the competitions, collectively experience the passionate atmosphere of the games, and witness the dedication of the Taipei City Government.

Looking back over the past two years, Taipei City has demonstrated outstanding performance in the National High School Games, leading the nation in the gold medal count, total medal count, and overall championship results. To ensure continued success, the Taipei City Government will invest more resources into discovering and nurturing outstanding athletic talents in Taipei, helping athletes reach new heights on the competitive stage!

Reclaiming the Crown at the Citizens Sports Games and Polishing the "Sports Capital" Brand

In Taipei, not only do young people love cycling, jogging, and fitness activities, but older adults can often be seen exercising gracefully and with agility during the early morning in parks and open spaces, demonstrating the vitality of citizens coming together to exercise!

This passion for exercise was displayed at the 2024 Citizens Sports Games. The representative team from Taipei City, consisting of athletes, coaches, and other staff members—a total of 1,075 people—was heading south to the host city of Pingtung and reclaimed the throne after a 10-year break. The teams from Taipei earned one gold and three silver medals in sepak takraw, won the men's slow-pitch softball gold cup, achieved the fifth consecutive championship in the women's tug-of-war 540 kg division and fourth

consecutive championship in mixed korfball, and were victorious in the women's dragon boat 100-meter straight course speed race championship. A team composed of senior citizens from Taipei City won five gold medals in the Yuan Chih Dance category alone and achieved an outstanding total of 64 gold, 51 silver, and 65 bronze medals. Moreover, "Taiwanese Butterfly King" Wang Kuan-Hung participated in the water rescue challenge for the first time, winning the 200-meter obstacle race gold medal; roller skating athlete Liu Chiao-hsi completed four consecutive championships at the games; and women's figure skating athlete Hung Hsiao-ching won gold in individual inline freestyle. These athletes all represent the best of Taipei City.

Excellence from Athletes, Seniors, and Persons with Disabilities who we Have Supported

To further develop Taipei as a "sports capital" and support athletes in achieving excellent results, the Taipei City Government has established grassroots training stations, provided various guidance and subsidies, and increased the Guo Guang Athletic Scholarships and training subsidies, investing in athletes' continued success in domestic and international competitions.

After a 10-year hiatus, the team representing Taipei brought glory to the city by reclaiming the overall championship Presidential Award in the Citizens Sports Games.

Taipei City's achievement of the overall championship Presidential Award in the 2024 Citizens Sports Games marks the fifth golden cup for Team Taipei in the past two years across six major comprehensive sporting events, following four consecutive National Games championships, two consecutive National High School Games championships, and ten consecutive National Disabled Games championships, bringing Taipei nearer to a "grand slam" of victories. Many citizens don't realize that public sports centers in Taipei have free time slots for senior citizens. Additionally, the Department of Sports has established the Senior Citizen Mobile Sports Instruction Team, connecting professional coaches with older adults. Furthermore, the Disabled Mobile Sports Instruction Team provides specialized courses and training, such as bodyweight strength training and mat exercises, allowing disabled individuals develop exercise habits. These community-level efforts can transform Taipei into an age-friendly sports city.

Taipei Dome's Debut: Igniting our Passion for Baseball across the Nation

Taipei City's enthusiasm for sports continues to burn! From November 13–18, 2024, the 2024 third World Baseball Softball Confederation (WBSC) Premier12 (Taiwan Zone Preliminaries) were cohosted by the Taipei City Government Department of Sports and the Chinese Taipei Baseball Association. The preliminaries were fiercely contested at the Taipei Dome and Tianmu Baseball Stadium, marking the highest level international baseball competition staged in Taipei Dome since its opening, allowing the Chinese Taipei team to showcase its amazing strength. The Chinese Taipei team persisted through all challenges, ultimately advancing to the finals with an excellent second-place group finish and performing perfectly to win the championship. This moment once again plunged fans across Taiwan into national baseball fever, reigniting their passion.

Showcasing Taipei to the World with Breakthrough Innovation

The 2024 third WBSC Premier12 (Taiwan Zone Preliminaries) attracted over 180,000 live attendees and over 15 million views on digital platforms, becoming an international focus, with each game attracting an average of over 28,000 spectators.

During the competition, media coverage reached

3,567 articles, with total media value exceeding NT\$540 million! Following the WBSC Premier12, Taipei Dome will continue to welcome international competitions in 2025, including the 2025 sixth World Baseball Classic Taiwan Zone Qualifiers and the World Masters Games in Taipei and New Taipei. Taipei City will use this opportunity to demonstrate excellent sporting capabilities and showcase to the world its ability to host high-standard international sporting events.

The Distinctive Taipei Marathon Takes the Stage Internationally

Marathons are like a battle of endurance and physical strength. After obtaining World Athletics Bronze Label certification in 2019–2020 and having it upgraded to Elite Label certification in 2021–2023, the Taipei Marathon received Gold Label certification for the first time in 2024, becoming Taiwan's first World Athletics-certified Gold Label urban marathon event.

In 2024, the Taipei Marathon incorporated 24 distinctive city landmarks, including the National Dr. Sun Yat-sen Memorial Hall, National Chiang Kai-



shek Memorial Hall, four ancient city gates, Taipei Main Station, the Office of the President, SPOT-Taipei, arts parks, Huandong Blvd., Taipei Arena, and Taipei Stadium. The marathon design used sports to promote Taipei's urban landscape and local cultural characteristics and attract athletes to visit the city as tourists in the future.

The visual design of the 2024 Taipei Marathon integrated local imagery, historical and temporal context, and annual theme slogans to demonstrate uniqueness, strengthen international appeal, and connect visual elements closely with the competition theme. The exclusive event logo was inspired by the Möbius strip, symbolizing runners' breath, persistence, and willpower to highlight the vitality and hope brought by the Taipei Marathon.

Coinciding with the 140th anniversary of Taipei City's founding, the event included the first directional signs incorporating urban landscapes, collaborated with century-old stores to offer exclusive discounts, and established a "runner's prayer wall" at the century-old Songshan Ciyou Temple, located along the marathon course. The temple led prayers for smooth activities and blessed each participant to achieve good results, highlighting Taipei City's profound cultural heritage and local religious beliefs. For persons with disabilities, the wheelchair division provided exclusive tents, sweeping vehicles, wheelchair maintenance stations, and support personnel, allowing physically disabled and visually impaired runners to fulfill their dreams of participating

in international competitions, creating a diverse and inclusive marathon event focused on sports equality.

Carbon reduction measures were actively implemented throughout the event, and green energy was used in the competition. The marathon incorporated paperless programs and completion certificates, plastic bottles were recycled to make medal ribbons, and recycled marine waste was reprocessed into meaningful trophies, demonstrating environmental care in every aspect of the event. Additionally, certain service vehicles were replaced with electric vehicles, drinking water stations and self-service water refill areas were set up along the marathon route, and plastic packaging for runner supplies and completion gifts was reduced or replaced with more environmentally friendly paper packaging. These measures align with international standards, symbolizing the Taipei City Government's determination to promote environmentally friendly road running sports.

Special Report 6 Smart City Innovation

In the digital era, the Taipei City Government is actively integrating artificial intelligence and innovative technology into daily life to develop a smart city. From campuses to businesses, smart applications are becoming more widespread throughout Taipei, improving both learning and entrepreneurship. Taipei City has developed startup policies and platforms to support entrepreneurs, and innovative technology is increasingly being used to benefit schools and permeating residents' daily life and businesses. The government is expanding convenient technological services across the city and promoting smart lifestyles.

CooC AI Makes Self-Directed Learning Easier!

Riding the wave of digital learning, the Taipei City Department of Education comprehensively upgraded the Taipei CooC Cloud-CooC Artificial Intelligence (AI) Learning System in 2024, optimizing the AI speaking practice function launched in 2023. In addition to meeting the teaching and learning needs of students, teachers, and parents, the system is able to guide students in using technology for self-directed learning anytime and anywhere, creating unlimited learning possibilities and promoting smart teaching. By the end of 2024, 248 workshops on the CooC AI Learning System had been held that trained 7,220 teachers. Additionally, the system had released 173 municipal curriculum packages and accumulated more than 210,000 users. On average, more than 700 people explore new topics through the CooC AI Learning

System each day, participating in personalized and fun smart learning.

Perfect Teammate for Teachers and Learning Superpower for Students

Many students learn English from a young age but feel nervous when speaking, and many consider writing in English even more challenging! To increase learning efficiency, provide diverse composition practice opportunities, and reduce teacher workload, a new AI optical character recognition function was added to the CooC AI Learning System in 2024. This function allows students to practice composition by handwriting text on paper and uploading photos of the paper or by directly inputting text. An AI generative adversarial network function was also added to help teachers flexibly create questions using different difficulty levels, question types, keywords, and other conditions. This function improves the quality and efficiency of question creation and enables teachers to precisely monitor students' learning progress, which reduces the pressure on teachers. Analysis revealed considerably improved learning outcomes among students participating in AI learning. This innovative technology both helps students learn and makes teaching easier for instructors. Lee Qing-qi, a teacher at Zhiqing Elementary School, said, "Even though a teacher must still have an eagle eye, the AI essay grading function makes grading so much easier! It helps us quickly review student writing in detail, suggests corrections, reduces the grading workload, and improves student learning outcomes." In

the future, the Taipei City Government will continue to employ AI applications as a powerful learning assistant in the digital age with reference to feedback from teachers and students.

Entrepreneurship Is Not Just a Dream: The “Three Arrows of Startups” Initiative is Here!

Do you have a passion for entrepreneurship but face difficulties because of a lack of funds, talent acquisition, or market expansion? No need to lose hope: the Taipei City Government has made plans to support aspiring entrepreneurs.

In 2024, the Taipei City Government expanded and deepened its startup promotion strategy to provide comprehensive support for entrepreneurs, with a focus on three main axes: investment capital, talent pool, and market deals. To address funding needs, the government launched the Expanded Rewards and Subsidies Program. In September 2023, a “Themed Research and Development” category was added to the program on top of existing subsidy items, with the category indicating prioritization of green innovation and innovative AI applications. In 2024, through public-private partnership involving the government, venture capital, and angel investors to introduce an elite startup subsidies program, under which public-private partnerships help top startups expand into overseas markets. Approved applicants can receive subsidies of up to NT\$15 million. The first call for applications targeted the information and communications technology hardware and software and biotechnology and medical sectors. As of 2024, 52 projects have been approved for these new categories, and they have received NT\$123.7 million in subsidies. The subsidy program provides financial support for startup teams,

enabling products to successfully enter the market.

Funding alone is not sufficient to ensure successful entrepreneurship—talent is also crucial. Considering this, the Taipei City Government has begun to offer introductory and advanced entrepreneurship courses tailored to startup teams at different stages, with the courses covering essential information for early-stage startups and connecting already successful startups with venture capital. Campus entrepreneurship camps have also been organized in cooperation with academic institutions, including National Chengchi University, National Taipei University of Technology, and Tatung University. These camps teach graduating students with entrepreneurial aspirations how to write business plans and investment pitches, enabling them to transform what were once classroom projects into potential ventures capable of attracting investment attention. This training enables students to cultivate their entrepreneurial dreams during their time on campus and adequately prepare for future career development. This program is a key achievement of the Taipei City Government’s expansion of entrepreneurial services to campuses. Additionally, during the 2024 TRENDY TAIPEI event, the Taipei City Government organized the first StartSphere Taipei startup showcase, which had the theme “Today’s Tech, Tomorrow’s Trends.” More than 20 international venture capital firms, unicorns, multinational AI startups, and international media founders from 8 countries were invited to attend, and more than 760 people participated in the event.

Once funding and talent are sufficient, market access becomes the key to entrepreneurial success. To help startup teams expand their markets internationally, the Taipei City Government launched the entrepreneur visa in 2024, connecting 21 cities

across 10 countries and building bridges for cross-border startup development, which has helped quality products reach the world. Additionally, the TOPS Taipei-Origin Promotional Station was launched to help enterprises meet government and corporate procurement needs. Within just 4 months, the station had facilitated transactions worth NT\$41.26 million. Going forward, the government hopes that the TOPS platform will help more startup products reach government agencies and large enterprises, with this increasing revenue and cooperation opportunities. From funding subsidies and talent cultivation to market expansion, the Taipei City Government has provided comprehensive support to entrepreneurs, helping startups scale up and accelerating internationalization. These efforts have provided a solid foundation for domestic and international talent, enabling them to realize their entrepreneurial dreams in Taipei.

New Smart Customer Service Experience—AI Assistance for the 1999 Hotline!

“Hello, this is 1999 Taipei Citizen Hotline. How may I help you?” In the past, operators of the Taipei City Government’s 1999 hotline worried about missing important information or felt pressure when they couldn’t clearly hear residents’ concerns. Although operators consistently provided effective and convenient services, their work efficiency was somewhat limited.

In 2024, the Taipei City Government’s Research, Development, and Evaluation Commission and Department of Information Technology jointly launched the “Enhancing 1999 Taipei Citizen Hotline through Real-time Speech-to-text Technology and AI-integrated

FAQs.” PoC. Through this PoC, AI technology was applied to accurately records citizens’ calls, enabling operators to listen attentively and respond quickly to callers’ needs, which has eased long-standing operational pain points and personalized the overall service experience.

Empirical evidence indicates that through the use of AI, call content can be instantly converted to text with approximately 90% recognition accuracy. For common questions, the AI assistant can provide reference answers to operators, which can narrow the experience gap between junior and senior staff. Additionally, the system automatically flags emergency cases and popular keyword prompts, elevating the service quality of the 1999 hotline and positioning it as a global model for smart cities everywhere.

2024 Taipei AI-Driven Smart City—Bursting with Futuristic Vibes

To remain at the forefront of rapid AI technology development, the Taipei City Government issued the Guidelines for the Use of Generative AI in 2024, with these directives applicable to the city government and all affiliate agencies. These guidelines provide clear principles, operational processes, and verification mechanisms for AI use, document covers information regarding AI architecture, nine application scenarios, four risk levels, six responsibility principles, and four legal compliance requirements. They ensure efficient and safe AI technology use in municipal operations, allowing residents to confidently enjoy the convenience of using upgraded smart technology services.

In 2024, the Taipei City Government launched the first Taipei Generative Art Festival, in which advanced AI technology was used to create and interpret contemporary art representing diverse cultures. This festival included across different age groups — from middle school students to retired teachers, enabling them to recognize and understand the uniqueness of generative art. The older participants shared that they felt a sense of achievement from cocreating art with young people and enjoyed the novelty of engaging with AI technology. This event successfully showcased the modernity of Taipei City, where intelligent technology and the public harmoniously coexist.

Understanding Innovation, Open-Source Technology, and Applications: Making a Difference as a Smart City

Want to quickly become integrated into Taipei life? The Taipei City Dashboard provides clear information on the city at a glance. This intuitive visualization platform consolidates key data on the MRT, traffic, shared bicycles, urban planning, and more. As of 2024, Taipei City has made over 2,800 datasets available on the dashboard, allowing users to understand the city's dynamics in real time and enabling municipal agencies to work more precisely and efficiently.

To promote exchange between the Taipei City Government and private developers, the Department of Information Technology organized two Taipei Codefest Hackathons in 2024, during which programming experts congregated to jointly develop convenient, resident-centered digital services

to meet residents' daily needs. At the same time, the Taipei City Dashboard Open-Source Project was launched to promote service orientation throughout the government. This initiative supports open-source technology access and integrates these technologies gradually into municipal services to reduce costs and improve operational efficiency. This debut project has won the Digital Innovation Value-Added Government Service Award. As with the Taipei City Dashboard Open-Source Project, the open-source service architecture of the TaipeiPASS app has gradually been shared with development supporting other local governments in selecting applicable features to create city-specific apps. With a focus on the core principles of cocreation and mutual benefits, the Taipei City Government is committed to promoting open-source projects and hopes to optimize the service quality of the TaipeiPASS information system to realize its vision of a smart city that provides convenient benefits to all residents.

Through its continual groundbreaking initiatives, Taipei City has achieved promising results in offering digital services, promoting open-source cooperation, and demonstrating exceptional smart city capabilities on the global stage. In the 2024 Global Smart City Index published by the International Institute for Management Development in Lausanne, Switzerland, Taipei City was ranked 16th among 142 cities. This achievement highlights the Taipei City Government's efforts to promote smart city development, demonstrating to the world that Taipei City holds a leading position in digital governance and innovation.

Special Report 7 Eternal Vision Toward Net-Zero

To achieve its 2050 net-zero emissions goal, Taipei City has launched a comprehensive net-zero transformation initiative! The government has employed policies, resources, and innovation to encourage public participation in electricity-saving prize draws, subsidize energy-efficient equipment replacements for residences and businesses, promote green transportation and recycling mechanisms, establish a Sustainability Talent Academy, and issue TPEx Sustainable Bonds, contributing to the development of a low-carbon, sustainable city. These initiatives enable all of Taipei's citizens to participate in energy conservation and carbon reduction through diverse programs and to work together to improve Taipei's future!

A Net-Zero Million-Dollar Prize Awaits, With Net-Zero Starting With Individuals

Did you know that saving electricity can earn you prize money? To advance its 2050 net-zero emissions goal, Taipei City launched the "Power Down for Net Zero: Save 3%, Win Big!" campaign, encouraging citizens to contribute to emission reduction in their daily life. Citizens who reduce their household electricity usage by 3% compared with the same period in the previous year have the chance to win prizes of NT\$30,000 to NT\$100,000!

In 2024, more than 12,000 households participated in the energy-saving activity, with this generating total electricity savings of 2.94 million kWh throughout the year, which is equivalent to a 1,450-ton reduction in carbon emissions. In addition, the Neihu District government invited citizens to register using their electricity bills on-site at the Dragon Boat Festival, providing them with small gifts when they did so. This demonstrates Taipei's city-wide unity in gradually developing electricity-saving habits.

