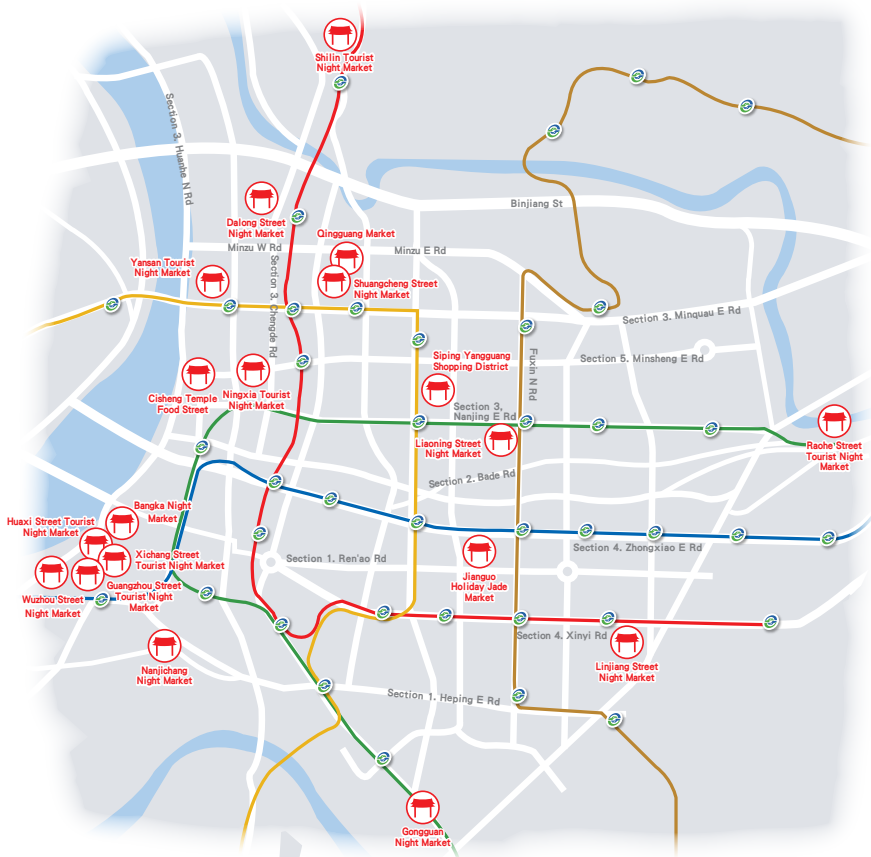

Huaxi Street Tourist Night Market



People pass through the vermilion archways during the day, and lanterns hang from above at night to give the streets a palatial look. With an endless stream of people passing through these archways, the lively Huaxi Street Night Market is the first tourist night market in Taiwan.

Huaxi Street became the most historic block in Taipei City due to the flourishing “Fucheng, Lugang and Bangka” era and has witnessed the many changes of Wanhua District. Even though it no longer has the advantage of a river port, the Huaxi Street Tourist Night Market is still one of the three major tourist destinations of foreigners visiting Taiwan. People that want to come and enjoy good food at the night market with friends and family can also visit the Bangka Qingshan Temple, Qingshui Zushi Temple, Longshan Temple, and other historical attractions and try out various culinary delicacies.

During its heyday, Huaxi Street Night Market was famous for its “Snake Alley,” which has gradually declined due to legal restrictions and the public’s awareness of animal protection. However, when night falls, people walking to Huaxi Street Night Market are immediately struck by the scent of classic dishes such as danzai noodles and stewed shrimps. Wang’s Broth and Yuanfang Guabao are highly coveted by foodies, and the older generation looks to get their supplementary foods by having snake soup, snake blood, and turtle soup. People who want to take a break after filling their stomachs can visit the many foot massage parlors, and relax at the hands of the masterful massagers!

The 70-meter night market offers lots of tasty and delicious foods. An inconspicuous street during the day, it is a great place for mouth-watering food at night.