"I'm a tenant, does that mean I can't apply for the electricity-saving program?" Tenants can still participate as long as they obtain a consent form from their landlord. For residents of social housing, a stamp from the building's management committee on the consent form will suffice. Moving forward, the program will also be integrated with community festivals and other diverse channels to broaden public participation—ensuring that "net-zero" is not a mere buzzword; it is a principle integrated into citizens' daily lives.

Encouraging Active Engagement in Net-Zero and Green Energy Development

To promote a transition toward net-zero lifestyles, the Taipei City Government launched the 2024 Taipei City Residential Community and Group Energy Generation, Storage, and Conservation Subsidy Plan, expanding eligibility to include groups and adding new subsidy items, with the new plan including elevator energy regeneration devices and floor-standing air conditioners. This plan encourages homeowners and communities to install solar panels, energy-saving equipment, window insulation film, and equipment for generating self-sufficient green energy. In 2024, subsidies were provided for energy generation, storage, and conservation equipment in 11 residence buildings, 3 communities, and 18 groups. Additionally, window insulation film subsidies were provided to 1,701 residences, and 236 low-income households were assisted in obtaining energy-efficient refrigerators and air conditioners. Estimates indicate

that these efforts will save approximately 1.58 million kWh of electricity annually, reducing carbon emissions by approximately 780 tons.

Subsidies are provided for more than just residential costs; they also include support for social welfare and religious organization in the city. For example, the Taipei Private Aiai Nursing Home replaced old air conditioners with subsidized units, which enabled them to save on electricity bills and improved residents' quality of life, and Hulu Temple installed energy-efficient air conditioners, creating a more comfortable, low-carbon environment in which devotees can gather. The Taipei City Government has also held information sessions to help citizens understand that achieving a net-zero lifestyle is easier than they think—even replacing an air conditioner or applying a window film can change the city's future.

Encouraging Energy Conservation Among Businesses: Save Electricity, Save Money, and Reduce Carbon Emissions!

Electricity costs are steadily rising, and many businesses are experiencing financial pressure. In response to this, the Taipei City Government has subsidized 1,484 applications under the Service Industry Energy-Saving Equipment Subsidy Program. For example, a coffee shop in Neihu District saved NT\$2,000 per month on electricity bills after replacing its air conditioners; these savings are equivalent to 6 months of Internet fees. A bank in Zhongshan District replaced old equipment with LED lighting fixtures and high-efficiency air conditioners, saving NT\$190,000 in annual electricity costs and becoming an energy conservation benchmark. A dessert shop owner said, "I

was initially worried about the complicated application process, but I later learned that the process was very simple and that assistance was readily available. Since we installed air curtains and circulation fans, we have saved 6,000 kWh of electricity annually, which is equal to NT\$20,000 in electricity bills. The environment is more comfortable, and customers are very satisfied!"

The Taipei City Government understands that energy conservation and carbon reduction are not only environmental trends but also have potential to substantially economically benefit the service industry and improve business competitiveness. Therefore, the Taipei City Government has established an 0800 consultation hotline and an electricity-saving office to clarify subsidy regulations for the public and promote the Service Industry Energy-Saving Equipment Subsidy Program. By 2024, awarded subsidies had reached NT\$167 million, and the government plans on expanding subsidy payments in the future to benefit more businesses. Small and medium enterprises registered in Taipei can feel free to call the free consultation phone number 0800-580-037 to ensure business and the government can work together to achieve energy conservation and carbon reduction and create business opportunities.

Taipei Net-Zero 101 Project: Let's Protect the Environment Together!

Carbon reduction isn't just a buzzword! The Taipei City Government and Taipei Chamber of Commerce have jointly launched the Taipei Net-Zero 101 Project, aiming to establish 101 net-zero emission demonstration sites within 3 years. The community can participate by incorporating green habits into daily life.

What is Taipei Net-Zero 101 Project?



Solar panels and energy storage systems have been installed in Longshan Temple. They generate an estimated 5,900 kWh of electricity annually, reducing carbon emissions by 3,000 kilograms. In addition, the University of Taipei, super markets, and other organizations have installed smart machines through which visitors can earn EasyCard value by recycling PET bottles, aluminum cans, and waste batteries, which is an environmentally friendly and practical system. Wanhua Commercial District organized recycling activities for used clothing to encourage recycling and reduce waste. Furthermore, Zhoumei Village in Neihu District installed smart recycling machines in which children can deposit bottles to earn pocket money, promoting environmental habits from an early age.

Every change in daily life requires participation of all of Taipei's citizens! Let's start with small daily actions to create a sustainable and livable future for Taipei!

Prize Draws for Carbon Reduction: Encouraging Collective Environmental Protection

Will you keep pace in the era of personal "carbon value"? In 2024, the pioneering "My Carbon Reduction Passbook" in Taipei City gained wide recognition and led four northern cities of Taiwan to jointly launch the Keelung, Taipei, New Taipei, and Taoyuan "My Carbon Reduction Passbook" Public Movement. The transportation modes covered under this program include buses, mass rapid transit (MRT), YouBike, Taiwan Railway, highway buses, and national highway buses across the four regions. The program has more than 330,000 participants and an accumulated carbon reduction of 40,000 tons.

The "My Carbon Reduction Passbook" platform records the carbon reduction achievements of Taipei residents. A resident can calculate and register their carbon reduction on the dedicated platform or app through the world's first electronic ticket carbon inventory system (Easy Wallet), as indicated by the British Standards Institution. Prizes are awarded through monthly, quota fulfillment, and Friday bonus lucky draws and through carbon reduction winner rankings. In 2024, Taipei City established additional model enterprises and carbon reduction response zones to expand its carbon reduction efforts, enabling individuals to develop environmentally friendly habits, businesses to demonstrate their sustainable values, and the government to promote the goal of carbon neutrality, creating a triple-win situation.



A forum on the My Carbon Reduction Passbook Public Movement brought the mayors of Keelung, Taipei, New Taipei, and Taoyuan cities and representatives from various sectors together to participate in this major initiative.

Upgrading Green Transportation for More Convenient Carbon Reduction

Have you used a YouBike today? In 2024, Taipei City adjusted its policy, making the first 30 minutes of every YouBike ride free, which has increased the convenience of going out, regardless of whether it is for school or shopping. By the end of 2024, 1,505 rental stations and over 20,000 bicycles were present throughout the city, and the daily bike usage exceeded 190,000 rides, making YouBike one of the world's largest public bicycle systems.

To ensure everyone can rent YouBike, the Taipei City Government has optimized YouBike deployment through big data analysis and led the nationwide introduction of a bike availability rate indicator, which clearly displays where bikes are available. This initiative has improved YouBike user experience and travel convenience, encouraging residents to choose YouBike as a green transportation method. Increasing YouBike use can reduce the city's carbon emissions, promoting the goal of 40% carbon reduction and a 70% green transportation usage rate by 2030.

Taipei City has also accelerated its promotion of electric buses equipped with high-tech safety systems, which have ensured quieter and smoother rides. By the end of 2024, 712 electric buses were in operation—the

highest number in Taiwan—ensuring passengers can enjoy safe and comfortable commutes.

Training Pioneers for Urban Net-Zero Transformation

Although you may not know it, the Taipei City Government is actively cultivating green expertise and promoting net-zero carbon reduction to bring urban sustainability benefits to Taipei citizens.

In 2024, the Taipei City Government established the Sustainability Talent Academy, which offered courses combining theory and practice. The academy enables learners to gain professional knowledge, boosts urban governance capabilities, and offers easily implementable practices for daily life. In the first academy session, 48 professional seed personnel were trained, among whom 12 traveled to Denmark to study and develop 9 sustainable action plans. The Taipei City Government also collaborated with the central government, schools, and businesses to hold workshops and seminars. Through its “zero-carbon iron triangle” of policies, regulations, and talent, Taipei is becoming a model low-carbon city!

The Taipei City Government also organized 37 courses on green living for nearly 2,000 civil servants, who reported satisfaction rates exceeding 90%. In addition, the Taipei e-Campus digital learning platform provides 25 digital self-learning courses, which have provided information to more than 78,252 learners over 130,000 learning hours. Thus, both government workers and citizens are working to create a sustainable future for Taipei, bolstering the city's hard and soft sustainability capabilities.

Pioneering Sustainable Bonds Program Aligned With International Standards

In 2024, the Taipei City Government led government agencies of all levels in issuing NT\$10 billion in Sustainable Bonds. These funds are designated for regional construction of convenient, environmentally friendly MRT infrastructure, which aligns with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals. This initiative can save the city treasury over NT\$70 million in interest expenses annually and therefore balances the goals of sustainability and fiscal benefits.

To achieve this milestone, Taipei City coordinated with the Taipei Exchange, explaining government budget characteristics and final accounting review processes to secure flexible issuance conditions for the public sector. These efforts led the Taipei Exchange to revise its regulations on sustainable bond issuance, enabling all levels of government to issue sustainable bonds. The city also invited relevant city government agencies, the Taipei Exchange, and the agent banks of local government treasuries to participate in collaborative efforts at multiple meetings and briefings.

The Taipei City Government continually promoted the program, overcoming various challenges, until it successfully issued the nation's first sustainable government bond in 2024. This milestone established a new model of diversified financial tools for local governments, creating a sustainable triple-win situation for the city, businesses, and citizens through positive social and environmental impacts.

Strengthening International Bonds and Showcasing Charm

Deepening International Exchange and Expanding Global Connections

Given the rapidly changing international landscape and the increasing demands for intercity exchanges, in 2024, Taipei City not only focused on municipal affairs but also established global connections on the international stage. City delegates visited numerous major international cities, participated in forums, and signed agreements. Within Taipei, officials warmly received distinguished guests from different countries, aligning the entire city with global trends and providing its citizens with diverse international perspectives and cooperation opportunities.

Smart Disaster Prevention: Sharing Taipei's Experience

When representatives of cities around the world gathered to discuss visions for the future, Taipei City did not miss the opportunity to join. In May 2024, Mayor Chiang Wan-an accepted the warm invitation of Tokyo Governor Koike Yuriko to attend the SusHi Tech Tokyo 2024 City Leaders Program with a delegation, joining leaders from more than 40 cities worldwide to discuss sustainability, smart technology, disaster prevention, and other pressing concerns.

Given the rich experience of Taipei City's leaders in dealing with earthquakes, Mayor Chiang Wan-an was invited to deliver a keynote speech titled "Building a Safe City through Innovation" at the "Safe City" forum following the opening ceremony. The mayor shared how, in the wake of the major earthquake on April 3, 2024, the Taipei City Government used the Disaster Response Cloud Collaboration Platform to rapidly integrate reporting, deploy resources, and

mitigate disaster damage. This approach embodies smart disaster prevention concepts, ensuring that an emergency operations center can be established wherever the mayor happens to be. In addition to participating in the forum, the city government team also visited Japan's Liberal Democratic Party Youth Division, the Tokyo Metropolitan Assembly, former Japanese Prime Minister Aso Taro, and numerous political figures, engaging in in-depth exchanges on topics such as disaster prevention, population aging, and declining birth rates to expand city diplomacy between Taiwan and Japan.

During this trip, the city government team made a special visit to Tokyo Dome, exchanging valuable experiences with dome staff on safety management and crisis response strategies for large-scale events and competitions. To encourage tourism, Mayor Chiang Wan-an attended Taiwan Festa at Tokyo Skytree, where he personally made oyster omelets and enthusiastically interacted with members of the public, promoting Taipei's cuisine and vivid night market culture. Osaka Governor Yoshimura Hirofumi personally visited Tokyo to meet with the Taipei City Government team, initiating cooperative dialogue on topics such as the joint

promotion of the 2025 World Masters Games in Taipei and New Taipei City and Expo 2025 Osaka Kansai and on tourism and cultural exchanges. This overseas visit combined technology, disaster prevention, tourism, and culture to facilitate fruitful international exchange.

In-Depth Exchange in the Eastern United States: Parallel Advancement of Democracy and Innovation

In September 2024, the Taipei City Government team and the city council delegation traveled to the east coast of the United States for an 11-day in-depth exchange with officials in major cities, including New York, Boston, Philadelphia, and New Jersey. These exchanges focused on four major axes—urban governance, industrial development, youth affairs, and smart applications—and emphasized Taipei's democratic values and international competitiveness.

During this trip, Mayor Chiang Wan-an and his delegation visited the New York City Department of City Planning and Department of Transportation to gain an in-depth understanding of New York's "City of Yes" housing policy, including its deregulation of land use zoning and promotion of transit-oriented development, to serve as a reference blueprint for Taipei's urban renewal and transportation planning.

To promote city diplomacy, Mayor Chiang Wan-an met with Mayor Michelle Wu of Boston, Taipei's sister city, reaffirming a shared vision of inclusive and friendly cities on both sides. Both cities will continue to engage in extensive exchanges on key concerns, including climate change, extreme weather, urban disaster response measures, and corporate innovation applications,

and deepen cooperation in additional fields such as education, health care, biotechnology, and cultural arts.

At the level of industrial innovation and smart applications, the Taipei City Government team visited multiple top-tier Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) laboratories, including the MIT Media Lab and the MIT Computer Science and Artificial Intelligence Laboratory, to explore smart city and artificial intelligence applications related to municipal administration. The delegation also signed a letter of intent for further cooperation on introducing advanced research systems, and institutions.

While in Massachusetts, Mayor Chiang Wan-an was invited to deliver a keynote speech titled "Global Taipei: Bridging Tradition and Innovation" at Harvard University's Kennedy School, and he answered questions from students. During his speech, the mayor emphasized inclusion and democracy as core values of Taipei, affirming that he will continue to lead Taipei forward with such conviction.

In Philadelphia, the Taipei City Government team visited the University of Pennsylvania's international affairs department Penn Global to promote the Taipei City Department for Youth internship program and discuss with the Wharton School mechanisms for selecting and sending high-level civil servants to study in the United States, seeking to promote bilateral talent mobility and knowledge exchange. This trip strengthened cooperative relationships between Taipei City and top-tier international academic institutions, establishing a solid foundation for the cultivation of talent with international perspectives.

Expanding International Networks and Implementing Institutional Cooperation

In addition to visits to major international cities, the Taipei City Government has established long-term institutionalized exchange channels with other cities through memorandums of understanding. On March 21, 2024, Deputy Mayor Lee Shu-Chuan represented the Taipei City Government in signing a memorandum of understanding with Guatemala City Deputy Mayor Víctor Manuel Alejandro Martínez Ruiz covering key areas such as urban planning, water resources, waste management, and smart transportation.

This agreement facilitates mutual exchange between Taipei City and Guatemala City, prompting both cities to learn from each other's urban sustainable development experiences, practice mutual assistance, and improve substantive relations. The director of Guatemala City's Urban Mobility Department, Eddy Leonel Morataya Ortiz, highly praised Taipei's mass rapid transit system and transportation infrastructure, outlining plans to construct Guatemala City's first subway line and expressing a hope to reference Taipei's experience in creating a convenient and livable city.

Deepening City Diplomacy and Cultivating International Networks

Did you know that in 2024, Taipei City welcomed two new international partners? These partners were Kingstown (Saint Vincent and the Grenadines) and Matsuyama City (Ehime Prefecture, Japan).

In February, officials from Matsuyama City collaborated with the Taipei City Government's Department of Information and Tourism and with artist Ninagawa Mika to hold the "Afterglow: Light and Shadow of Life" photography exhibition at Songshan

Cultural and Creative Park. This activity commemorated the 10th anniversary of the friendly exchange agreement between the two cities. On October 11, both cities signed an additional "Friendship City" agreement, incorporating cooperation on startup industries, youth exchange, and environmental sustainability. This agreement symbolizes that the relationship between both cities has entered a new stage.

On May 21, Prime Minister Ralph E. Gonsalves of Saint Vincent and the Grenadines personally visited Taiwan to witness the establishment of sister city relations between Taipei City and Kingstown, marking the first sister city of Taipei formally established since Mayor Chiang Wan-an took office and laying the foundation for further diplomatic exchange between Taipei City and Central and South America.



With Prime Minister Ralph E. Gonsalves of Saint Vincent and the Grenadines as a witness, Mayor Chiang Wan-an, Andrea Bowman (Ambassador of Saint Vincent and the Grenadines to Taiwan), Tai Hsi-chin (Taipei City Council Speaker), and Shackell Bobb (Senator of Saint Vincent and the Grenadines) signed a joint statement establishing sister city relations between Taipei City and Kingstown.

Bringing the World to Taipei through Diverse Exchanges

In addition to actively sending out international delegations, Taipei City also warmly welcomes international guests. In 2024, the Taipei City Government received 56 delegations of approximately 707 guests

from various countries around the world, enabling international visitors to gain an in-depth understanding of Taipei through site visits and exchanges. In February, Tokyo Governor Koike Yuriko visited Taipei to discuss disaster prevention, population countermeasures, and sustainable development with Mayor Chiang Wan-an. Additionally, the governor discussed cooperation on sports events, such as the Tokyo 2025 Deaflympics and the World Masters Games in Taipei and New Taipei City, and visited the Taipei City Government's Emergency Operations Center, gaining a deep impression of Taipei's disaster preparedness. In May, Prime Minister Ralph E. Gonsalves of Saint Vincent and the Grenadines led a delegation to Taiwan to attend the sister city signing ceremony. Both sides look forward to further cultural, educational, and infrastructural cooperation in the future. In July, Brenson Wase, Speaker of the Nitijela of the Republic of the Marshall Islands, visited Taipei to review prior bilateral achievements and anticipate future exchanges. Vice Chairman of the French Senate Foreign Affairs, Defense, and Armed Forces Committee Olivier Cadic visited the Taipei City Government to exchange views with Mayor Chiang Wan-an on education and various other municipal concerns.

In 2024, the 16th CityNet Disaster Cluster Seminar was held in Taipei City, bringing together city representatives and experts from 13 Asian countries to discuss the theme of people-centered resilient cities and visit Taipei City's disaster prevention facilities and essential infrastructure, enabling participants to experience Taipei's disaster prevention and urban planning capabilities.

Taipei × Shanghai: Pragmatic Cross-Strait City Exchange

On December 17, 2024, the Taipei-Shanghai City Forum, the year's foremost cross-strait exchange platform, was held. The theme of this forum was "Smart Governance, Sustainable Future." In-depth discussions were held on three major topics: friendly transportation, river governance, and human-centered cities. During the forum, both sides signed two cooperative memorandums to share city governance experiences: "Taipei-Shanghai Cooperation on Promoting Smart Healthcare" and "Cooperation between Taipei Zoo and Shanghai Zoo on Red Panda Species Exchange and Conservation."

Taipei and Shanghai engage in multifield exchanges for mutual benefits and prosperity through the Taipei-Shanghai City Forum. In the 2024 forum, Mayor Chiang Wan-an emphasized that "when relations between Taipei and Shanghai are good, cross-strait relations are good." The mayor also suggested that "more dialogue and less confrontation" should be prioritized on both sides of the strait, noting that continued pragmatic exchanges between cross-strait cities can improve the welfare of citizens on both sides.

In 2024, Taipei City made active strides on the global stage, both expanding partnerships and implementing strategies aimed at increasing international visibility. The Taipei City Government successfully expanded Taipei's international presence through multiple international itineraries. In the future, Taipei will continue to deepen its connections with global cities grounded in democracy, diversity, and innovation, advancing toward a more open, smart, and sustainable vision for the city. These efforts will allow city residents to experience substantive changes and allow the world to recognize Taipei's stories and capabilities.

Evolution of Safety Protection

Smart Fleet Management System: Helping our Heroic Firefighters Work with Precision


When fire truck sirens echo through Taipei's streets, citizens witness our city's heroes in red rushing through alleys to the emergency scene, with everyone on edge. Today's firefighting teams differ from their predecessors by relying not only on professional training and response capabilities but also on cutting-edge smart support systems as backup.

In 2024, Taipei City Fire Department promoted Fire Department Smart Fleet Management System, incorporating Internet of Things (IoT) technology and big data analytics to comprehensively upgrade fire and ambulance vehicle management. Fire vehicles are equipped with systems that enhance the driver's vision, monitor the driver's physiological state, and transmit real-time disaster scene images to command centers. Using 360° panoramic cameras and remote operation functions, frontline firefighters can relay footage of the scene to Taipei City Fire Department's Emergency Dispatch Center, enabling commanders to rapidly assess the situation and precisely allocate appropriate personnel and vehicle resources.

This system not only enhances vehicle dispatch efficiency and emergency response precision but also establishes a foundation for intelligent emergency response. Taipei City Fire Department will continue expanding its systems' functions toward city-wide fleet digital integration and smart operations, creating a safer, more rapid, and more effective firefighting service network for citizens.

Video Communication and Collaboration Platform: Faster Rescue Operations

In 2024, the Taipei City Fire Department launched its "119 Video Platform," integrating high technology into emergency reporting processes and transforming traditional reporting methods. When citizens call 119 to report an emergency, the Emergency Dispatch Center can send a link to the caller via text message to start a real-time video call, helping dispatchers rapidly assess the situation. During a video call, dispatchers can

guide citizens to safety or provide first aid instructions and use visual information to assess emergencies, accelerate dispatch decisions, and enhance the precision of resource allocation. This video reporting mechanism enhances efficiency and provides trapped citizens with immediate response and reassurance during crises, strengthening their confidence in public safety.

Eliminating Fire Safety Hazards in High-Rise Buildings

Because of the high density of high-rise buildings in Taipei's metropolitan area, fires are life-threatening and fire rescue is difficult. To eliminate hazards and ensure residential safety, the Taipei City Fire Department has learned from major fire incidents, thoroughly inspected the city's high-rise buildings, and strengthened fire-equipment inspection systems. By the end of 2024, 924 high-rise buildings had been managed, and inspections of 593 apartment complexes and 326 residential units had been completed. The inspection results revealed only 17 apartment complexes with noncompliant fire equipment; these complexes have been placed under continued supervision with mandated improvement deadlines.

The Fire Department maintains ongoing management, regular inspections, and accountability reporting systems to strengthen fire prevention and response capabilities in high-risk buildings. Each on-

site inspection protects citizens' lives and property; implementing these practical systems and tracking accountability enables Taipei residents to live safely in high-rise buildings and sleep peacefully at night.

Critical Illness Integration System: Racing Against Time to Save Lives

Firefighting professionals require basic medical knowledge as they race against time to save lives, especially when they encounter individuals experiencing myocardial infarction, acute stroke, or other critical conditions where prompt emergency treatment is a matter of life and death.

The critical illness integration system is the Taipei City Fire Department's innovative smart medical initiative to enhance emergency care efficiency and patient survival rates. Previously, paperwork for emergency procedures was bottlenecked by patchy and duplicate data and the need for manual data entry. The new critical illness integration system integrates information regarding critical conditions such as out-of-hospital cardiac arrest, stroke, major trauma,

and myocardial infarction, reducing input errors and seamlessly connecting with hospital systems to ensure timely and complete data. The system also combines CPR + AED teaching platforms, critical care apps, and prehospital dashboards, enabling emergency personnel to upload patient information in real-time and hospitals to prepare for incoming survivors. In 2024, the department introduced Bluetooth monitoring equipment and enhanced their data analytics capability, reducing frontline workload and freeing precious time for rescuing patients. These efforts transformed emergency response from a difficult race against time into an efficient and precise system to protect citizens.

Smart System Upgrades: Enhanced Technology for Comprehensive Protection

Taipei City Fire Department continues to strengthen its smart disaster prevention planning by introducing drones, sensing equipment, and advanced technologies to expand the city's real-time precision in disaster monitoring and response. Through technological equipment upgrades and integration, information from sudden street fires, smoke in enclosed spaces, or high-rise fires can be transmitted in real-time to assist command decisions and enhance deployment efficiency. These "invisible wings" of the city provide frontline personnel with enhanced support and comprehensively improve Taipei's disaster prevention system from early warning through response to recovery. The Fire Department will continue integrating advanced technologies to enhance real-time monitoring and response capabilities for various risks, remaining dedicated to creating a truly safe smart city where citizens can live with peace of mind.

Riverside Rebirth: A Perfect Harmony of Ecology, Greenery, and Human Life

The once cold concrete embankment of Zhinan Stream has been transformed through the Jingmei and Zhinan Stream Confluence Embankment Reconstruction Project into a vibrant river teeming with life and greenery. This river now pulses with rhythms in nature—with alternating pools, riffles, and shoals creating habitats for wildlife. Crab-eating mongooses and Taiwanese blue magpies roam freely through these rejuvenated waters, and local residents and visitors alike can experience these reborn natural spaces. From mesh-vegetation slope protection to stake-and-wattle revetments, every design detail was formulated with ecological protection in mind. Even demolished concrete was recycled to reduce carbon emissions. This project represents a rebirth marked by not only engineering sophistication but also ecological harmony. The new riverside walkway connects BeiZheng Junior High School and the National Chengchi University campus. After the transformation, one need not traverse the campus grounds to experience the natural scenery, and residents can directly bask in and live alongside nature.

Guandu Wharf Container Market: Cultural Convergence Along the Riverside

The 2024 opening of Guandu Wharf Container

Market transformed this flood prevention area into a leisure paradise for citizens. Visitors now enjoy not only the glistening water but also 14 international food stalls offering a global culinary journey.

For visitors, Guandu Wharf offers delicious food, a relaxed atmosphere, and an intuitive array of recreational options. Around the light dining area, YouBike 2.0 stations and motorcycle parking are available, shuttle buses and public transport services have been expanded, and river transportation between Guandu and Dadaocheng is offered in partnership with shipping operators. As part of the new waterway service, visitors can take boat rides, enjoy rivers, and explore attractions such as Guandu Temple and Beitou Hot Springs.

Taipei City Government continues to transform waterfront spaces from flood prevention facilities into leisure areas with water accessibility and friendly environments. Moreover, the government has prioritized ecological sustainability by installing underground cables and advanced sewage facilities around the container market, ensuring a harmonious coexistence between nature and the market. Through this project, the waterfront has been revitalized and previously quiet flood prevention areas have been transformed into areas where citizens and tourists can enjoy the pleasures of life at their own pace.

Taipei Riverside Flower Fields: A Romantic Canvas of Colorful Seasons

Taipei's riverside remained colorful and vibrant in 2024, changing its appearance with the seasons like an old masters painting. On holidays, people leisurely push strollers as they enjoy the flowers. Riverside parks have become the favorite places for citizens to relax on the weekend and connect with nature.

The 10,000-square-meter autumn golden flower field in Dajia Riverside Park and the riverside flower field underneath Zhoumei Bridge continued to show off their beauty. In 2024, Meiti riverside flower field added approximately 4,600 square meters of cosmos bipinnatus near the softball field, transforming the area into a distinctive space for wildflowers. Yanping riverside was decorated with dandelion and reed light installations at night, adding warm colors to cold winter; and Guting riverside flower field created a countryside atmosphere with its sailboat viewing platform. Flower field designs in 2024 were more diverse and refined than ever, integrating art installations with modern landscape design to deliver striking visuals and emotional resonance. Every corner was filled with creativity and surprises, rendering the city vibrant and colorful.

Taipei Water Dance Festival: A Brilliant Urban Night Spectacle

When Rainbow Bridge was transformed into an art installation, the 2024 Taipei Water Dance Festival themed Water Radiance and Rainbow Shadows at Xikou Wharf became the most dazzling nighttime city event. Notably, the bridge's water show was the first of its type in Taiwan, turning Rainbow Bridge into a stellar attraction.

This water dance festival connected popular attractions such as the Raohe St. Night Market, Wufenpu Shopping District, and Songshan Ciyou Temple. Combined with the 2024 Xikou Festival, singles matchmaking events, a Pet Summer Party, and on the closing day of the festival, young bands were invited to perform live on-site as part of the closing performance. The festival attracted more than 790,000 participants and generated NT\$900 million in tourism.

As water jets fell from Rainbow Bridge and lights flickered to the rhythms of the music, audiences immersed themselves in the spectacular audiovisual feast. Behind the event's 96.6% satisfaction rate were the Taipei City Government's substantial efforts. This inaugural water dance festival faced numerous challenges, including insufficient Keelung River water levels and river obstacles requiring removal. These difficulties were resolved through multiple cross-departmental efforts and inspections conducted by the Department of Information and Tourism, enabling Taipei's Rainbow Bridge to shine again and boosting the surrounding businesses as tourists and citizens experienced Taipei's multifaceted charm through a waterside atmosphere.

Enhancing Resilience through Efficient Water Management and Conservation

Perfecting Water Supply Networks, Moving Toward a Sustainable City

To continue its steady advance toward sustainable development, the Taipei City Government has actively strengthened its water supply system by making reducing leakage rates a key objective. Following International Water Association recommendations, the city continues to promote management measures such as replacing aging pipelines, engaging in proactive leak control, managing water pressure, and improving leak repair efficiency and quality. By the end of 2024, 2,770 km of old pipelines were successfully replaced, meeting original targets and exceeding the international recommended annual replacement rate of 1.5%. The leakage rate decreased from 26.99% at the end of 2005 to 10.27% by the end of 2024, with annual leak incidents declining from 11,283 to 2,156 cases. Road excavation frequency decreased by more than 80%, and daily average water distribution was reduced by approximately 579,000 tons, saving water resources that can support central water resource scheduling

policies and effectively provide cross-regional support during drought conditions. The Taipei Water Department currently manages a supply network exceeding 6,000 km in total length. By steadily and systematically addressing water pipeline leakage issues, the government has achieved substantial results. In August 2024, the Taipei City Government received the "Most Outstanding Climate Smart Utility Award" at the IWA World Water Congress in Toronto, Canada, as well as the Silver and Bronze Awards at the Taiwan Institute for Sustainable Energy's "2024 Taiwan Sustainability Action Awards," in recognition of its significant achievements. In July of 2024, Taipei City Government won the Special Achievement in GIS Award in San Diego, CA, USA. Looking ahead, the city will continue focusing on high-leakage areas, concentrating construction resources on improvements to make Taipei a sustainable city with water security and intelligent management.

Feitsui Raw Water Supply Tunnel Project Goes Online to Strengthen the Defense of Greater Taipei's Water Supply

Taipei residents depend on the Taipei Water Department for their daily water supply. The Water Department supplies more than 2 million tons of water daily and serves approximately 6 million people. Although the primary water source remains the Xindian

River, the increasing frequency of climate change and extreme weather have revealed the risks of relying on a single water source. Raw water turbidity often increases sharply during typhoons or heavy rainfall, straining water purification efforts.

To enhance supply flexibility and safety, the Taipei Water Department launched the Feitsui Raw Water Supply Tunnel Project, adding an intake at the downstream of Feitsui Reservoir in Beishi River and constructing a new 2.8 km raw water tunnel. When Nanshi River water quality fluctuates, the system can switch to the cleaner Beishi River, providing a stable 2.7 million tons of water daily to Taipei City residents.

During the tunnel construction process, the team faced technical challenges such as collapses and water inrush caused by hard rock formations and fault zones. After multiple expert discussions, countermeasures including larger construction equipment and presplit hole designs were implemented. Then the water trunk was completed and operated in June 2024. During three typhoon periods, the system successfully provided 12.94 million tons of low-turbidity raw water, saving NT\$16.72 million in water treatment costs. This project not only strengthens the Taipei Water Department's backup capabilities but also supports the Water Resources Agency, the Ministry of Economic Affairs' water supply to the Banxin area, effectively enhancing water supply resilience throughout the Greater Taipei region and adding a solid defense line against drought and disasters.

Combining Green Infrastructure with New Urban Living

As climate change intensifies, Taipei City Government is actively addressing urban heat island effects and accelerating the pace of urban greening. By the end of 2024, 1,831 hectares of parks and green spaces had been developed, with beautification projects on 17 roads. As Taipei's greening initiative has progressed, many citizens have discovered healing green areas on their commutes that have transformed gray streets into lush spaces bursting with color and life.

In sidewalks, parks, plazas, and other public spaces, permeable pavement that breathes and can absorb runoff has been quietly installed. By absorbing water on rainy days and releasing it through evaporation on sunny days, it helps create a more comfortable walking environment. In 2024 alone, newly added pavement exceeded 35,000 square meters, with citywide cumulative coverage reaching 408,079 square meters.

Everyone must do their part to support Taipei's greening efforts. The Taipei Garden City Program extends from the public sector to private enterprises, encouraging people to create their own green spaces using rooftops and walls. By 2024, approximately 214,634 square meters of green area had been created.

Through these practical actions, Taipei City has effectively increased its adaptability to climate change and created more pleasant urban landscapes and healthier living environments. Observe the green corners around you next time you are out— you may discover that Taipei is becoming an increasingly pleasant city to live in!

Nurturing Future Generations, Fostering Hope

Loving and Safe Temporary Childcare: A Pillar of Support for Parents

Many parents juggle work and family and struggle with taking care of their child. In particular, many find it hard to take time off when unexpected situations arise. To reduce parenting pressure, Taipei promotes child-friendly temporary childcare services. By 2024, 21 locations had been established that covered almost all city administrative districts and enabled parents to seek assistance near their work or homes. In addition to providing professional care, these services offer fun parenting classes and parent-child activities that enable children to learn in a pleasant environment. A parent shared their first-hand experience: caregivers established trust through various soothing methods when their child was emotionally unstable because of language barriers and unfamiliar surroundings. Over time, the child gradually adapted, progressing from separation anxiety to saying goodbye to mom and holding the teacher's hand to happily enter the classroom and explore the world. Additionally, the pioneering Parenting Friendly Enterprise Award of 2024 recognized businesses that provide parenting support in the workplace, selecting friendly business units on the basis of six childcare indicators to make Taipei a livable city through family-friendly childcare and work-life balance.

Taipei also pioneered the Daycare Center from 10:30 AM to 10:00 PM to meet the childcare needs of parents with 0-2-year-olds, offering innovative childcare services Monday through Friday from 10:30 AM to 10:00 PM. In 2024, after four children enrolled, parents generally provided positive feedback to the program, especially one mother of twins who noted that this program resolved her childcare problem arising from her late work schedule. To enhance the quality of childcare, Taipei City Government also offers salary subsidies for caregivers, hires evening security, and uses media promotion to expand awareness and resolve parents' childcare difficulties.

Increased Subsidies and Expanded Facilities Make Parenting Easier

"My children's tuition is too expensive!" is a common sentiment among parents, with private kindergarten tuition posing a challenge to numerous families.

In response, the Taipei City Government has launched a series of childcare subsidies and preferential policies to reduce parents' burdens. From the "Baby I Love You" program for 2-4-year-olds with maximum subsidies of NT\$26,000 per semester, to the "Helping You With Pregnancy" education subsidy for 5-year-olds offering NT\$2,543 to NT\$12,543 per semester, these programs greatly ease the strain on family budgets.

Beyond subsidy policies, Taipei has launched the Taipei Quasi-Public Kindergarten 3.0 initiative, encouraging quality private kindergartens to join the quasi-public system and improving teacher compensation. In the 2024 academic year, 172 private kindergartens benefited, and by the 2025 academic year, Taipei City Government increased funding to partner schools to NT\$17,660, providing more stable educational environments of increased quality. The city also pioneered its Partial Salary Increase and Operation Subsidy Program, supporting kindergartens comprehensively from staffing and facilities to employee benefits. In 2024, 119 kindergartens received subsidies totaling NT\$46 million, strengthening overall operational quality.

To further expand service capacity, Taipei continues to add kindergarten classes. The 2024 academic year saw the addition of 21 public and nonprofit kindergarten classes that provided more than 500 enrollment opportunities. Additionally, special classes for 2-year-olds are offered that truly meet citizen needs, enabling children to grow happily as their parents work with peace of mind.