Walking into the night market from the northern section of Wuzhou Street, there's an entire row of colorful signs. As aromas gradually stimulate peoples' taste buds, people start to think about all of the unforgettable delicacies. The "Hometown Flavored Mushroom and Pig's Feet" stall has piles of glossy pork feet and hock with tender textures and rich in flavor. Before you realize it, you'll have already downed a couple bowls.

With the wide variety of food stalls at Wuzhou Street Night Market, people often have difficulty choosing from the dazzling array of foods, but the most special "local" food is definitely the "frog soup"! Even though people are met with the shocking sight of an intact frog inside the bowl, the soup actually tastes delicious as there's a rich amount of garlic fused into the broth, and the aroma of the basil brings out the sweetness of the frog meat. This novel and delicious dish is truly unforgettable!

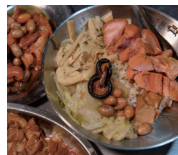

The Age-Old Fragrance of Herbs Still Lingers

Xichang Street Tourist Night Market



Stepping into Xichang Street, people are immediately enticed by the rich old fragrances. In addition to classic Taiwanese snacks, there are also many stalls selling clothes and daily necessities, as the simple daily life on Xichang Street plays on repeat like a recurring slideshow.

At 6 or 7 o'clock in the morning, there are already many food stall vendors at Xichang Street selling old-fashioned steamed sticky rice, fried noodles, and fried rice noodles. There are already many people who have gotten out of bed to queue up for these foods, hoping to start their days right with a refreshing meal. Turning into Lane 224 of Xichang Street, there's the famous "Herb Alley" that's open from morning till nightfall, with the fragrance of the herbs filling the air, expounding how the ancestors lived their lives. Due to the lack of resources in the past, the people who cultivated Bangka were mostly treated with herb juices when they fell sick. Legend has it that the herbs from Herb Alley were the most effective, and the alley was even known as "Lifesaver Alley." Even now, many people still come here to look for herbs and spices. The stalls on Xichang Street are divided into two areas: the stalls on the south side mainly sell daily groceries, underwear and daily necessities; the stalls on the north side are for people who are tired from shopping and want to enjoy a filling meal and have some delicious local delicacies such as Xichang Street tofu pudding, pot stickers, stinky tofu, and the well-known Dongshishun oyster omelet.

Bangka Night Market in Wanhua District is also known as Wanhua Night Market. It was an important development area in the early days of Taipei. During the day, people can visit the historic buildings in the area such as the Bopiliao Historic Block, and Longshan Temple which has prospered since the Qing Dynasty is also nearby. This is why the night market has delicious dishes from the past have been preserved, such as tanghulu (sugar-coated fruit sticks) which in the past were a favorite of children from every household. Covered in a crunchy coat of sugar and coupled with tomato and preserved fruit, it makes for a tasty treat loved by people of all ages.

During the evening, the time-honored Dingtop1 Tempura and Liangxihao Spicy Squid Potage are two traditional snacks that foodies must check out. The pieces of fresh squid paired with rich potage combine to create a tasty snack that has been passed down by Liangxihao for four generations. Dingtop1 Tempura not only has the appearance of a traditional tempura food stall, it also comes with an exclusive sauce that goes with its tempura. The many people queuing make it evident how unforgettably delicious their offerings are. In winter, don't forget to visit Bangka Night Market with some friends to taste the most authentic delicacies here.

Nanjichang Night Market



People who come to Nanjichang Night Market will always be able to satisfy their need for good food. Even though it's somewhat inconvenient to get there, the night market still attracts old and new customers to come visit this wonderful place for food. There are vendors in the morning, afternoon and evening, but Nanjichang is especially lively at night as there are endless streams of people looking to satisfy their cravings.