Sustainable Smart Campuses: Green Learning Environments

Imagine children attending schools that aren't just classrooms and blackboards, but green, smart, and sustainable campuses. From nurturing every step of children's growth to inspiring imagination in every lesson, Taipei is accelerating the pace of school building reconstruction, incorporating United Nations Sustainable Development Goals concepts to create next-generation green campuses with safer, more environmentally friendly, and more interesting learning spaces. Neihu Elementary School's new Xiao-Ti Building exemplifies this approach. Opened in November 2024, it earned Diamond-level green building certification and features solar panels and rooftop gardens. The Xiao-Ti Building has become Taipei's benchmark for green campuses in every aspect from energy conservation to water resource stewardship.

Looking ahead, the Taipei City Government will continue allocating funds to school renovations, planning NT\$4 billion annually until 2030 to promote 30 school reconstruction projects. All projects strive for gold level green building certification and are designed with student learning as a central component to create healthy, green next-generation campuses.

Cross-Era Technology and Smart Vocational Education Innovation Models

Cross-era models are a focus of Taipei's educational development. The nation's first Taipei STEAM and New Technology Development Office officially launched on March 18, 2024, beginning a cross-era educational journey. The office arranges teacher-student exchanges with international schools, stimulating creative thinking and learning inspiration through interactions. During Taipei's first AI Education Expo in 2024, students showcased their learning achievements on stage. Whether applying AI or implementing new technologies, they showed remarkable creativity and problem-solving skills. By partnering with high-tech companies, the understanding of technology's real-world applications served as a bridge linking the world to students and broadening their perspectives.

To train professional talent, on June 1, 2024, Taipei's Department of Education officially established its Vocational Education Section with four major

policies: 1) deepening career exploration, 2) promoting innovative collaboration, 3) expanding international perspectives, and 4) increasing digital literacy. The Department of Education also deepened innovative cross-domain curriculum development in 12 technical teaching centers and launched the nation's first Taipei City Technical High School Long-term Care Talent Cultivation Subsidy Program. In 2024, Taipei pioneered the city's first Capital Cup WorldSkills Competition. People observe their children's innovations in the classroom and confident performances on the international stage.

Experimental Education: Exploring Education's New Future

Experimental education breaks with traditional frameworks by encouraging schools to design diverse curricula that give students more freedom to develop. In 2024, Taipei City Government transformed Zhongyi Elementary School into the first public Montessori experimental elementary school, cooperating with Wanhua Kindergarten to create a Montessori experimental education base for children aged 2-12 years. Project reports cover diverse topics from nature and cultural diversity to environmental protection, sharing insights that move Taipei's educational environment toward a more diverse, intelligent, and sustainable future.



Equality and Harmony as One Family

Same-Sex Marriage in Taiwan, Rainbow Shining Bright

Taiwan, as the first Asian country to legalize same-sex marriage, celebrated its fifth anniversary of this landmark decision in 2024. To commemorate this historic moment, the Taipei City Government organized "The Way We Love—Same-Sex Marriage Fifth Anniversary Market," allowing the light of equality and diverse ways of loving bloom in every corner of the city.

The event was extraordinarily lively, with relay performances by LGBTQ-allied singers and a boost from the rainbow market. Approximately 1,600 individuals attended. The event also featured LGBTQ couples sharing their love journeys, moving many attendees to tears as they deeply experienced how love transcends gender and conventional categories. Among the speakers were Chris and Yu-Ling, who shared the story of their gentle and steadfast love that spanned the Taiwan Strait. Despite facing legal challenges, these individuals showed through their actions that true love can cross national boundaries and wait for change, spreading courage and hope on the path toward equal rights for transnational same-sex marriages.

To create an environment friendly to all expressions of gender identity and sexual orientation, the Taipei City Government will continue to promote LGBTQ-friendly policies and hold parades, forums, film festivals, exhibitions, and other activities, letting the rainbow light illuminate everyone's lives.

Celebrating Eid Together, Blooming in Taipei

Another cultural feast, 2024 Eid-al-Fitr in Taipei, unfolded in Daan Park in April 2024! On this day, both Muslim community and local residents of Taipei gathered to celebrate Eid al-Fitr.

To actively promote Taipei as a Muslim-friendly city and create a welcoming tourism environment, the Taipei City Government's Department of Information and Tourism held an event celebrating Eid-al-Fitr. The event featured spectacular stage performances, Muslim cultural experiences, outdoor recreation areas, and more than 30 halal bazaars. For the first time, convenience stores were invited to set up FamiMobi at the venue, selling Muslim-friendly products and "Tom Yummy" hot food, creating an exotic and thoughtfully friendly city atmosphere.

The Department of Information and Tourism and the Taipei City Foreign and Disabled Labor Office organized an exhibition called Migrant Workers and Multiculture Exhibition Area, with the exhibit content covering language learning courses at the Taipei Migrant Worker School, care giving skills training, and cultural exchange activities. 2024 Eid-al-Fitr in Taipei also won the 2024 MUSE Creative Awards Gold Award in the Cultural Event category for the first time. Taipei continues to promote foreign cultures with innovation in mind, allowing people to understand other cultures more deeply and to show Taipei's image as an inclusive city.

Love and Support, A Reliable Shelter

Although love knows no bounds, new immigrants still face numerous challenges. "If I get a divorce, will I be deported back to Vietnam?" Ms. Nguyen, who has been in Taiwan for 5 years, saw a video advertisement that the Taipei City Government had commissioned a Vietnamese YouTuber in Taiwan, Nguyen Thu Hang, to create. The video promoted legal consultation and life adaptation consultation services for new immigrants. The video advertisement answered questions she had about domestic violence assistance, custody rights, and language barriers and gave her the courage to call the free legal hotline to seek more protection for her future.

As part of her consultation at the New Immigrants' Hall in Taipei City, Ah-Fang from Vietnam asked, "Is my child able to attend school here?" Through the thoughtful listening ear and translation services provided by volunteers and resident staff and with the assistance of the Taipei City Government's Department of Civil Affairs referring her to the Department of Education, within just 1 month, her child was successfully enrolled in school. She said, gushing with emotion, "this place really feels like home!"

The New Immigrants' Hall is not just a consultation station but also a bridge for cultural exchange. The hall enables new immigrants to interact with citizens and become seeds that spread culture and warmth.

Companionship Begins with "Understanding You," Dual Protection of Language and Care

To promote multicultural diversity and inclusivity in Taipei City, the Taipei City Government commissioned the Taiwan Pearl S. Buck Foundation in 2024 to manage the healthcare interpretation personnel pool, trained 24 foreign language interpreters covering 7 languages, including Japanese for the first time, expanding its service recipients. Throughout the year, the foundation provided 2,455 hours of interpretation services across 12 administrative districts, serving 38,013 people with friendly, barrier-free communication support.

While focusing on adult interpretation services, the foundation also helps new immigrant families understand early intervention concepts by providing parent-child group learning courses, emphasizing the importance of children's growth and development. By combining resources from the Department of Civil Affairs' New Immigrants' Hall and the Department of Social Welfare's Care stronghold on Taipei new immigrants' Community, the foundation continues to promote health advancement for new immigrants. By providing language assistance and psychological support, the foundation is able to help new immigrants by accompanying them as they face environmental changes and life challenges, becoming a vital support for a stable life.



Having Fun with Our Furry Friends

No More Cages! Letting Pets Run Freely on a Happy Journey

Pet owners who enjoy taking their furry friends outdoors have something to celebrate. In response to National Pet Day, the Taipei City Government held the Spring Outing for Furry Friends event on March 31, 2024. The theme of the event was Pet-Friendly Taipei Travel. The pet-friendly subway event was upgraded, with an increase to 4 pet-friendly trains and 16 scheduled trips during a certain time period, allowing pets to move freely inside carriages. Pet owners could interact with other pet-loving passengers, enjoying a warm journey together. Veterinarians, pet behavioral trainers, and cleaning staff were thoughtfully arranged to accompany the trips, making the journey more convenient and worry-free.

Pet-friendly transportation isn't limited to subway arrangements. The Taipei Public Transportation Office also set up a special GoGo Bus Dog Bus X MODEL T Electric Bus experience activity, offering free rides for citizens and their pets to experience pet-friendly transportation.

The Taipei Animal Protection Office also simultaneously held the Dogs Having Fun Party obstacle course activity at the lively Xinyi Plaza dog activity area, planning four major checkpoints: Jumping TEMPO, Dog Obstacle Challenge, Paw Print Souvenir, and How Much Do You Know About Your Pet, allowing

owners and pets to strengthen their bonds through interaction. Deputy Mayor Lin Yi-hua personally served as a checkpoint master, creating five fun quizzes related to animal protection and pet care. The atmosphere was warm and filled with laughter.

The Gentle Connection Between Pets and the City

To create a more pet-friendly travel environment, the Department of Transportation has opened 19 dog-friendly bus routes in Taipei City, providing pet owners with convenient transportation to various dog parks and activity areas on both weekdays and holidays. Routes will be added as new parks are established, thoughtfully improving the convenience of dog walking and allowing pet owners without cars or motorcycles to easily embark on city excursions. Today, the heartwarming sight of pets running freely in pet parks has quietly become part of Taipei's everyday street scenery. To continuously promote an animal-friendly city, Taipei City is actively creating diverse and inclusive spaces. Currently, the entire city has 21 dog parks and dog activity areas distributed across 12 administrative districts, functionally designed as training, energy-release, and family fun parks, allowing both pets and owners to find the most suitable place to relax.

To bring the beauty of summer nights to our pets' world, the Taipei Animal Protection Office held a Pet Summer Party on June 22 at the Zhou-mei Dog Activity Area in Neihu District near the water dance venue, inviting pets and their owners to exercise together and enjoy the dance performance.

On that day, the lush green lawn was filled with the pets' *joie de vivre*. The Animal Protection Office promoted animal-friendly spaces and dog park concepts through pet knowledge quizzes to convey pet care concepts to owners. The pets were immersed in a paradise of their own while their owners gave guidance and cheered them on, with their mutual affection and unspoken bond radiating in the sunlight. Free rabies vaccinations and pet registration services were provided as a thoughtful gesture on-site, making this summer party one full of warmth and laughter and an unforgettable memory for pets and their families.

A Date with Meiti, Pet Playground Paradise

In February 2024, Taipei City pioneered a private dog park adoption program, hoping to launch a love-driven gentle public welfare initiative through public-private partnership with the Taipei City Government. Adopters who hold animal protection or epidemic prevention-related activities at the venue can enjoy venue fee exemptions and government

subsidies. Those who donate facilities and equipment to the park can apply for tax deductions based on the value of their donations and can leave their names on facilities or notice boards, making this love a part of the city landscape. He looks forward to more loving hands coming together to create friendly recreational spaces for pets.

Brilliant Golden Years, Love without Barriers

As Taipei City transitions to having a super-aged society, the diverse needs of elderly citizens are becoming increasingly apparent. The Taipei City Government is actively promoting its Barrier-Free Aging policy, which covers five major areas: expansion of senior citizen cards, community care service centers, elderly learning programs, improved long-term care services, and increased bed capacity. The goal is to ensure that seniors can live healthily, move freely, and learn happily, creating an age-friendly city that truly realizes the ideals of "elderly with proper care, elderly with joy, and elderly with security."

Senior Card Upgrade: Greater Freedom For Seniors' Outings

Seniors tended to stay at home in the past because of the difficult of getting around the city or a reluctance to spend money. With the significantly expanded range of the Taipei Senior Citizen Card in 2024, its usage has reached 139 million instances, indicating that seniors have gradually become familiar with using these cards. Akin to a magical portal, a single Senior Citizen Card allows one access to the MRT, buses, and free movement between major stations on the Taoyuan Airport MRT and Taiwan Railway in five counties and cities (Taipei, New Taipei, Keelung, Taoyuan, and Yilan). The card even fully covers highway bus fares! This makes it easy for seniors to go out whenever they wish.

Efforts to reach our seniors have gone beyond transportation. In 2024, numerous cultural and sports

venues, such as Beitou Park's outdoor hot spring bath, Taipei Tennis Court, and the Taipei Music Center Cultural Cube permanent exhibition "Music, Island, Stories: Pop Music in Taiwan," have provided a more diverse range of activities for seniors to enjoy!

Community Care Service Centers: Creating a Second Home For Seniors

Taipei City's Department of Social Welfare subsidizes private organizations to promote the deep integration of community and local resources. These efforts connect health promotion, check-in services, care visits, and dining services, gradually establishing a continuous care system. The policy focuses not only on care but also on promoting cross-generational participation, creating an inclusive community environment where seniors receive comprehensive support in familiar surroundings.

Senior Learning: Every Day is a Good Time For Learning

Taipei City encourages seniors to learn throughout their lives! In 2024, 69 senior learning centers were established and the "Senior Citizen Learning Vouchers" program was launched. This program subsidizes 1,800 seniors to attend community college courses, such as practical and interesting classes in art, technology, and sports.

The Taipei City Department of Education held Senior Learning Month activities, inviting elderly citizens to visit the zoo, planetarium, and libraries, integrating learning into daily life. To create more comfortable learning environments, the Department of Education also launched a pilot classroom renovation project for senior citizens at Binjiang Elementary School, installing movable desks and chairs and soft lighting, thereby allowing seniors to begin their learning journey in a comfortable setting.

Taipei City's dedication to senior learning is evident in every detail. A senior-friendly learning environment allows seniors to continue learning in familiar community settings and establish lifelong learning habits, which allow them to thrive well into their retirement years.

Long-Term Care With Love: Growing Old Together, Hand in Hand

In 2022, Taipei City officially became a superaged society, with demand for long-term care services increasing daily. In the past, transitioning to care after a family member's hospitalization often caused anxiety. To ensure the elderly in need receive care with peace of mind, the Taipei City Government added 124 long-term-care beds in 2024. Taipei City Hospital now has 230 such beds. As the number of long-term-care beds increases, the availability of adequate care has become, the most gently reassuring rock that numerous households rely on in their everyday life.

To improve the coverage rate of residential long-term care facilities, Taipei City pioneered the nation's first build-own-operate model and promoted private sector participation through a build-operate-transfer approach, introducing more efficient and creative operational mechanisms. Simultaneously, the city actively seeks to establish long-term care facilities at social housing sites and urban renewal areas and is encouraging private investment through subsidy programs, assisting with applications and preparations. Taipei City Government's efforts are aimed at expanding long-term care resources so that more senior citizens can age comfortably in familiar surroundings.

▶ Bright Talents Harmonize Together

August 1 Indigenous Peoples Week: Weaving Cultures, Connecting Hearts

The year 2024 marks the 30th anniversary of the official renaming of August 1 as Indigenous Peoples Day. To celebrate this occasion, the Indigenous Peoples Commission of Taipei City Government hosted the grand "August 1 Indigenous Peoples Week." Festivities spanned multiple locations including Zhongshan Station and Yuanshan Flora Expo areas, featuring 5 themed events and more than 60 marketplace stalls. The celebration brought together Indigenous dances, music, fashion shows, and hands-on craft experiences, attracting more than 5,000 participants and successfully bridging the gap between urban and tribal communities.

The "August 1 Indigenous Peoples Week" offered numerous highlights, including Indigenous fashion shows, marketplace stalls, and musical performances at Xinzongshan Linear Park; unplugged concerts and special Indigenous language exhibitions at the first-floor atrium of Taipei City Hall; Southern Islands cultural exhibitions and achievement showcases at the Ketagalan Culture Center; and Southern Islands food culture exchanges at Flora Expo Park, where chefs collaborate to serve delectable fare and vendors sold their wares steeped in traditional culture. All these events allowed the public to experience an authentic cultural charm by participating with joy.

A mother from Nantou shared that the event gave her a comprehensive understanding of Indigenous cultures and that her children learned about traditional

Indigenous crafts through interactive games. This not only demonstrates Taipei City Government's dedication to promoting ethnic harmony but also deepens citizens' understanding of and respect for Indigenous cultures.

Traditional Fashion Innovation: Greater Youth Engagement

The 2024 Taipei City "August 1 Indigenous Peoples Week" entered its second year, featuring the theme SALAMA! Urban Indigenous Cultural Festival, which combined music, fashion, crafts, and marketplaces during a 9-day celebration beginning on July 27. The most stunning highlight was the Indigenous fashion show held for the first time at Xinzongshan Linear Park, where students from Shih Chien University's Department of Fashion Design collaborated on the project. More than 20 models walked the runway wearing traditional Indigenous clothing fused with contemporary design aesthetics.



At the SALAMA! Urban Indigenous Cultural Festival, the chairperson of the Indigenous Peoples Commission of Taipei City Government, Bakan Pawan, and guests posed for joyful photos with performers, capturing moments full of smiles and blessings.



Beyond the impressive fashion show, the event featured energetic performances by Indigenous singers and groups alongside 60 stalls from Indigenous vendors across Taiwan. From classic bamboo tube rice and lemon tea with mountain pepper to millet-marinated meat and handcrafted accessories using traditional techniques, attendees experienced an authentic tribal atmosphere.

To attract wider participation, the event was promoted on social media and by key opinion leaders.* Additionally, interactive games appealing to all age groups were designed. Indigenous participants expressed heartfelt sentiments: "I used to worry our culture would be lost, but seeing so many children coming to learn gives me peace of mind. Our culture will definitely be passed down from generation to generation!"

Hakka Culture: A New Chapter of Sustainable Prosperity

The multicultural city of Taipei is home to the Taipei City Hakka Cultural Park, which operates on the principles of Hakka culture, sustainable living, ecofriendly agriculture, and green dining. The park combines cultural and environmental concepts and serves as a model area for implementing food and agricultural education! Under the leadership of the Taipei Hakka Culture Foundation, the Hakka Park makes excellent use of its open spaces. In June 2024, it launched a series of wild vegetable courses, and in September, it held Sustainability Promotion Station lectures, helping the public gain a deep understanding of the lessons that Hakka culture has to offer in facing climate change, with nearly 30,000 participants.