During the day, there are already many people queuing up for Shantou Dry Noodles, rice noodle soup, and thick rice noodles... The vendors strictly stick to their business hours, so people who miss out will have to queue up earlier the following day. The area was used as a training ground during the period of Japanese rule, and was even briefly used as an aircraft take-off and landing site. The area of the night market was named Taipei South Airport to differentiate it from the Taipei North Airport (Songshan Airport). In 1964, Nanjichang Public Housing was built to provide housing for military families and propel regional development, giving birth to the bazaars and night markets. The foods sold at the night market have hardly changed throughout the years as they aren't looking to keep up with trends and vendors insist on the culinary culture of cooking solid food. Lai Lai Dumpling House with its long queues, the Changhua meatballs reported by CNN, the old-fashioned charcoal grilled corn stall that has stood for 30 years, and the simple but classic unnamed old-fashioned clay oven roll cart are all reasons for people to visit the night market again.

The afternoon passes by in the blink of an eye and nightfall is just around the corner as students go to Gongguan Night Market to have late-night snacks, go on long-awaited movie dates, and transportation is convenient even for the foreign students learning Chinese as the everyone can go back home after a fun night out at the comprehensive Gongguan shopping district.

Gongguan Night Market is located in the Gongguan shopping district and is bustling from lunchtime on. As it's situated next to various schools, it has become the first choice amongst students for food, clothing, and entertainment, giving rise to a night market that includes every variety of business. In addition to the indispensable and delicious food, there are many sporting good and general merchandise stores as well. The area also has plenty of bookstores, so it can be regarded as quite a convenient night market that covers every function. In 2020, the Taipei City Government promoted the "Long-Term Vendors Improvement Plan" to enhance the image of night market vendors by standardizing the regulations for smoke extraction equipment, product prices, signboards, and stall spaces. Not only have the streets become more spacious, but the cooking smells have been reduced significantly as well, providing Gongguan Night Market with a refreshing and new atmosphere. People looking for delicious food can check out the Big Vegetable Egg Pancakes, Hsiung Chi Scallion Pancake, Yumimei Fried Dumplings, Alian Japanese Wheel Cakes, the nearby Lanjia Traditional Taiwanese Gua bao offering fat or lean meat for even more tastiness, Jiaxing Fish Balls, Longtan Soybean Pudding... People might have to take some time to think about what they're going to feast on.

Compared to tourist night markets, Jingmei Night Market isn't very big, but it's simple and lovable. Its laid-back atmosphere spreads throughout Jingmei Street at night as there are no exquisite exteriors or gorgeous archways, so people can simply enjoy the delicious food while feeling nostalgic about visiting night markets as children.

The hustle and bustle of the market cuts through the serenity of Jingmei's morning. This simple daily life can be traced back to hundreds of years ago. During the Xianfeng era of the Qing Dynasty, ancestors built the Jingmei Jiying Temple, and the temple was moved to its current location during the Tongzhi era to draw bigger crowds and create a shopping district, laying the foundation for life in the area. In 1919, Jingmei Market was officially established. It wasn't until 1961 that the area around the Market gradually turned into a night market and underwent changes to become the current Jingmei Night Market. Even though Jingmei Night Market is small in size, it has plenty to offer, from Shanghai pan-fried buns to affordable BBQ skewers and teppanyaki, all of them favorites of the locals. The Bib Gourmand entries such as Jingmei Rice Noodle Soup and Emama Soup Noodles are must-try items as well. In addition, the night market's convenient and accessible location makes it very attractive, as it's very close to MRT Jingmei Station, and is lively throughout the day and night.

The Riverside and the City that Never Sleeps

Raohe Street Tourist Night Market



Eat local snacks, feast on Taiwanese culture, and immerse yourself in the romance of the river... After nightfall, the brightly illuminated Raohe Street Night Market is like a book that includes everything there is to know about this land.

Vermillion lanterns hang from the high archways, and there are neon lights in various colors everywhere, the eye-catching signs on both sides of Raohe Street Night Market visible from a distance. As people prepare to walk towards the entrance of the night market, there are also crowds of people coming out. This place was formerly known as Xikou and it used to be the concentrated business district of Neihu, Nangang, and Songshan, also known as Little Suzhou. The siltation of Keelung River, the widening of Bade Road, and other factors gradually led to the decline of the area. The government moved the stalls under Nansongshan Bridge here in 1987 to reinvigorate the livelihood of the area, and Raohe Street Night Market came into existence. Every night, the pedestrian area is filled with people as the shops and vendors are brightly lit and open for business, the aroma from the delicious food fills the air, seemingly recreating the liveliness of years past. The Fuzhou Ancestor Pepper Pies, the Chen Dong Medicine Stewed Pork Ribs, the Xiagang Famous Paul Stinky Tofu, and many other delicious foods are all worth trying out. There are also traditional craftspeople making Chinese Dragon Beard Candy and dough figurines, reminding people of their childhood memories. People who are tired from shopping around in the night market shouldn't leave in a hurry, and should just go over to the Rainbow Bridge embankment to take a break and let the tranquility of the waterfront calm down their restless emotions.

Located in the heart of urban Taipei, Linjiang Street Night Market has an excellent geographical location while also having the tranquility that can be found in alleys. Situated in the middle of a bustling shopping district, the night market comes to life at night with crowds of people coming in and out of the place. There are always many office workers coming to the night market after work to shake off the day and shuffle between the stalls to reward themselves with delicious food for their hard work.

Linjiang Street Night Market was formerly known as “Tonghua Street Night Market,” originating from the rise of the Hakka settlements and Tonghua Village. Due to its proximity to Xinyi Shopping District and the presence of office buildings around it, the night market is also easily accessible for travelers. With plenty of delicious and affordable traditional snacks, the night market’s entrance is located at the intersection of Keelung Road and Linjiang Street with a comfortable and clean walking area. The aroma of the Shanghai pan-fried buns and pot stickers are quite enticing, and there’s always a long queue of people that want to eat them. The sweet potato balls are tender and crunchy, and they are sold out the moment they leave the pan. The proprietor doesn’t have time to collect money, so customers have to get their own change or plastic bags. Tonghua Meatballs has been in business nearby for nearly 60 years, and is quite authentic for Changhua meatballs in Taipei, and it’s one of the most representative foods in Linjiang Street Night Market. In addition, Ice in Wonderland is not just a shop with a dreamy name, but the glossy texture of its signature grass jelly means that it is made naturally, which is definitely worth checking out. Go now and enjoy the comfort of delicacies during urban nightfall at Linjiang Street Night Market.

People get to explore the history of Taipei as they visit Taipei Confucius Temple and Baoan Temple. There is a profound amount of cultural heritage in the Dalongdong Cultural and Historical District which adds a touch of charm and elegance to Dalong Street Night Market. During the Daoguang and Tongzhi eras of the Qing Dynasty, the area produced a large amount of local talent, the residents believing that this was a "Dragon Cave." The residents treated Yuanshan as the head and Hami Street as the tail, which is where the name of Dalongdong came from. Dalong Street looks a bit different during different times of the day; during the morning, it's filled with food vendors servicing people going to work and class with all kinds of traditional Chinese breakfast items such as soybean milk with fried bread sticks, clay oven rolls, and egg pancakes, with 40-year-old Chongqing Soybean Milk Shop being the most famous shop, giving people the energy they need. Dalong Street Night Market opens after the sun has set, and has been welcoming in waves of hungry patrons since it was first opened in 1975. The night market has retained a lot of delicious dishes such as Jianjia Dalongdong Meatballs with ample filling, the 60-year-old

Tian Shacha Lamb... and if you can still move after filling up your stomachs, you can then go to Hami Street's Dalongdong Black Tea House to buy their bargain drinks to cool off and reminisce on the good old days.

Ningxia Night Market started developing in the period of Japanese rule, and has experienced prosperity and decline. It has been a witness to the most prosperous days of Dadaocheng, and has been there to accompany many time-honored businesses and foodies through time. Since its reorganization, Ningxia Night Market is now flourishing once more, and the division of vehicle lanes and pedestrian walkways makes the night market look clean, tidy, and it is safer for visiting tourists. People who come here are unconsciously engulfed in all kinds of aromas, making them continuously salivate and drink without even knowing it. The crispy and fragrant taro cakes, the enticing duck egg and shrimp soup, the refreshing and cleansing sugar cane juice, and the hot and cold and sweet mochi shaved ice are all there at the night market for people to try.