To support Earth Day's Planet Versus Plastics theme, the Taipei City Government collaborated across departments in April 2024, bringing together the Hakka Affairs Commission, Department of Environmental Protection, civil society organizations, and startup companies to host the Sustainable City, Plastic-Free Hakka fair. The event gathered 140 sustainable market stalls, allowing children and adults to learn about environmental protection through family challenges, hands-on experiences, and fun activities, encouraging citizens to reduce plastic use for our planet's sake and to make sustainability a part of our daily life.

Building a Hakka Language-Friendly Environment: Experiencing the Warmth of Hakka Language and Culture

Hakka language learning can be practical, lively, and youth-oriented! The Taipei Hakka Education Center promotes Hakka language and culture through five diverse curriculum pillars, spanning language, crafts, and performing arts, attracting participants of all ages and different ethnic groups. For example, the indigo dyeing class, which incorporates sustainability concepts, transforms natural plant-based dyeing into creative designs, reflecting the new face of urban Hakka culture. This initiative was even invited to exhibit in Australia, showcasing Taipei's cultural strength to the world.

The promotion of Hakka language and culture is also taking root in kindergartens. In addition to subsidizing Hakka language courses for children aged 2 to 6 years, demonstration kindergartens such as Zhangxin and Sigao have been established. The Taipei City Government has also published Hakka picture books, some of which have been adapted into animations and have won international film festival awards, successfully bringing Hakka stories to the global stage. "Sefae (Little Flower)" is one such picture book. The annual Taipei Hakka Yimin Festival, the largest Hakka celebration in Taiwan, conducts all ceremonies and performances entirely in Hakka, combining marketplaces and family activities that last attracted more than 125,000 participants during its three-day run. Through these diverse and approachable methods, Hakka is becoming more of an everyday language, making cultural inheritance both meaningful and interesting.

*Note: KOL is an abbreviation for "Key Opinion Leader," also translated as "opinion leader" or "influential person." These are people who possess professional knowledge and influence in specific fields or industries. They are typically active on social media, blogs, YouTube, and other platforms, and can guide their followers' purchasing decisions through their influence.

Young People Bringing New Life to Taipei

Youth Transforming Taipei: Your City Partners Have Arrived!

Good news for Taipei's young people! Mayor Chiang Wan-an has fulfilled the promise he made in establishing of the Department for Youth in 2024. This department functions like a smartphone, with its multiple programs, including international internships, artistic exchanges, and career development programs, being similar to apps young people can access when needed. In its first month, the Department welcomed Harvard interns and temporarily transformed Tianmu Baseball Stadium into a classroom, providing more than 5,000 young people with guidance that enabled them to reach new heights of interdisciplinary learning.

The Taipei City Government officially launched its Department for Youth on June 1, 2024, with this department becoming Taipei's first official entity with "youth at its core." Among all youth-related departments in the six major cities of Taiwan, Taipei City is the only and the first to have established a "Global Engagement Division." Within its first month, the Department for Youth launched the International Student Internship Program, initiated the International Youth Artist Exchange Program, and provided Taiwan's young people with new international perspectives.

In addition to international development, the Department addresses career, psychological, and housing concerns. The Department established a Career Support Division and promoted the Youth Slash Career Store Trial Run. The pioneering initiative also launched a new Youth Academy brand, encouraging young people to extract themselves from their professional frameworks, engage in interdisciplinary learning, and develop

secondary expertise. In addition, a Youth Academy series of courses called Youth+ was established, and we collaborated with the professional baseball team Wei Chuan Dragons. For the inaugural course, coaches, players, cheerleaders and managers were invited to share insights on game management, career training, and team operations strategies. Since then, more than 40 of these Youth+ courses have been taught at Tianmu Baseball Stadium, the Taipei Dome, Songyan Cultural and Creative Park, and movie theaters. Activity information attracted nearly 50,000 views, with nearly 2,700 people successfully registering to participate. The enthusiastic response led many people to request additional spots!

Youth Civic Power: Let Change Begin With Participation!

To improve Taipei, young voices must be heard! Since its establishment in June 2024, the Taipei City Government's Department for Youth has actively encouraged young people to participate in civic affairs. In September, the Department recruited young commissioners for its Youth Advisory Committee, leading young people from diverse backgrounds to engage for the first time in policy and municipal affairs. The committee established six major working groups covering crucial topics such as artificial intelligence technology, sustainable development, and social equality, with this providing young people with an opportunity to personally participate in discussions and proposals regarding topics they care about.

The Department for Youth also organizes policy debates, public affairs camp, organizes issue salons, and implements various other activities to encourage



young people to speak up, express themselves, and participate in civic affairs, leading them to feel that public participation is accessible, enjoyable, and fulfilling.

International Student Internship Program: Harvard Students Enter Taipei

The Taipei City Government's Department for Youth launched the International Student Internship Program. Its first cohort of interns, Janet and Isabelle from Harvard University, have backgrounds in computer science, statistics, and economics. Through their internship, Janet and Isabelle participate in youth policy planning and conduct research on topics such as artificial intelligence-assisted mental health and financial literacy, offering a young perspective.

Janet and Isabelle also visited the Taipei MRT headquarters and the Taipei Urban Intelligence Center and met with Malaysian representatives in Taiwan, which provided them with a deeper understanding of urban governance and international cooperation. They also engaged in in-depth exchanges with students from Soochow University's International Volunteer Club, with the two groups of students sharing their experiences in overseas service and learning, leading to the students feeling deep emotion and a feeling of resonance.

Street Art is Transformed Into a Community Treasure

International exchange is not solely being ignited on campuses; it is also occurring on the streets. On the century-old streets of Taipei, international graffiti masters are teaching older men and women how to use spray paint. As the paint splashes on the weathered walls, cross-generational dialogue blossoms.

This intergenerational exchange is part of the International Youth Artist Exchange Program promoted by the Taipei City Government's Department for Youth. In 2024, the Department for Youth invited three international graffiti artists—FLEKS from the Netherlands, ENOFone from Belgium, and ORBITA from Spain—to complete a 3-month creative residency in Taiwan. With participation from local citizens, they completed graffiti projects in Wanhua's Dingshi Village, Tianmu Baseball Stadium, and the Taipei Zoo. In doing so, they used their creativity to

inject vitality and new cultural meaning into Taipei's landscapes, transforming city corners into stages for cultural dialogue.

Internship Allowance Encourages Young People to Bravely Pursue Their Dreams and Explore Careers!

To encourage young people to familiarize themselves with the workplace and reduce the gap between education and practice, the Taipei City Government's Department for Youth has launched the nation's first Youth Internship Allowance Program. Students who are registered residents of Taipei City and participating in internships can receive a monthly allowance of NT\$5,000 for up to 3 months, and those from low-income or near-poor households can receive up to NT\$10,000 per month. Students who have participated in this program have said that the internships not only help them understand industry operations but also enable them to explore whether certain fields are suitable for them and gain a sense of what their future might hold. With 3 short months of its launch, more than 1,100 young people applied for this program.

The Department for Youth has been promoting the Youth Social Innovation Cultivation Program, which helps Taipei's young people who are interested in social innovation realize their dreams. In 2024, the Department for Youth organized a business matchmaking event, inviting well-known companies and social innovation organizations to connect and exchange ideas. The organizations presented several creative proposals, including a design for ecofriendly yarn packaging and a plan for implementing early intervention public welfare projects. Through these matchmaking events, young people in Taipei were connected with corporate resources that can assist them in investing their time and effort into social innovation careers.

Spring Revival: Bustling with Energy

Revitalizing Old Streets: New Look for Wanhua Commercial Corridor

Have you noticed that Taipei's famous old neighborhoods look different? For example, the sidewalks are no longer crowded with scooters. The neighborhoods have become more pedestrian friendly! These changes are the result of the Taipei City Government's Wanhua Commercial Corridor Integration Plan, which involved integrated efforts from more than 20 departments and gathered expert and local opinions regarding how the government could revitalize this historically rich area.

While walking through Wanhua, you'll see new digital tourism map stands providing information regarding the area. Furthermore, you'll no longer see the area cluttered with signs from abandoned businesses; these businesses have been replaced by pedestrian safety facilities. In addition, the pavement on the section of Guangzhou Street in front of Bopiliao (the area stretching from Kangding Road to Kunming Street) will be renovated, which will enable visitors to more easily stroll along the street and experience charm of historic Taipei. These improvements were made on the basis of the Taipei City Government's three core strategies

for improving the area, namely, showcasing its unique characteristics, achieving minimalist aesthetics, and establishing a safe, people-centered environment.

Taipei City is also listening to local voices in improving Wanhua District. Monthly Wanhua Gatherings are held to ensure a consensus is established between local business associations and self-governing organizations. Through these gatherings, food was established as the main focus of tourism for the area, with culture as a supplementary theme. The city government has planned Wanhua area tours, recommended specialty shops, and created multilingual promotional materials for the area. Additionally, the government has provided customized guidance to local businesses to enhance various aspects of their operational capabilities. In 2024, through Store Transformation in Taipei and Digital Transformation projects, the Taipei City Government helped 10 stores transform and upgrade, and it is continuing to work with the community to create a vision of Wanhua Shopping District's development in which Wanhua is not just an old neighborhood, it is a new center of culture and commerce in the city.

Eastern Shopping District's Renewed Splendor: Dazzling Liugong Green Corridor

After exploring the old neighborhoods of Taipei, you can experience the green corridor in the city's fashion district. To revitalize the Eastern Shopping District, Taipei City launched the Zhongxiao East District Revival Plan, which involved optimizing pedestrian spaces, organizing themed marketing events, and revitalizing underground malls. By the end of 2024, the implementers of the plan had transformed the parking lot behind the SOGO Department Store in the area into a lush open space connecting several pedestrian walkways and providing a comfortable and welcoming resting environment for shoppers. Furthermore, the plan has led to an increasing number of events being held to create business opportunities in the area.

The 2024 Eastern Shopping District Trendy Summer Party brought together hundreds of stores, and the event attracted tens of thousands of online participants. At the end of the year, the 2024 Eastern Shopping District Anniversary Sale: Eastern Shopping District Here We Go! was held, with prizes offered that were worth more than a million New Taiwan Dollars; more than 50,000 people entered for participation in the event. Furthermore, during Christmastime and the Lantern Festival, special decorative lights were hung around Liugong Green Corridor and Longmen Square, which created a festive atmosphere and attracted large crowds of visitors.

Taipei Dome's Comeback: Eastern Shopping District's Economic Boom

Have you noticed that the Eastern Shopping District has become more vibrant since the Taipei Dome opened? In 2024, the Dome hosted numerous baseball games and concerts, attracting countless fans

and bringing unprecedented economic benefits to the surrounding Eastern Shopping District commercial area.

Recognizing the crowds and business opportunities brought by the Dome, the Taipei City Government established the Taipei Dome Home Run Stroll: Explore the East District, which is an activity held during baseball games and National Day celebrations. During this activity, more than 100 partner stores offer discounts, and participants are provided with NT\$100 Tour Eastern Shopping District Vouchers. The activity attracts large crowds of consumers to the area, particularly during 2024 WBSC Premier 12!

At the end of 2024, the Taipei City Government combined Taipei New Year's Eve Party with a concert series by a famous Taiwanese singer, A-Mei, at Taipei Dome for the Taipei Dome Christmas & New Year Celebration Event. A-Mei's 5 concerts attracted nearly 200,000 attendees and drove more than NT\$2.2 billion in consumption citywide, with the Eastern Shopping District accounting for approximately NT\$170 million of this consumption. Moreover, the event provided new energy to the city. This and all other exciting events in this area have led to the Eastern Shopping District's charm shining ever more brilliantly.

New Year Good Fortune Begins With Viewing Lanterns

The 2024 Taipei Lantern Festival featured a 31-day exhibition period, the longest in the festival's history. The festival involved exhibitions presented in two stages, with the lanterns illuminated prior to the Lunar New Year to establish a festive atmosphere prior to the holiday. The main lantern, the King of Lantern Dragon, was crafted from metal, and the presentation of the lantern included a sound and light show, creating a magnificent spectacle. The festival also debuted the Nine Little Dragons, a set of parade lanterns that playfully weaved through the festival areas, which delighted the children who visited. In addition, at the interactive light projection North Gate Silhouettes, which was an interactive illumination display at the North Gate, people were able to scan QR Code that allowed them to project their wishes onto the North Gate. Another exhibition at the event, the Red House Exhibition, won the Italian design award A' Design Award, raising international awareness of Taipei.

The 2024 Taipei Lantern Festival involved three major display zones: the North Gate, Ximen, and Zhonghua Road zones. Japanese artists and local creators were invited to participate, and more than 120 lantern displays were presented. Furthermore, more than 50 stage performances were held, and more than 40 groups of street artists performed. Overall, the festival attracted more than 5.74 million visitors, with over 92.7% of the visitors reporting satisfaction with the event. Furthermore, local commercial operators and temples collaborated in planning lantern tunnels, lantern riddle competitions, photography contests, and lantern decorations, with these events lighting up the entire western district of Taipei.

Flowers IN Taipei, Year-Round Viewing of Colorful Flowers

In 2024, Flowers IN Taipei planned eight flower exhibition activities. For the opening event, the Taipei Camellias Show, participants used innovative flower-forcing technology, which enabled 60 varieties and 115 pots of camellias to bloom simultaneously, setting a record for the most spectacular exhibition

in the show's history and attracting more than 20,000 visitors. The dreamy camellia tunnel at the event, which also featured 12,000 tulips and 6,000 hyacinths, provided a European-style horticultural atmosphere and became a popular photo and social media check-in spot. Another event, the LOHAS Cherry Blossom Festival, combined the romantic atmosphere of cherry blossoms at night with the excitement of electronic music to create a trendy party at which attendees could enjoy spring flowers.

Taipei hosted three other flower exhibitions in the spring, including the 2024 Ki-Pataw Shan-Tseng-Chi Flower Festival, an annual event that attracted countless people to view the purple sea of blossoms. Additionally, the Taipei City Government used global positioning system and layout technologies to create a Crested Serpent Eagle landscape totem, and local commercial operators provided discounts for people who visited to view the flower. Furthermore, in 2024, the Taipei City Government combined the CKS Shilin Residence Tulip Festival with the Lantern Festival for the first time, with this transforming flower viewing into an interactive experience with both dynamic and static elements. Additionally, the government hosted the Yangmingshan Flower Festival also featured passionate street dance competitions and historically rich venue connection activities.

Furthermore, the 2024 Taipei Rose Festival was held. The festival exhibited more than 800 varieties and 5,000 rose plants, making it Taiwan's largest ever rose exhibition. Additionally, the 2024 Taipei Azalea Festival lasted 31 days and showcased more than 210,000 azalea plants, as well as cleome and marguerite daisies and other seasonal flowers. The event attracted more than 660,000 visitors. At the end of the year, the government hosted the CKS Shilin Residence Chrysanthemum Festival, which was themed Chrysanthemum Party With Animals. Chrysanthemums were crafted into

cute animal shapes, and attendees were able to view the chrysanthemum greenhouse at night. The event attracted more than 590,000 visitors.

Picnicking Can Be This Chill?! Taipei Floral Picnic Is a Big Hit

Taipei offers opportunities to both view flowers and have a picnic! The 2024 Taipei Floral Picnic was hosted in Daan Park, and more than 25,000 visitors participated in the grand event. The picnic featured five major themed areas, providing all types of visitors, from families with children to pet owners and LOHAS lifestyle groups, with a space exclusively suited to them. In addition, the event included arts and crafts markets and fun activities, making the event lively and engaging from beginning to end.

A key focus of the 2024 Taipei Floral Picnic was ecofriendly picnicking, with attendees encouraged to bring their own utensils and take public transportation to the event. The event also featured Picnic Mat Homecoming, which was an activity focused on promoting living with less plastic.

Dadaocheng's Summer Splendor: Fireworks and Riverside Light Gallery

At the 2024 Taipei Summer Festival, to celebrate Taipei's 140th anniversary, a riverside light gallery was created that extended more than 500 meters. The words "TAIPEI 140" were presented at the start of the light gallery, as was a large-scale lighting installation. Riverside light gallery became a popular social media check-in spot. Furthermore, during the festival, firework displays were organized on several days, with those days also featuring bands or famous musical artists. Attendees watched fireworks, listened to music, and browsed markets, becoming so engrossed in the event that they didn't want to leave!

The organizers of the Taipei Summer Festival also collaborated with Taipei River Cruise operators to offer discount coupons for cruises and with more than 80 shops in the Dadaocheng commercial district to implement spend-and-receive-gift activities. 2024 Taipei Summer Festival attracted nearly 250,000 participants, and it drove business growth in the commercial district.

Extremely Eye-Catching and Sporty New Year's Eve! A HIGH-Flying Welcome to the New Year in Taipei

For the 2025 Taipei New Year's Party, the theme was sports, in consideration of the upcoming World Masters Games 2025 Taipei & New Taipei City. The area surrounding city government building was decorated with sports light displays featuring running and jumping motifs, with the intention of conveying Taipei City as a city of movement.

This grand celebration attracted more than 220,000 visitors. Taipei City Government also created a special zone for people with mobility difficulties, ensuring they would also be able to attend the New Year's party. Furthermore, rehabilitation buses were arranged to transport people with disabilities and their companions home after the event.

The Taipei City Government will continue to build Taipei New Year's Party into a must-visit event in Asia and an once-in-a-lifetime experience that attracts more domestic and international tourists and enables them to experience Taipei's passion and vitality.

Arts and Cultural Feast with Trendy Elegance

Fashion Trends Sweep the City

Taipei's annual Fashion Week is like a magnificent party that not only showcases the creativity of Taiwanese designers to the world but also infuses the city with a vibrant, fashionable atmosphere.