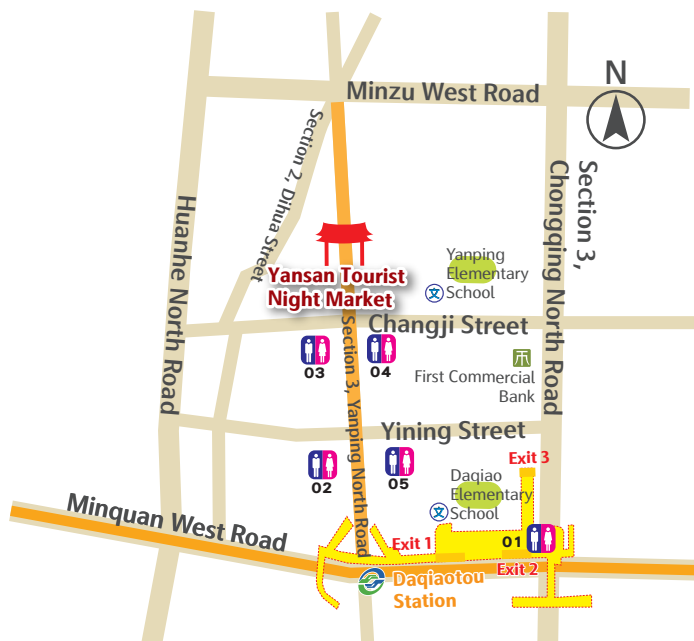
Yansan Tourist Night Market

During the early years, temporary workers would gather at the premises under Taipei Bridge, which is why the area became a vital place for people to quench their hunger at any given time of the day.

At 4 o'clock in the afternoon, school is out at Yongle Elementary School on the other side of the bridge. Parents pick up their children and there's all kinds of traffic in the area, marking the beginning of another night at the Daqiaotou Night Market. The famous food stalls that have served delicious food for decades such as squid potage and smoked shark allow customers to enjoy the taste of the sea. After that, people can go check out the more filling dishes such as the Bib Gourmand entry of Shantou Beef Noodles, Qiaotou Pork and Rice Dumplings with Sishen Soup; fresh juice, top ten braised pork rice in Taipei, and the Fried Rice King across the street. Going further down across the road, there's Shih Family Meat Tangyuan that are large and have a delicious filling. People cannot miss out on the Swordfish Rice Noodles down the road, which goes perfectly with some fried seafood and a couple of drinks with some friends.

The red heart tapioca balls that have already been around for three generations can be enjoyed hot or cold, which is an old-fashioned flavor from 40 years ago perfect anytime of the year. There are other tasty old-school snacks as well with the Shenglihao Oyster Omlettes and Eroucheng Live Seafood just to name a few. It's so hard to imagine that a single street can have so much delicious food.

Shuangcheng Street Night Market

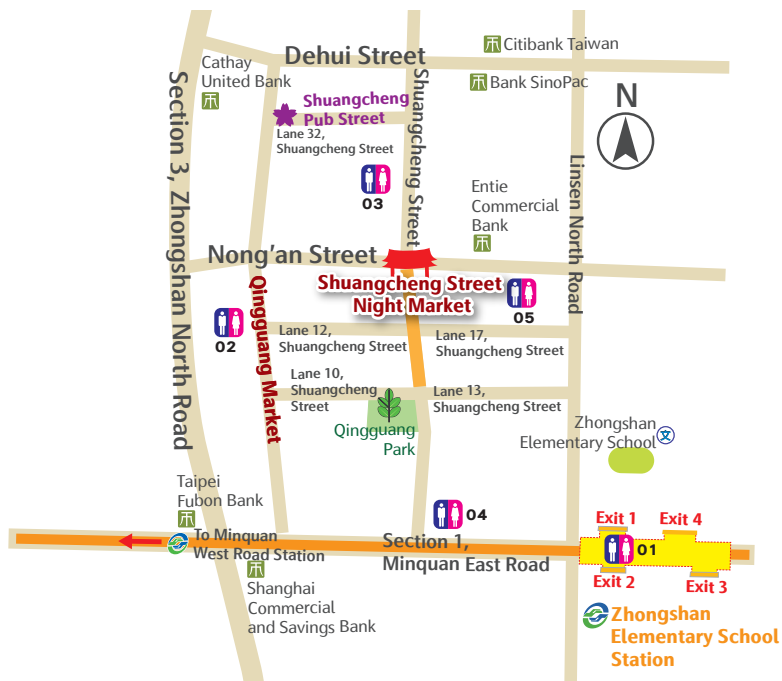


The orange and red signboards add a touch of color to Shuangcheng Street at night as the sign above the massive tent reads “24h Shuangcheng Food Street,” making it sound like a nonstop supply of delicious food and turning Shuangcheng Street into a splendid round-the-clock carnival.

People who come here can have a filling meal at any given time and enjoy the nourishment that food can offer. Shuangcheng Street Night Market is located in Qingguang Shopping District. During the 1960s, it was the location of the US Armed Forces’ Taipei Officer’s Club. As a result, bars and clubs were opened in that area and it was also a hub for exotic products during that era. After Taiwan and the United States officially broke off diplomatic relations in 1979, Qingguang Shopping District declined with the withdrawal of the US military, and the area gradually developed into a night market with many food stalls gathered here. After the Taipei City Government’s reorganization, the original mess that was Shuangcheng Street Night Market was turned into the spacious and clean “Shuangcheng Food Street,” featuring nearly one hundred kinds of foods and snacks and many of the stalls having been in business for decades. For example, Afu Seafood Porridge’s generous use of ingredients results in a dazzling array of delicious seafood on top of the delectable soup; simply looking at that bowl of porridge will make people drool.

The pairing of the smoky aroma of A Wan’s Goose Meat with the Goose Oil Rice certainly hits the spot, and 5-star celebrity chefs specially come to the night market to try out A Hong’s Black Boned Chicken that won the first place at the National Sesame Oil Chicken Festival in 2008. The night market truly is a feast of delicious food that continues through the day and night.

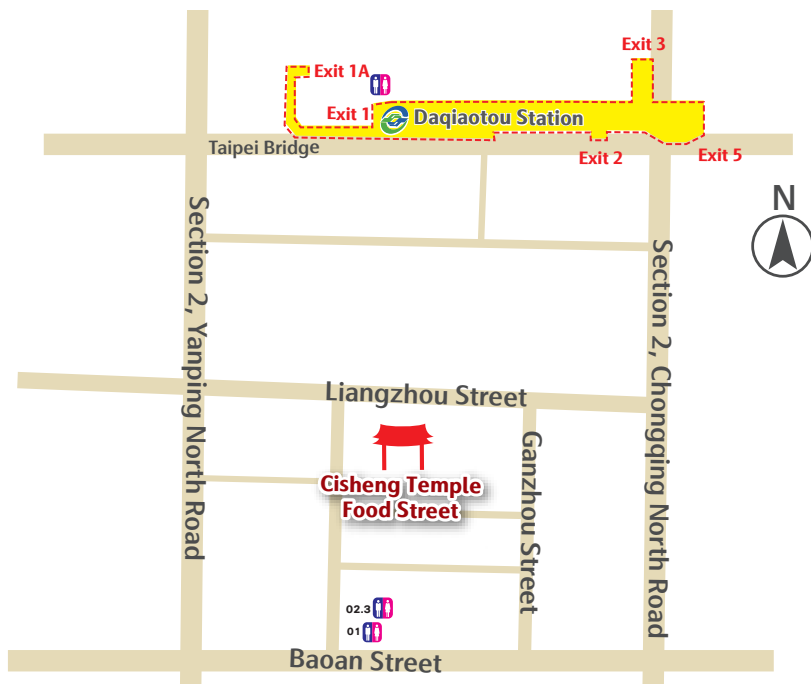
Cisheng Temple Food Street

Dadaocheng, which has become a mecca for online celebrities, was once the most prosperous area in Taipei, selling groceries, general goods, tea, medicinal materials, and cloth from all across the country. The traces from that era of Taiwan can still be seen in the modern streets around Dadaocheng. Cisheng Temple Food Street, which is located in the Dadaocheng area, has a variety of feature traditional snacks as well as some small shops artistic and intellectual youths for a combination of the old and new.