For the 2024 Taipei Fashion Week, the themed dress code was Taipei in celebration of Taipei's 140th anniversary. Six Taiwanese designer brands—Allenko3 (Ke Wei-lun), BOB Jian (Chien Kuo-yen), CHIA (Chen Jia-rui), Claudia .W (Wang Tzu-hsin), JUST IN XX (Chou Yu-ying), and PCES (Sandy Lee, Jessica Chang, and Bruno Chung)—created pieces that exhibited Taipei's 140 years of rich cultural heritage through the fusion of urbanity and fashion trends.

The highly anticipated Cross-Sector Fashion Show was held in Xinyi District—Taipei's premier fashion hub. Nearly 100 fashion pieces were showcased, and pop music artists and Olympic athletes made special appearances at the event. In addition to the spectacular main show, the event included the One Night in Taipei: 100-Model Fashion Show, which allowed the public to step into a model's world—from backstage preparations to dazzling runway moments.

Taipei Fashion Week attracted nearly 70,000 attendees and connected businesses across Dadaocheng, East District, and Xinyi District, bringing fashion beyond the runway and into citizens' daily lives.

Igniting City Passion Through Music and Innovation

Can you imagine what it would take to hold more than 280 music performances and forums in Taipei in the space of just 7 days? In September 2024, the Taipei City Government, through cross-departmental collaboration and integration of public and private resources, launched the first TRENDY TAIPEI-Music X Innovation event. This event, which combined pop music, digital technology, film and television entertainment, and art performances, brought performance groups and industry experts together from more than 40 countries to exchange ideas. The event attracted 100,000 people and brought international attention to Taipei.

The TRENDY TAIPEI event was held using a three-in-one model combining industry forums, concert economics, and city action, with the event centering around a large-scale composite event for the music industry. The Taipei City Government plans to deepen cross-domain cooperation in the field of music. This will allow people to enjoy more international music festivals and help Taipei's music industry improve its positioning.

Taipei Hundred Styles: Experience the City's New Charm Across Time and Space

Happy 140th Birthday, Taipei City! To celebrate Taipei's 140th anniversary, the Taipei City Government organized events under the theme Taipei Hundred Styles, with the event involving activities under the five major themes of music, comics, films, stories, and clothing. From ascending the North Gate, attending traditional arts festivals, attending comic-focused city tours, experiencing Taipei in films, and attending fashion shows, event participants could comprehensively experience the city's history and cultural elegance.

For one of the aforementioned events, the Beitou Film Studio opened its doors to the public for the first time. It created an event involving an outdoor cinema and pop-up markets to teach attendees about the timeline of filmmaking in Taiwan and enable them to revisit the golden age of Taiwanese cinema. Furthermore, during Taipei Fashion Week, design and digital art were combined

to showcase the city's unique creative energy, and on Taipei Heritage Day, people were provided with a rare opportunity to visit cultural heritage restoration sites, which enabled them to learn about the stories of the historic buildings and the techniques being used to restore them.

The Taipei City Government has mobilized cross-departmental participation in organizing city events, including the Dadaocheng Summer Festival, heritage tours, Taipei Zoo's 110th anniversary, Taipei MRT's 30th anniversary, a Confucius ceremony, a centennial fire-fighting equipment exhibition. More than 50 events have been hosted that invite people to travel through Taipei's history, experience its culture, and celebrate its anniversary.

Wandering Through Nuit Blanche: The Night Animal Party Begins!


Nuit Blanche is a nighttime urban art festival that is hosted worldwide. Nuit Blanche Taipei 2024 was based in Daan Park, also known as the city's lungs. The

theme of the event was Nocturnal Animal Party, and it involved a combined focus on ecology and art. The event was led by Artistic Director Agi Chen and French guest curator Kitty Hartl, who brought the skating music parade Animal Pride from France to its Asian premiere in Taipei! The event involved 61 Taiwanese and international artists who presented more than 100 performances and visual art exhibits, and more than 450,000 visitors attended.

Taipei's Nuit Blanche is held in different areas each year, and it involves an overnight celebration. The 2024 event was held in Daan Park. The Taipei City Government, considering the venue's proximity to residential areas and its ecology, adjusted the event time to be from 2 PM to 2 AM to reduce the influence of noise on nearby residents and minimize disturbance to the park's ecosystem. This free, overnight, public art festival enabled both adults and children to easily interact with art in a familiar urban space while demonstrating Taipei's creativity and warmth as an international cultural city.

Taipei Yearbook 2024: Chronology of Events

01 January

08

Taipei City was leading the nation in promoting the construction of new public buildings by the city government to achieve "Building Energy Efficiency" ratings of Grade 1 and 1+.

10

Taipei City Government leads all levels of government by being the first to issue NT\$2.5 billion in social bonds for sustainable development. All funds raised are dedicated to socially beneficial projects, such as the MRT construction project, implementing Taipei Mayor Chiang Wan-an's city vision of "Sustainability and Inclusion: Capital of Hope."

19

During the 119 Firefighter Festival and Golden Dragon Awards ceremony, Taipei Mayor Chiang Wan-an presided over the inauguration ceremony of the Intelligent Resilient Wireless Communication System. This communications system is the first in the nation to adopt a same-frequency simulcast mode and be combined with a high-performance dispatch system, enhancing disaster relief and emergency medical efficacy while protecting firefighters and citizens.

26

"Taipei Land Administration House Search+" is the nation's first system to integrate 260,000 transaction records relating to more than 40,000 buildings, launching a "Building Actual Price Transaction History" search function. Through a dual search engine that incorporates map browsing and a smart positioning interface, citizens can precisely locate and seamlessly search for properties. The system currently has more than 13,000 monthly users.

31

An amendment to the "Taipei City Workers' Occupational Accident Consolation Payment Self-Governance Ordinance" was announced on January 29, 2024, and implemented 2 days later. The amendment expands the ordinance's coverage beyond just laborers to all workers, increasing death benefit payments from the original NT\$300,000 to NT\$360,000, protecting workers who die from occupational accidents with the highest payout amount nationwide.

02 February

02

The 2024 Taipei Lantern Festival took place in Ximending from February 2 to March 3, 2024. The festival was a pioneering one with its two-phase opening format; exhibitions were held over 31 days and featured three major exhibition areas and two main stages. In total, more than 5.74 million visitors attended the festival, and the overall satisfaction rate was 92.7%.

15

To encourage childbirth, parenting, better living, and fertility support, Taipei City has adopted a multiple-entry lottery system for families with two or more children aged 0 to 6 when applying for social housing to increase their chances of being selected. This system was first implemented in the leasing of Fuxing Social Housing and has since been applied to all subsequent social housing rentals.

28

Taipei City has implemented free YouBike rides: rides are free for the first 30 minutes.

29

The second phase renovation project of the Second Funeral Parlor at Taipei City Mortuary Services Office has been completed.



03

March

01

To achieve the goal of net-zero emissions in 2050, the Taipei City Government launched the "Power Down for Net Zero: Save 3%, Win Big!" sweepstakes campaign in 2024. This event encourages citizens to save electricity together and work together toward a more sustainable future.

01

Pioneered enhanced consumer protection measures for city-government-administered venues. Going forward, operators applying to use Taipei City Government venues for arts performances and road running events must disclose contract guarantee mechanisms or payment protection measures, refund procedures, and other information. Operators with poor records or with major unresolved consumer disputes will not receive approval to use the venue.

02

The Taipei Dome hosted the Japanese professional baseball 2024 Yomiuri Giants 90th Anniversary Taiwan Exhibition Games from March 2 to 3. The event attracted up to 38,000 spectators per day, and train services ran at intervals of just 2.5 minutes for the system. Crowd dispersion mechanisms and enhanced floor guidance stickers were utilized at the entrance of Sun Yat-Sen Memorial Hall Station, boosting signage clarity. Event attendees were successfully dispersed after approximately 40 minutes.

12

Promulgation of the 2024 Taipei Integrity Award Evaluation and Promotion Pilot Program, which combines public sector award incentives with private sector guidance and promotion. The program encourages the public sector to continue promoting clean governance and integrity in administration. The program also strives to establish partnerships with private sector operators that interact with Taipei City Government, providing guidance and promoting corporate integrity management concepts to jointly build a culture of integrity in Taipei City.

13

Implementation of Taipei City Urban Planning Case Review Guidelines was officially announced and put into effect.

15

Taipei City Government hosted its first Keelung-New Taipei-Taoyuan Cooperation Exchange Platform Mayor-Level Meeting. The meeting was jointly chaired by Taipei Mayor Chiang Wan-an, Keelung Mayor Hsieh Kuo-liang, New Taipei Mayor Hou Yu-ih, and Taoyuan Mayor Chang Shan-cheng. The meeting promoted climate change response and adaptation cooperation programs, creating high-quality living circles through cross-regional collaboration.

18

Establishment of the Taipei City STEAM Education & Emerging Technologies Development Office. On April 25, the Preschool STEAM Center was launched. Leading all counties and cities nationwide, Taipei established a dedicated unit for promoting STEAM education across all educational levels and interdisciplinary fields. Starting from early childhood education, the center provides Taipei students with comprehensive, interdisciplinary, and project-oriented STEAM and new technology hands-on experiences and curricula, nurturing children to become future interdisciplinary talents.

19

2024 Smart City Summit and Expo – The Taipei Pavilion highlights the theme of "Artificial-Intelligence-Driven · Future Taipei" to showcase Taipei City's progress toward the three major visions of safety, sports, and the future. By employing artificial intelligence, the city gov drives forth smart city development and creates a citizen-centered and service-oriented government. Taipei's booth attracted approximately 16,000 visitors and welcomed 40 visiting delegations (total of 652 individuals).

21

A groundbreaking ceremony was held for the civil engineering, E&M and HVAC systems construction of the CF690C contract of the Taipei MRT Circular line north section Y23 Station (exclusive) to Y25 Station (exclusive). Taipei City Mayor Chiang Wan-an attended the inspection.

27

Launched Global Pass, a pass that supports Taipei's startups and entrepreneurs not only in short-term business needs abroad, but also expanding into international markets.

28

Announced the implementation of the Formulation of Taipei City Disaster-Resilient Urban Renewal Detailed Plan, aimed at increasing incentives for the reconstruction of dangerous buildings in Taipei City, encouraging renewal and reconstruction to achieve the goals of a resilient city and Taipei City's 2050 net-zero emissions policy.

31

Under the key theme of pet-friendly transportation, Taipei Rapid Transit Corporation expanded the scale of pet-friendly train services alongside the Taipei City's Public Transportation Office and Animal Protection Office by jointly organizing the "2024 National Pet Day - Spring Outing for Furry Friends" event. A total of 280 dogs and cats rode on trains, with participating passengers expressing a satisfaction rate of 95.3%.

04

April

10

The Taipei City Government established the Sustainability Talent Academy and launched the Core Seed Personnel Professional Training Program to actively cultivate sustainable talent within the city government. The program concluded on September 18.

11

The Taipei City Government Department of Sports held a groundbreaking ceremony for the Keqiang Sports Center. Taipei Mayor Chiang Wan-an announced the launch of the Taipei Specialty Sports Venue Project, with Keqiang Sports Center-featuring a dedicated children's fitness center, will serve the first step of the project. The project envisions a total of nine Specialty Sports Venue that will complement Taipei's existing 12 sports centers, to encourage regular exercise citywide and further upgrade Taipei's sports industry.

17

The Taipei City Government promotes the concept of diversified parking sharing. Starting in April 2024, it became the first in the nation to implement Commercial Shared Temporary Parking Areas, with temporary parking designated for various commercial vehicles (rehabilitation buses, long-term care vehicles, taxis, and freight trucks) to meet temporary parking needs for public service vehicles and cater to the increasing demand for long-term care and rehabilitation bus services from an aging population.

20

The 2024 World Earth Day - Sustainable City Plastic-Free Festival invited teams from Coffee Mania Festival, Water Garden Organic Farmers' Market, Old Town Market, and Bamboo Dream Market. Responding to Goal 12 of the United Nation's Sustainable Development Goals: "Ensure Sustainable Consumption and Production Patterns," the event featured stalls selling low-carbon coffee, green food, organic vegetarian dishes, agricultural processed products, and Hakka cuisine. Running until April 21, the festival hosted 140 specialty stalls and 6,668 participants.

25

The 2024 National High School Games were hosted by Taipei City. Taipei earned 147 gold medals, 123 silver medals, and 144 bronze medals (414 medals in total) and retained the national championship. This broke Taipei's historical participation record and brought glory to the city.

25

The Ministry of the Interior planned the nation's first Civil Defense Table Top Military Simulation, designating the Taipei City Government as the national demonstration unit. The official exercise was conducted on April 25 and was led by Secretary-General Lee Tai-Hsin with Deputy Commissioner of Police Department Chou Huan-Hsin and task force members from civil defense, volunteer police, volunteer traffic assistants, firefighting, medical care, engineering, environmental protection, and disaster victim shelter and relief stations. The exercise was a success.



27

Taipei Water Department held the nation's first Endless Flow! 2024 Hip-Hop CYPHER Tournament, attracting 200 hip-hop research club students from high schools and universities across northern, central, southern, and eastern Taiwan. Taipei Mayor Chiang Wan-an also made an appearance to cheer for the students and gave high praise to the creative abilities and environmentally conscious attitudes of high school and university hip-hop research clubs.

05
May

01

The Taipei City Government Department of Information and Tourism held the 2024 Taipei Water Dance Festival at Rainbow Bridge for the first time, creating Taiwan's first water dance show on a bridge. The 2-month event featured music paired with high-powered beam lights and screen animation shows, creating brilliant audio-visual effects. The event attracted approximately 790,000 participants and generated about NT\$900 million in tourism revenue.

01

The Taipei Theatre Awards represent a new cultural policy under Mayor Chiang Wan-an's administration. This is the first contemporary theatre award in Taiwan, and the award has been eagerly anticipated by the performing arts community over the past 20 years. The first Taipei Theatre Awards opened for registration on May 1, 2024, accepting performance works from July to December of that year. In just half a year, applications were received from 55 groups with 73 productions, resulting in 647 award applications.

05

In the Ministry of Environment's evaluation of Taiwan's reservoir water quality, Taipei City Government's Feitsui Reservoir was the only reservoir in Taiwan without eutrophication, having the best water quality.

07

The Taipei City Government Department of Health held a press conference related to Expanding the Free Nine-Valent HPV Vaccine Policy for Junior High School Boys, providing free vaccinations starting in September 2024 for eighth-grade boys who are registered residents or be enrolled in schools in Taipei City.

18

Taipei Mayor Chiang Wan-an led a delegation to Tokyo, Japan, to attend the SusHi Tech 2024 forum and met with officials from the Liberal Democratic Party Youth Division and Tokyo Metropolitan Assembly. The delegation also visited Tokyo Chinese School and Tokyo Dome and attended the Taiwan Festa at Tokyo Skytree to help promote tourism in Taipei. The delegation concluded on May 20.

21

Taipei City established a sister city relationship with Kingstown, the capital of Saint Vincent and the Grenadines.

25

Taipei City's delegation participated in the 2024 National Disabled Games held in Nantou County, winning 221 gold, 117 silver, and 58 bronze medals and topping the nation, achieving an unprecedented 10th consecutive championship. The games concluded on May 28.

27

The Taipei City Government, in collaboration with the Taipei Chamber of Commerce, is promoting the Taipei Net Zero 101 initiative. The program aims to establish 101 net-zero demonstration sites across 14 major venue categories within 3 years. Its themes include renewable energy, a zero-waste circular economy, and behavioral changes in the green lifestyles of citizens.

28

The nation's first Parenting Friendly Enterprise Award held its review meeting on April 3, 2024, and completed a final selection. A special report was presented at the city government meeting on April 23 of the same year, followed by an award ceremony for 36 business units at the May 28 city government meeting. A press release was issued for promotion, and an e-book was published in June and distributed through the Taipei City Government's promotional channels.

29

The Taipei City Government's Indigenous Peoples Commission held an Indigenous Youth Student Consensus Forum, inviting directors of indigenous resource centers, full-time teachers, and students from Taipei's colleges and universities to participate as a basis for future governance. A total of 96 teachers and students participated.

06 June

To enhance the service quality and efficiency of the 1999 hotline, the Taipei City Government Research, Development, and Evaluation Commission and the Department of Information Technology jointly proposed a PoC called "Enhancing 1999 Taipei Citizen Hotline through Real-time Speech-to-text Technology and AI-integrated FAQs." Private sector units provided solutions, and relevant artificial intelligence technology was implemented at the 1999 call center for PoC testing over a 5-month period, concluding on October 31.

The Taipei City Government Department of Education established the Vocational Education Division, proposing four major policies: Deepening Career Exploration, Promoting Innovation Collaboration, Expanding International Perspective, and Increasing Digital Literacy. The department also held the inaugural Taipei Capital Cup WorldSkills Competition, featuring seven vocational competition categories with skilled competitors from nine countries competing together.

To implement the youth policy initiative from the city government white paper - establishing a Department for Youth - the Taipei City Government actively communicated with the Taipei City Council. After organizational regulations were approved, preparations were accelerated, and the Taipei City Government Department for Youth was established on June 1. The department pioneered the Global Engagement Division among youth affairs units in the six special municipalities, promoting youth international development and civic engagement and providing career support services.

The Taipei City Government's Indigenous Peoples Commission established Taipei's first Indigenous Cultural and Health Station, which was approved by the Council of Indigenous Peoples on May 3, 2024. Partnering with private organizations, the station provides a range of services for indigenous elders. Services include disability prevention, health care, nutritional communal dining, community care, and resource connection. The station aims to ensure that indigenous elders receive comprehensive services while continuing its mission of preserving cultural heritage.

The Taipei City Government Department of Information and Tourism inaugurated Taipei News in June, using short articles and infographics to communicate important policy highlights, event information, and citizen rights from the Taipei City Government, serving as an important channel of communication between the city government and citizens.