For people who are looking to take a simple trip like in the good old days, they can visit the food street in the morning or afternoon to enjoy some braised pork rice and side dishes under the banyan trees, which is the most down-to-earth way to eat food. For those who want to something more literary and artistic, they can rent a qipao and walk into a store that caters to young artists and intellectuals for a more romantic experience. This is the only place in Taipei City that has retained its deep historical roots and added modern elements — Cisheng Temple Food Street.

In front of Dadaocheng Cisheng Temple, there are plenty of food stalls along with dozens of tables and chairs to resemble life during ancient times. People will feel like they've traveled here in a time machine. People coming here for the first time should first pick a seat, and then make your order. Each stall has a corresponding table number, so people can ask the stalls in advance if they're worried about sitting at the wrong table. There is a lot of delicious food on both sides of the market with many of the stalls having been in business for decades such as Miaokou Original Pork Ribs Soup, Afa Seafood, The Squid Stall, and Usu-Tasi Pork Noodle, which are all great stalls waiting to be discovered. As time goes by and generations change year after year, the beautiful simplicity of the past is quickly disappearing; if you make the most of every moment of this precious time, you may just find a rhythm that suits you.

A Realm of Art under the Bridge

Jianguo Holiday Jade Market



It has been 30 years since the relocation of this jade market that resembles an open museum. The dazzling array of gems sold at the market symbolizes lasting memories, and Jianguo Jade Market is a lasting memory for the residents of Daan District. Jadeite, Chinese jade, crystal, gold and silver ornaments, and antiques each have their own brilliance. As the largest jade wholesale market in Taiwan, aside from the suspension due to the local COVID-19 epidemic, there have been nearly 800 vendors over the past 30 years that have welcomed every visitor from afar in the most enthusiastic and delicate manner.

From the time the market opens until the market closes, there are crowds of people going in and out to fill all of the vacant spaces. The flannels are covered with jade and antiques that are being carefully selected by visiting patrons; this is what Jianguo Holiday Jade Market looks like on a weekly basis. Formerly known as Guanghua Holiday Jade Market, stalls were mainly set up outside of Guanghua Market. The rapid growth in the number of vendors created traffic problems such as occupation of sidewalks, so in 1989, the market was moved to the Jianguo Elevated Expressway Parking Lot and renamed Jianguo Holiday Jade Market. The vast area of the parking lot promoted the expansion of the market, and it was once the largest market in Southeast Asia for antiques and cultural relics. The market is still quite an iconic place as it attracts many tourists to make special visits, and the Jianguo Holiday Flower Market is right next to it as well, making it a great place for people to hang out at all day long.

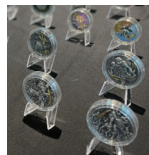

A Hub Combining the Old and the New

Qingguang Market

Having existed for 60 years, Qingguang Market has undergone several transformations since its inception. It is a place with a great amount of luxury and tradition. It has rain canopies of the traditional market that shield the walkways from sunlight; it has yellow lights that shine throughout the entire market; it has the imported goods, foreign clothing, and jewelry shops loved by ladies back in the day, and also has the nostalgic and traditional snacks loved by so many people. The snacks are sentimental and still fashionable while the market is now a hub for stalls serving delicious food. The combination of the old and new has once again given this place a new look.

After the outbreak of the Korean War in 1950, the US Military Assistance Advisory Group came to Taiwan to assist in defending the country, and the subsequent US Armed Forces' Taipei Officer's Club propelled the development of the surrounding area, turning it into the largest exclusive hub for foreign goods in Taiwan at that time. The area gradually declined after the US military withdrew from Taiwan in 1979, but the popularity of the delicious local food was massive. The area is a bustling market filled with vegetable vendors in the morning, reinjecting life into the signature shops of the market. Qingguang Red Bean Cake, Qingguang Noodles, and many other foods fill up this single street as serves local residents and foreign guests are served from 9 o'clock in the morning to 9 o'clock in the evening. Shuangcheng Street Night Market is right next to Qingguang Market, so people can make their pick of eating savory or sweet food there.

Siping Yangguang Shopping District is like Hong Kong Ladies' Market as the ladies' clothing and accessories are very popular amongst women. It was a must-visit district for people shopping for daily necessities over 40 years ago. Imagine the daily needs of office workers; it was as though all these needs could be satisfied on this street. There was no shortage of food, clothing, recreation and entertainment. In recent years, the area has been marketed and packaged by the City Government as it has added some feature designs in the old town area.

Siping Yangguang Shopping District on Siping Street, which is connected to Changchun Road, is a market of the new and old where people can eat fast or sit down to leisurely enjoy their food. It is a comprehensive market during the day that features several secluded boutique roast coffee shops, stimulating peoples' sense of smell to start off the day. The Siping Yangguang Shopping District has its own style as it mainly features pink-collar boutiques and clothing to satisfy the large number of office workers in the surrounding area, and the crowds of people brought by the nearby cinema. There are also ramen shops and Japanese cuisine restaurants in the surrounding area; shacha stir-fried beef and lamb and heated braised snacks that people can't get enough of are the staples of the shopping district's cuisine. The shopping district also has lots of hand-shaken beverage brands. People here going to work or rushing off to see a movie won't have to worry about being hungry. The Phra Phrom tucked away in the alley emits the fragrance of fresh flowers all year long, and combined with the aroma of roasted coffee, visitors are given a feast of scents as they enjoy the sunshine and experience the vitality of the city.

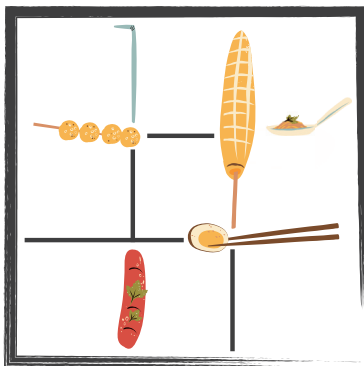

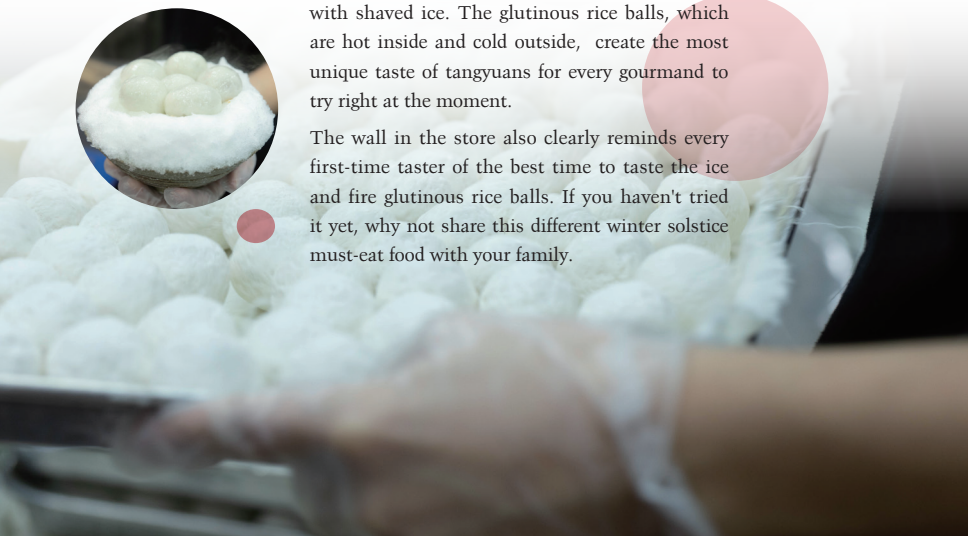