The Taipei City Government held a signing ceremony for "the creation of superficies case on 4 municipal lands including No. 21, 5th Subsection, Tanmei Section, Neihu District, Taipei City" and "the creation of superficies case on municipal lands including No. 35 & 35-1, 5th Subsection, Tanmei Section, Neihu District, Taipei City". The development, in partnership with the private sector, will enhance the efficiency of land utilization, strengthen AI industry clustering, and breathe new life into the development of the Neihu area.

The Taipei Multi-Dimensional Surveying and Mapping Management System by the Taipei City Government Department of Land Administration won first place and the Excellence Award in the Industry Transformation category at the first Spatial Information Sustainability Application Award by The Chinese GeoInformatics Society. The Department of Land Administration was the only administrative agency nationwide to win in this award category.

Taipei City Government won the Excellence Award in the special municipality category for the 2023 Public Facility Pipeline Database and Management Application System Evaluation Implementation Plan.

The Chih-nan Temple Bamboo and Cypress Path Lighting Project won the Gold Award at the 2024 FIABCI-Taiwan Real Estate Excellence Awards, the Gold Award at the American MUSE Design Awards, the Taiwan Design Alliance Special Award at the 2024 Taipei Design Award, and the 2024 Taiwan Environment Lighting Award.



20 Taipei City Government Fire Department, together with Taiwan Society of Emergency, Taiwan Association of EMS Physicians, Taiwan Emergency Medical Technician Association, National Fire Agency, Ministry of the Interior, and New Taipei City Government Fire Department, jointly held Taiwan's first international emergency medical services competition to promote exchange and cooperation, aiming to enhance rescue techniques to save more lives.

24 The Taipei City Government Department for Youth launched its first international students internship program, inviting two students from Harvard University for summer internships. These students engaged in exchanges with local youth and conducted cross-city youth policy analysis, providing policy recommendations. Taipei Mayor Chiang Wan-an shared the program's experience during his September visit to the United States, making the international student internship program a multifaceted initiative connecting international friendship and city diplomacy.

26 The inauguration ceremony of the Taipei City Government Personnel Physical and Mental Health Center was held in conjunction with a Health Carnival. The establishment of the center marked the nation's first to integrate licensed Public Health Specialist, aiming to provide more comprehensive health consultation and care services for both municipal employees and the general public.

28 The Daxue Village Traffic-Friendly Pilot Zone employed a range of traffic engineering techniques to slow vehicles entering the community and to enhance pedestrian safety at intersections. Techniques included adding entrance imagery, adjusting signs and traffic signals, modifying road alignments, and adding speed bumps and pedestrian barriers. After completion, continuous positive feedback has been received from all sectors of society, with other village offices expressing interest in creating traffic-friendly zones.

07 July

01 During the 2024 drought, the Taipei City Government's Feitsui Reservoir supplied 231.9 million tons of water to New Taipei City's Banxin area, stabilizing domestic water supply for six counties and cities in northern Taiwan. The amount of water supplied is equivalent to 1.1 times the effective storage capacity of Shimen Reservoir.

02 Drawing on opinions from experts, scholars, food delivery platform operators, and delivery worker unions, the Taipei City Food Delivery Service Contract Model Clauses were formulated to urge delivery platform operators to pay attention to delivery workers' labor conditions. Platform operators are recommended to incorporate these model clauses into contracts with delivery workers and may establish more favorable labor condition clauses as long as they do not fall below the standards of these model clauses.

05 The Taipei City Government's Department of Civil Servant Development held the "Focus on Sustainability, Innovative Actions" seminar, inviting domestic and international experts and scholars including PASCAL (Place and Social Capital and Learning) International Observatory Chairman Josef Konvitz to focus on sustainability and lifelong learning for international exchange.

10 The Taipei City Government Department of Rapid Transit Systems held a groundbreaking ceremony for the reconstruction project of Taipei City Haoran Senior Citizens Home (Contract IZ0007), demonstrating through action a determination to look after the elderly and to vigorously promote urban renewal.

15 The Taipei City Government completed the handover of city-owned housing allocated from the Lihe Section urban renewal project in Xinyi District, improving police station office environments without any additional financial strain on the city government, increasing numbers of social housing units, and providing a brand-new district community activity center.

15 The Taipei City Government Department of Sports held a groundbreaking ceremony for Xinsheng Sports Center, creating exercise spaces for all citizens, including Taiwan's first composite shooting range and incorporating the wheelchair-friendly Wheelchair Dream Park for disabled sports.

15 Taipei City Labor University was officially launched as the only labor university in Taipei. The university has four colleges and a themed website that integrates learning resources from the Department of Labor and its affiliated agencies. The university offers 12 categories of courses. In 2024, the university had 94 courses, 3,477 class attendees, and 5,026 website members.

18 The Water Intelligence System of eTaipei (WISE) jointly developed by the Taipei Water Department and CECI Engineering Consultants won the Special Achievement in GIS Award (SAG) in San Diego, United States, as recognition for its service quality.

22 The Taipei City Mortuary Services Office's Huai Ai Funeral Parlor (formerly the Second Funeral Parlor) was officially renamed and unveiled.

22 The Taipei City Government announced the Taipei City Self-Government Ordinance for Net-Zero Emissions Management, and comprehensively initiated efforts on climate adaptation and achieving net-zero emissions.

23 The Taipei City Government implemented fiscal discipline, reducing its debt by NT\$9.5 billion cumulatively in 2024. The outstanding debt balance decreased to NT\$72.9 billion, with per capita debt falling from NT\$36,000 at the end of 2022 to NT\$29,000.

27 The Taipei City Government's Indigenous Peoples Commission held the August 1 Indigenous Peoples Week series of events to celebrate the 30th anniversary of the official recognition of August 1st as Indigenous Peoples Day. Activities included SALAMA! Urban Indigenous Cultural Festival, Indigenous Peoples Day Special Exhibition and Unplugged Concert, and Taipei City Indigenous Costume Day. The events concluded on August 4.

08 August

01 Taipei City is actively creating positive parent — teacher communication platforms and reorganizing parent — teacher interaction spaces to facilitate face-to-face exchanges. These efforts aim to support children's growth and have been implemented at 43 elementary schools and 12 junior high schools. In 2024, general classroom environments and facilities were improved for the first time. For example, student lockers in public elementary schools were upgraded. A total of 27 schools were approved, and work will be done on 309 classrooms. Subsidies of approximately NT\$78.14 million have been established.

01 Construction began on a new building for the Taipei Animal Shelter and Animal Protection Office. A groundbreaking ceremony was held on July 29, 2024.

03 The Taipei City Government's Indigenous Peoples Commission held the Taipei Indigenous Peoples Cultural Festival series of events at Flora Expo Park. Activities included music and dance performances, cultural experiences, and Youth Night, and approximately 8,000 citizens attended. The festival enhanced public understanding and respect for indigenous culture and multiculturalism.

08 Taipei Rapid Transit Corporation participated in the 2024 Taiwan Sustainability Action Awards, winning the SDG07 (Affordable Energy) Gold Award for "Enhancing Taipei Metro's Energy Sustainability" and the SDG11 (Sustainable Cities) Bronze Award for "First-Class Metro Carrying Happiness." This demonstrates the company's corporate ambition and positive impact, through active implementation of sustainable development goals to realize the vision of "Go Greener, SHINE Brighter."

14 The nation's first Taipei City Fire Equipment Personnel Professional Ethics Standards was established, inviting representatives from fire protection associations and venue operators to participate in the "Focusing on Fire Safety ESG, Building a Safe and Disaster-Resilient City" Taipei Livability Forum for joint signing, promoting fire safety and environmental, social, and governance concepts through public-private partnerships to build Taipei into a people-centered safe capital.



15 The Taipei City Labor Inspection Office planned the "Multisensory Extended Reality (XR) Occupational Safety Simulation Training Field", which opened on August 15, making Taipei the first special municipality in Taiwan to establish an immersive interactive learning environment, effectively enhancing safety knowledge for high-risk workers.

16 The Rising Star Subsidy Program was announced. This program combines public funds with private venture capital to support high-potential Taipei startups that can compete on the international stage. It provides up to NT\$15 million in subsidies across three stages: research and development, acceleration, and branding, promoting efforts to cultivate unicorns in Taipei's startup scene.

16 Taipei Water Department won the "Award for the most Outstanding Climate Smart Utility" and received the "Certificate of Climate Smart Utilities Initiative - Recognition Program" at the International Water Association World Water Congress & Exhibition in Toronto, Canada. The recognition spans three dimensions: Climate Adaptation, Emission Mitigation, and Leadership, advancing a sustainable development vision with international acclaim.

23 The 2024 Stormwater Drainage System Maintenance Management Evaluation won first place in the special municipality category from the Ministry of the Interior's National Land Management Agency, and Taipei City Government received first place in the special municipality category for the Ministry of Economic Affairs' 2024 Water Conservancy Structure Inspection Evaluation.

30 Taipei Broadcasting Station won the Gold Winner of Interior Design-Renovation category at the 2024 American IAA MUSE Design Awards for its "New Sound Era-Taipei Broadcasting Station Renovation Plan," demonstrating excellent results in generational updates to broadcast equipment and becoming Taiwan's first radio station to win two major awards in international design competitions.

30 The Taipei City Government Department for Youth launched the nation's first Youth Internship Allowance Program, encouraging young people to familiarize themselves with the workplace early in their studies, actively prepare for their career, and accumulate skills and experience for a smooth transition to the workforce. In just 3 months, more than 1,100 applications were received.

09 September

02 To encourage enterprises, legal entities, and government agencies from all sectors to procure products and services from Taipei's startups and small and medium enterprises (SMEs), the Taipei City Government launched the Taipei SME Procurement Program, activating the Taipei-Origin Promotional Station and implementing related registration, recruitment, and procurement matching measures.

02 The organizational regulation and the personnel establishment table of Taipei City Land Offices were revised and published, taking effect from January 1, 2025, making it the first agency nationwide to complete and adopt a shared personnel establishment table.

02 TRENDY TAIPEI-Music X Innovation was the first pilot attempt to combine a three-in-one model of industry forums, concert economics, and city action, integrating public and private sector resources to attract private sector participation and create synergistic effects. With city marketing as its core, the event aimed to create an urban lifestyle brand unique to Taipei. The event ran until September 8.

04 Taipei Mayor Chiang Wan-an led a delegation to New York, Boston, Philadelphia, and New Jersey in the United States to examine local urban and transportation planning, industrial development, and artificial intelligence applications and to conduct youth exchanges. The delegation met with local dignitaries and held meetings with Mayor Michelle Wu of Boston, Taipei's sister city, during a visit that lasted until September 14.

04

To welcome the 2025 Taipei–New Taipei World Masters Games, the Taipei City Government's Department of Civil Servant Development held its first "Exploring the International Village - Japan-Korea Cultural Seminar," followed by seminars on the cultures of Singapore, Malaysia, and Indonesia and of the United States and Canada on November 15 and December 13 respectively, with a total of 325 people completing training.

06

Taipei City Government and Lienchiang County Government jointly held the Taipei & Lienchiang 5G Ambulance Video Joint Defense Launch Ceremony. This system enables Taipei's Paramedic to provide online guidance through real-time audio-visual transmission, improving the quality of prehospital emergency care in Lienchiang County.

09

The Taipei City Government took the national lead in promulgating the Taipei City Government Guidelines for Artificial Intelligence Operations, providing application principles, operational procedures, and review standards for the utilization of artificial intelligence across Taipei's various agencies. The guideline seeks to ensure the efficiency and safety of artificial intelligence technology in municipal operations while promoting smart governance and public services.

18

From September 18 to 21, 2024, Taipei City Government hosted the 16th City Net Disaster Cluster Conference. The theme of the conference was People-Centered Resilient Cities, and the conference brought together more than 250 participants from 13 cities across 10 countries and 12 organizations, as well as domestic experts and scholars from industry, government, and academia in disaster prevention and response.

19

Newlyweds And Parenting Family Social Housing project was announced. This project uses diversified public-private mixed housing resources to provide rentals for newlyweds who have been married for less than 2 years or families with children aged up to 6 years. The project helps reduce the financial burden of accommodation on young people and allows them to start a family, have children, and move in. On October 30, the first public rental announcement was made for 156 units across 4 locations, receiving a total of 1,966 applications.

19

The Taipei City Government's Department of Budget, Accounting, and Statistics conducted the 2023 Family Income and Expenditure Survey and received the Outstanding Group Award after evaluation by the Executive Yuan's Directorate-General of Budget, Accounting, and Statistics.



With integrity, transparency, and trust as core values, the agency promotes sustainable development, demonstrating Taipei City's leading position in technology and honest governance while showcasing Taiwan's edge in government transparency before a global audience.

The 2024 National Day Celebration in Taipei was a grand affair held on October 5 at the Taipei Dome, marking the first large-scale nonsporting event at the venue. In addition to inviting foreign envoys, overseas Chinese, and distinguished guests, tickets were specially made available to the public, with a second venue, television, and online broadcasts arranged for everyone to celebrate the Republic of China's birthday together.

11

Taipei City Mayor Chiang Wan-an and Matsuyama City Mayor Noshi Katsuhito jointly signed a friendship city agreement. Building on existing friendly relations, the cities will further expand exchanges in areas including youth, innovative technology, environmental sustainability, and the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals.

15

Taipei City Mayor Chiang Wan-an and Taiwan Creative Content Agency Chairman Tsai Chia-chun signed a memorandum of cooperation. They will combine resources to promote various collaborations, comprehensively supporting Taipei City's cultural and creative industry development while further promoting the city's unique culture and international image, hoping to jointly provide more resources and opportunities for cultural content industry partners.

16

The Taipei City Government's Department for Youth promoted the "International Young Artist Exchange Program," inviting three international graffiti artists from the Netherlands, Spain, and Belgium to Taipei for artist residencies. They collaborated with local communities to create new landscapes in Taipei City, revitalizing buildings and public spaces while allowing resident artists to exchange and share creative concepts and experiences with youth and local residents.

19

The Taipei City Government's Department of Civil Affairs and the City God Temple of Taipei City cohosted and jointly invited the Taipei Xia-hai City God Temple, Taipei Fu Cheng Huang Temple, Songshan Xia-hai City God Temple, Baoxia Temple, and other Taipei City temples that worship the City God to hold the first-ever joint celebration in a century: "Taipei City's 140th Anniversary - Incense Procession for Welcoming the City God."

In the Ministry of the Interior's 2024 supervision and evaluation of land administration operations by municipalities and county and city governments, Taipei City won the Excellence Award for overall evaluation in the municipality category.

25

The Taipei City Government received the Taiwan Geospatial One Stop Distribution Service Award in the 2024 annual performance of the Ministry of the Interior for value-added applications and affiliated units of the Taiwan Geospatial One Stop Information Cloud Service Platform. This honor bears witness to Taipei City's leadership and continuous innovation in the field of geographic information applications.

26

Taipei's delegation participated in the 2024 Citizens Sports Games held in Pingtung County, implementing a selecting, training, competition, and award program for Citizens Sports Games. Through establishing systematic resource support for athletes, Taipei ultimately won 64 gold, 51 silver, and 65 bronze medals, earning the Presidential Award and reclaiming the Citizens Sports Games championship after a 10-year hiatus, achieving a domestic "near grand slam." The games concluded on October 30.

The Taipei City Government's Hakka Affairs Commission organized the 2024 Taipei Hakka Yimin Festival, which was attended in-person by more than 125,000 individuals and virtually by more than 20,000 online live stream viewers. The festival ended on October 28.

The nonprofit kindergarten for employees' children at Taipei City Hall (operated by the Public Service Association in Taipei) participated in the Executive Yuan's Directorate-General of Personnel Administration's 2024 Public Sector Workplace Childcare Facility Evaluation and won the Excellence Award in the nonprofit kindergarten category.

The Taipei City Government's Department of Budget, Accounting, and Statistics represented Taipei City in the competition of "City of Excellence 2024", winning the First Place in the Environmental Protection category with the theme Creating Taipei's Climate Budget and Climate Change Monitoring Indicators.

The Taipei City Government's Feitsui Reservoir Environmental Education Site received the Excellence Award in the Ministry of Environment's 2024 annual evaluation.

Taipei City Government Department of Information Technology stood out among 142 competing agencies nationwide by claiming the nation's first government open-source information technology service initiative "Digital Public Service New Benchmark — Taipei City Dashboard Open-source Project." It also won both the National Development Council's Seventh Government Service Award for value-added services of digital innovation and the Special Excellence Award for local agencies in the Directorate-General of Personnel Administration's 2024 Benchmark Learning Cases.

An unveiling ceremony was held for the first electric multiple unit train of the Taipei MRT Wanda-Zhonghe-Shulin line (Phase I) upon its arrival in Taiwan.

12

The announcement and implementation of the Detailed Plan for the Taipei City Thermal Comfort Cooling Project for Development Sites, pioneering the nationwide promotion of city-wide building additions (including balconies, terraces, double-layer vegetated shading wall, and other vertical greenery and continuous canopy facilities, creating comfortable indoor, outdoor, and public spaces.

15

To reward older adult for their dedication to volunteer services, promote mutual care and assistance, and establish benchmark learning models, the Taipei City Government established the 2024 Lifetime Achievement Award for Volunteer Service Selection Plan, holding the Diamond Award ceremony on November 15, with six elderly volunteers receiving this honor.

15

In cooperation with the Taipei District Prosecutors Office, Taipei successfully broke up a Taiwanese forgery-fraud ring modeled after the TV series Tokyo Swindlers, intercepting criminal proceeds of more than NT\$140 million. By putting together a security network involving land tax, police, judicial, and real estate assets, launching on-site mortgage registration care services, and pioneering the nationwide Taipei Land Administration Manager+ system that provides real-time real estate information queries, Taipei has become a bulwark for real estate security.



21

Mini Cultural Trips in Taipei released 70 cultural sites, produced 5 short films, connected 36 leisure travel routes in Taipei. The event featured renowned Japanese photographer Kobayashi Kengo, who explored everyday life in Taipei and photographed 16 selected cultural sites. A photography exhibition was held at the fire hydrant boxes in Songshan Cultural and Creative Park.

23

The Taipei City Government Department of Education allocated an average of NT\$4 billion annually from 2024 to 2030 to promote 30 school reconstruction projects. In 2024, two schools were completed (Neihu Elementary School and Neihu Junior High School). The new Xiaoti Building at Neihu Elementary School is Taipei's first diamond-level green building, oriented toward sustainability literacy and integrated with curriculum design to create a next-generation smart sustainable campus.

24

To promote youth participation in public affairs and cultivate cross-disciplinary thinking, problem-solving, and teamwork abilities, the Taipei City Government Department for Youth pioneered the Public Policy Creative Proposal and Debate Competition with the theme "Future Land Use Planning of Taipei's First Funeral Parlor," allowing youth creativity and critical thinking to spark more public policy ideas, attracting 150 outstanding young people and 37 entries.



The film was also nominated for four awards across two film festivals and selected for inclusion in 11 film festivals, including the American Women Filmmakers Festival.

04

The Taipei MRT Circular line Phase I Public Art event organized by the Taipei City Government's Department of Rapid Transit Systems won the Ministry of Culture's 9th Public Art Awards Excellence Award.

06

The 1st Clean Water Main Pipeline (Zhonghe and Yonghe Chenggong Road PCCP) Backup Main Pipeline Turnkey Project organized by Taipei Water Department won the Executive Yuan's 24th Public Construction Golden Quality Award for Water Resources Engineering - Excellence Award.

09

In response to frequent cases of cross-border online shopping fraud, the Taipei City Government collaborated with convenience stores to implement new antifraud package measures. Taipei Mayor Chiang Wan-an presented awards at the December 9 public security meeting to recognize convenience store operators who actively cooperated with the agency in developing antifraud policies, working together through public-private partnerships to combat fraud and further protect consumer rights.

The first 2024 Taipei Integrity Award Ceremony was held to recognize winning agencies and present completion certificates for corporate integrity workshops, promoting the core values of sustainable governance, openness and transparency, risk management, and clean innovation and opening a new chapter in Taipei's integrity governance model through public-private cooperation.

Starting from Taipei City Hall Plaza, the event included 8,643 marathon runners and 17,401 half-marathon runners and attracted approximately 4,433 international athletes from 55 countries, setting a new record.

The Taipei City Government's Department of Transportation established the nation's first pedestrian priority zone at Lane 9, Alley 175, Jiaxing Street, Xinyi District, Taipei.

The Department of Health, Taipei City Government and Shanghai Municipal Health Commission jointly signed a Taipei-Shanghai Memorandum of understanding on Promoting Smart Healthcare to promote medical digitalization and enhance citizen health and welfare.

The Taipei City Government's Secretariat organized the 2024 Taipei-Shanghai City Forum with the theme Smart Governance for a Sustainable Future. Three subforums, with the themes Friendly Transportation, River Management, and Humanistic City, were also held. Two cooperation memorandums on Smart Healthcare and Wildlife Exchange and Conservation were signed, facilitating cross-strait city exchanges and municipal learning.



19 The Taipei City Government's Department of Budget, Accounting, and Statistics handling of 2024 local government official statistics was awarded Special Excellence in the Special Municipality Government category after evaluation by the Executive Yuan's Directorate-General of Budget, Accounting, and Statistics.

20 To connect the festive atmosphere and excitement from Christmas to New Year's, an event was held at Taipei Dome called the Taipei Dome Christmas & New Year Celebration Event. The event involved year-end concert performances by A-Mei, who was performing at Taipei Dome for the first time, and showcased the economic potential of Taipei Dome. Vouchers worth NT\$200 each were distributed that shoppers can use at local businesses and night markets, and special offers from participating stores were available. These vouchers and special offers attracted the public to the concert and encouraged people to shop at local stores.







◆ Land Area and Climate

Taipei City was upgraded to a centrally administered municipality under the Executive Yuan, R.O.C. in July 1967. After several boundary readjustments, the land area of Taipei City was 271.7997 square kilometers at the end of 2024. The population density of the city was 9,164 persons per square kilometer, ranking first in the country and far exceeding other cities and counties. Compared to other Asian cities, the population density was higher than those of Hong Kong, Fukuoka and Istanbul.

Taipei City is located in the subtropical zone with year-round rain and no obvious dry season. The climate is usually damp and cold during the wintertime due to the influence of the northeast monsoon. The temperature rises during the summertime, since Taipei City is located in a basin that does not allow for easy heat dissipation. The mean temperature of Taipei City in 2024 was 24.0°C. The highest and lowest monthly mean temperatures were respectively 30.1°C in July and 16.9°C in January showing a gap of 13.2°C. The annual number of precipitation days was 151 days and overall precipitation was 2,393.0 millimeters in 2024, which was an increase of 33.87% compared to 2023.

◆ Population Profile

The registered population in Taipei City was 1.60 million when its urban districts were restructured and expanded in 1968. The population had increased to 2.49 million by the end of 2024, an increase of approximately 56% for 1968. Having generally decreased, the sex ratio was less than 90 males to 100 females and was the lowest among the cities and counties in the nation by the end of 2024. The female population exceeded the male population, as was the case in Tokyo and Hong Kong. In terms of age, the proportion of the elderly had been increasing annually, while the proportion of the young had been decreasing. By the end of 2024, the dependency ratio was 54.39, higher than those of Seoul and Singapore, and the aging index increased to 189.57.

Two factors influence the fluctuation of the total population: natural increase (births and deaths) and social increase (in-migration and out-migration). The natural increase rate of Taipei City in 2024 was -1.04‰, and the social increase rate was -7.36‰. Hence, the total population at the end of 2024 decreased by 21,017 persons compared to that at the end of 2023, with a population growth rate -8.37‰.

◆ Marriage and Fertility Profile

According to household registration, in terms of the marital status of Taipei citizens aged 15 and over by the end of 2024, the unmarried constituted 33.77% of the population, the married 51.46%, the divorced 8.34%, and the widowed 6.42%. Compared to those by the end of 2023, the percentages of the unmarried, divorced, and widowed increased by 0.06, 0.11, and 0.08 percentage points, respectively; the percentage of the married decreased by 0.27 percentage points.

In 2024, there were 13,124 couples registering for marriage in Taipei City, and 10.55% of newly married persons were originally from Mainland China, Hong Kong, Macau and other countries. The crude marriage rate and the crude divorce rate were 5.25‰ and 1.90‰, respectively. The number of live births in Taipei City was 17,122 with the ratio of male infants to female infants being 107.64. The average age of the mothers at child birth was 34.38 years old. The total fertility rate of childbearing age women (15 to 49 years old) was 1,055‰ in 2024. In other words, there would be 1.055 children born to a woman over her lifetime on average. The total fertility rate of Taipei City was higher than that of Hong Kong.

◆ Labor and Employment

The labor force in Taipei City for 2024 was 1.222 million persons (0.642 million males and 0.580 million females), which was about 2 thousand persons higher than the figure for 2023. The labor force participation rate was 55.6%, which was 0.1 percentage point lower than 2023 and lower than the nationwide rate of 59.3%. The rate was also lower than those of Singapore and Hong Kong in recent years. The number of unemployed was 42 thousand persons in Taipei City for 2024, which was 1 thousand persons lower than 2023; and the unemployment rate was 3.5%.

Among the general employment services conducted by the Taipei City Government in 2024, there were 68,291 job seekers employed through referrals, and employers hired a total of 90,118 persons. Hence, the ratio of applicant placements was 86.90%, a 5.06 percentage point increase compared to that of 2023, and the ratio of occupied vacancies was 55.51%, showing a 9.95 percentage point increase compared to the figure for 2023.

◆ Industry, Commerce, Finance, and Economics

The number of registered business enterprises in Taipei City reached a total of 274,654 firms by the end of 2024, an increase of 3,024 firms from the end of 2023. The sales volume of registered business enterprises was NTD 18.39 trillion in 2024, which was a 7.36 % increase compared to 2023. There were 180,541 registered companies in Taipei by the end of 2024, an increase of 2,948 on 2023. The number of foreign companies with branch offices and representative offices which registered in Taipei reached a total of 6,687 firms by the end of 2024, a decrease of 85 on 2023.

The general budget of the revenue of Taipei Municipal Government for 2024 was NTD 215.27 billion and expenditure was NTD 204.98 billion. The actual amount of collected city taxes in 2024 was NT 80.04 billion, an increase of NTD 3.72 billion on 2023. The actual amount of collected national taxes in 2024 was NTD 1,255.75 billion, an increase of NTD 119.57 billion from 2023.

◆ Education and Culture

In the 2024 academic year (AY), there were a total of 303 public and private schools at all levels in Taipei City. The number of students has been decreasing every year, with 503,883 students in AY 2024, which decreased 1.11% compared to AY 2023. As for primary and junior high schools, the average number of students per teacher was 11.54 persons in AY 2024, and the average number of students per class was 27.12 persons, showing a decrease of 0.06 person and an increase of 0.03 person compared to AY 2023 respectively.

The gross enrollment rate for primary education in Taipei City was 88.62% in AY 2024. The rate of college-educated or above of the population aged 15 and over has steadily risen in recent years, with a rate of 65.72% at the end of 2024, which increased by 0.60 percentage points compared to that at the end of 2023. Furthermore, the literacy rate of the population aged 15 and over was 99.73%.

Figures with respect to art exhibitions and cultural performances organized by the Department of Cultural Affairs, Taipei City Government with its subordinate agencies, as well as the attendance at these events, have shown a yearly increase. In 2024, a total of 14,805 art exhibitions and cultural performances were organized, which were 2,609 times more than those organized in 2023; the attendance at these exhibitions and performances was 12.76 million person-times, increased 2.02 million on 2023.

◆ Social Welfare

There were 21,202 low-income households with 40,678 persons in Taipei City at the end of 2024, about 1.63% of the city population. There were 120,711 physically and mentally disabled persons, constituting 4.85% of the city population. A total of 1,004 daycare centers cared for 78,541 children in Taipei at the end of 2024. Moreover, 94 public and private long-term senior cares and senior homes housed 4,408 persons. There were separately 4,983,653 person-times and 399,196 person-times served for the senior household services and day-care services in 2024.

Taipei City has endeavored to build a friendly living environment by establishing systems to take care of the elderly and the disabled through the professional, diverse, accessible and extensive welfare services. In 2024, the welfare budget for each citizen was NTD 14,305 on average.

◆ Public Health

At the end of 2024, there were 3,964 public and private hospitals and clinics in Taipei City. The number of sickbeds per 10,000 population was 105 beds, which was higher than those of Hong Kong, Seoul in Asia. The numbers of medical personnel, ambulances, and pharmaceutical firms per 10,000 population were 194 persons, 0.77 vehicle, and 59 establishments, respectively. Compared to those at the end of 2023, the numbers of sickbeds, medical personnel, ambulances and pharmaceutical firms per 10,000 population remained unchanged with 0 bed, increased with 6 persons, 0.01 vehicle, and 1 establishment.

The crude birth rate of Taipei City was 6.85‰, and the crude death rate was 7.89‰ in 2024. The infant mortality rate of Taipei City was 3.96‰ in 2023, which was a little higher than those of Hong Kong and Seoul in Asia. Furthermore, the average life expectancy at birth in Taipei City in 2023 was 83.32 years, 0.43 year decrease of 2022. Male life expectancy was 80.58 years, whereas it was 86.00 years for females, 5.42 years longer than males.

◆ Public Security

A total of 48,250 criminal cases were reported in Taipei City in 2024. The crime rate was 1,928.94 cases per 100,000 population. The clearance rate was 81.65%. Larceny cases were 10.88% of total criminal cases. The crime rate of larceny cases was 209.88 cases per 100,000 population. The associated clearance rate was 84.55%. The crime rate of larceny cases has been lower than that of Hong Kong in recent years.

In terms of fraudulent crime, the cases were 22.05% of total criminal cases in 2024. The rate of fraudulent crime in 2024 was 425.33 cases per 100,000 population. Of all fraudulent crime cases, the clearance rate was 55.47%. In terms of violent crime, the cases were 0.09% of total criminal cases in 2024. The rate of violent crime in 2024 was 1.68 cases per 100,000 population. Of all violent crime cases, the clearance rate was 97.62%. At the end of 2024, there were 31.13 policemen per 10,000 population in Taipei City, 0.01 persons less than those at the end of 2023.

◆ Public Safety

In terms of traffic accidents, there were 21.88 thousand cases of motor vehicle accidents (causing injuries or deaths within 30 days) in Taipei City in 2024, or 123.69 case per 10,000 vehicles and 0.48 death per 10,000 population, showing an increase of 0.04 person more than that of 2023.

In terms of fire safety, the number of firefighters in Taipei City was 3,869 (including volunteer firefighters) at the end of 2024, or 15.53 firefighters per 10,000 population. There were 717 fire trucks of all types, or 2.88 such vehicles per 10,000 population. There occurred 1,137 fire accidents with 1.06 fire accidents per 1,000 households in Taipei City in 2024. There were 66 casualties (6 deaths and 60 injuries) and 251 households burned down or damaged, with NTD 11.68 million estimated property loss in fire accidents. Compared to 2023, both the number of fire accidents, the number of damaged houses, and property losses all showed a decrease.

◆ Transportation

At the end of 2024, there were 840,017 automobiles registered with an average of 337 automobiles per 1,000 population in Taipei City, and 928,634 motorcycles registered in Taipei City with an average of 373 motorcycles per 1,000 population. There were respectively 818,928 and 885,547 public and private parking spaces for automobiles and motorcycles in Taipei City, and both had increased on the number for 2023.

Taipei City Government has continued its efforts to develop public transportation and improve transportation networks. The average number of daily passengers taking the Taipei MRT in 2024 was 2.03 million, showing an increase of 81 thousand ones on 2023. The average number of daily bus passengers in Taipei in 2024 was 1.09 million, an increase of 20 thousand ones when compared to 2023. Meanwhile, as of the end of 2024, there were 1,505 rental stations providing 22,265 rental bicycles under the YouBike Rental Service Program launched by the city government to build an eco-friendly city. On average, these bicycles were rented with 178,727 times per day, an increase of 52,357 times on 2023.

◆ Environmental Protection

Taipei City began enforcing the policy "Per-Bag Trash Collection Fee" since July 2000. The volume of municipal waste generated has been decreasing, whereas the amount of recycling has been increasing. In 2024, Taipei City's municipal waste generated was 431.79 kg per capita, which was a decrease of 109.64 kg (-20.25%) compared to 1999 prior to the implementation of the levy on garbage bags. The annual per capita amount of recycled garbage was 286.10 kg, an increase of 277.41 kg (31.9 times) on 1999.

In terms of air quality, the average monthly dust fall per square kilometer in Taipei City in 2024 was 2.68 tons, which was an increase of 0.32 ton on 2023. The density of suspended particulates in the air was 29.75 micrograms per cubic meter, a decrease of 1.57 microgram on 2023. In terms of wastewater sample inspection, the qualified rate of wastewater sample inspection from enterprises in Taipei City in 2024 was 96.20%. Besides, the percentage of population served by wastewater treatment plants was 89.17% at the end of 2024, 0.69 percentage points increase on that at the end of 2023.

◆ Public Works

Taipei City has demonstrated small-scale stable growth in terms of public works, such as roads, green resources area and tap water. At the end of 2024, the road area was 22.38 million square meters, an increase of 1.7 thousand square meters from 22.38 million square meters at the end of 2023 in Taipei City. The green resources area was 139.11 million square meters, 0.84 million square meters more than that of 2023. Monthly per capita volume of tap water supply was 20,140 liters in 2024.

To assure the quality of roads and safety of road users, Taipei City continued the improvement of road surfaces and sidewalks. In 2024, there had 758.5 thousand square meters of the road surfaces and 55.9 thousand square meters of sidewalks been improved. The household sewer connection rate was 82.80% at the end of 2024, a 0.79 percentage point increase from the end of 2023.

◆ Family Living

According to the latest "Report on the Family Income and Expenditure Survey in Taipei" results, the amount of per household disposable income in Taipei City in 2023 was NTD 1,448,219. If the number of households is divided into 5 groups according to the level of disposable income, the disposable income in the highest group was 4.70 multiples of the lowest, the amount of per capita disposable income was NTD 540,380. In terms of the structure of family spending, the highest amount was that for food and beverage spending (including eating outside) with 28.53%, and housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels, which took up 28.38% of total consumption expenditures was the second. The average living space per capita was approximately 34.98 square meters. Home ownership rate among the citizens was 84.17%.

In 2024, the per capita daily living water consumption and monthly electricity consumption of Taipei City were 331 liters and 255.40 kWh, respectively, both showing an increase of 1 liter and 5.10 kWh compared to 2023. The consumer price index (CPI) in Taipei City in 2024 was 108.73 (base year: 2021 = 100), an increase of 1.80% from 2023.

◆ Digital City

In order to make municipal services more convenient for the citizens, Taipei City Government is devoted to promoting application services, such as mobile government, mobile transportation, mobile learning, mobile guides, and mobile recreation, etc., which are built upon the foundation of a wireless city, allowing the citizens to enjoy boundless municipal services. As of the end of 2024, the city government's mobile service apps had been downloaded 14.94 million person-times. The accumulated number of users for Taipei Free was 238.62 million by the end of 2024.

For Taipei City Government website services, the average number of daily visitors to the Taipei City Government's website was 25,777, increasing 6,823 visitors in 2023. Based on the publication and sharing, Taipei City Government had integrated and established an open information platform for the public to encourage utilizing the value-added applications on the platform. As of the end of 2024, there were 2,857 interfacing services provided and the accumulated use reached 4.23 billion times. The Smart Payment Platform—pay.taipei provides payment mechanisms via web, App and counter services. The number of bills for pay.taipei 22.86 million cases, amounting to NTD 4,782.62 million in 2024.
