I. Objectives

It is to advocate our traditional culture, promote dragon boat folk sports, and foster international exchange and friendship.

II. Conduct: Sports Administration, Ministry of Education

III. Organizer: Taipei City Government

IV. Manager: Department of Sports, Taipei City Government

V. Co-Manager:

Department of Information and Tourism, Department of Transportation, Taipei City Fire Department, Taipei City Police Department, Department of Health, Department of Environmental Protection, Department of Government Ethics, Hydraulic Engineering Office and Parks & Street Lights Office of Public Works Department, Taipei City Public Transportation Office, Taipei City Parking Management and Development Office, Taipei Bei An Junior High School, Taipei Water Department and The Red Cross Society

VI. Date: From June 22, 2023 (Thursday) to June 24, 2024 (Saturday)

VII. Location:

Yingfeng Pier, Dajia Section, Keelung River (under Dazhi Bridge, East-West bound 500-meter waterway), Taipei City.

VIII. Competition Divisions

- 1. Standard Dragon Boat:
- (1) Open Division: The number of teams for each category are listed as follows:
 - (a) Men's Open (maximum of 32 teams)
 - (b) Women's Open (maximum of 12 teams)
 - (c) Mixed Open (maximum of 48 teams)
 - (2) The number for each category includes the reserved winning teams in 2022. Four teams are reserved for the mixed category for teams organized by Embassies and overseas units in Taiwan.
 - (3) The local and foreign teams invited by the Organizer will not be included in the number of each category.

(4) The winning teams in 2022 Championships that register in the same category with the same team's name (Appendix 1), and complete the registration process within the registration time, will be eligible for the 2023 Championships without drawing lots.

2. Small Dragon Boat

- (1). Open Division:
- a. The number of teams for each category are listed as follows:
- (i) Men's Open (maximum of 20 teams)
- (ii) Women's Open (maximum of 20 teams)
- (iii) Mixed Open (maximum of 28 teams)

Females are allowed to register for the Men's category.

- b. The local and foreign teams invited by the Organizer will not be included in the number of each category.
- c. The winning teams in 2022 Championships that register in the same category with the same team's name (Appendix 1), and complete the registration process within the registration time, will be eligible for the 2023 Championships without drawing lots.
 - (2) Junior Division (Maximum of 8 teams):
 - a. Mixed Division (with no more than 6 male paddlers in each team) Students from public or private high schools (vocational schools) may organize teams to enter. Crew members of each team are not limited to one school.
- b. The captain must be over 20 years of age.
- c. A copy of certificate of enrollment from the school for each crew members are required for registration.
- d. The registration/entry fee is waived, and no previous Championships reserved teams for this division to promote participation.
- (3). Masters Division (Maximum of 32 teams):
- a. Participants must be over 50 years of age (born before June 22, 1973). There is no gender ratio restriction for this division.
- b. The winning teams in 2022 Championships that register in the same category with the same team's name (Appendix 1), and complete the registration process within the registration time, will be eligible for the 2023 Championships without drawing lots.

- 3. The organizer reserves the right to change maximum number of teams for each category based on number of teams registered. The total number of teams for the Championships will not exceed 200 teams. (See Appendix 2) The number does not include invitational teams.
- 4. The Organizer reserves the right to cancel, merge category or division for any category or division with less than 5 teams registered. The registration fee will be refunded for canceled category or divisions. No refund will be provided for any other conditions.

IX. Registration

- 1. Online Registration: Registration is accepted on the official website(dragonboat.taipei) of the 2023 Taipei International Dragon Boat Championships (hereinafter referred to as the event website).
- 2. Online registration opens at 10:00 AM of March 29, 2023 (Wednesday) and closes at 11:00 PM of April 6, 2023 (Thursday).
- 3. The qualification for acceptance and its process:
 - (1) After deducting the 2022 winning teams registered in each group once it reaches the registration deadline, the Organizer will draw lots if the number of registered teams in any category exceeds the limit. Please refer to XII. Lottery Meeting for details of the drawing procedure. It is to determine the qualifications of the active (alternate) teams. The Organizer will notify the alternate teams to be moved to the active team no later than April 20, 2023.
 - (2) After the registration deadline, if the total number of registered teams in any category does not exceed the category's limit, all registered teams in that category will be qualified as active teams. There will be no need to conduct a lottery meeting to determine active or alternate status.

4. Post in registration document:

- (1) It is advised to check if all information provided is correct before submitting the entry online. After completing online registration, have the following documents printed out and signed. And send them to the designated address before the following dates. Failed to do so or late submission will be deemed as incomplete registration. There will be no refund of registration fee for incomplete registration.
 - a. deadlines for post in registration document

- i. Active teams: from April 9, 2023 (Sunday) to April 17, 2023 (Monday) (determined by the postmark date)
- ii. Alternate teams moved to be active teams: April 20, 2023 (Thursday) to April 27, 2023 (Thursday) (determined by the postmark date)
- (2) No personal delivery of registration document will be accepted.

5. Registration Fee

- (1) Active Teams (include winning teams of 2022 Championships)
 From April 9, 2023 to April 12, 2023, please bring the payment slip to the counter of Taipei Fubon Bank, kiosk of designated convenient stores or ATMs, or use electronic payment (Easy Wallet) to make payment. No late payment will be accepted. If the fee is not paid within the deadline, it will be regarded as a waiver of the eligibility. The reserved alternate team of the same group will take its place.
- (2) Alternate teams move to be active teams.

 Please bring the payment slip to Taipei Fubon Bank's counter, designated kiosk of convenient stores or ATMs, or use electronic payment (Easy Wallet) to make payment from the date of receiving the notice until April 23, 112. Late payment will not be accepted and will be considered as a waiver of eligibility.
- (3) The registration fee is 3,000 TWD for each team registered for Open Division of Standard Dragon Boat and Small Dragonboat and Master Division of Small Dragon Boat Championships. The registration fee is waived for Invitation teams and Junior and Division.
- (4) The registration fee receipt can be downloaded from the official event website from 10:00 AM of April 25, 2023, to 23:59 of July 7, 2023.
- (5) The registration fee will not be refunded regardless of whether the team participates in the competition or not. Teams that fail to pick up their accreditation within the time announced by the Organizer will be disqualified from the competition and the registration fee will not be refunded. Except when the

competition is suspended due to the announcement of the Organizer or the team cannot participate due to the impact of the epidemic, the Organizer will refund the registration fee in full to the team account (the local bank account provided in the registration system to receive the subsidy when registering).

6. Registration Instructions

- (1) Team name: The Mandarin team name or the Mandarin-English mixed team name shall not exceed 8 characters (units)
- (2) Crew member
 - a. Team members:
 - i. It refers to the "paddler" or "steersperson". Participants must choose one of the two roles to register. Only those registered as team members are allowed to board the boat for competition.
 - ii. Drummers and flag catcher should be registered as "paddlers"
 - iii. The paddlers of any team cannot register another team as "paddler(s)" nor "steersperson".
 - iv. Those who register as "paddler" can serve as the steersperson of the registered team when they compete.
 - v. The steersperson can only steer the boat. He/She CAN NOT compete as the paddler nor the drummer nor the flag catcher for the registered team.
 - vi. The steersperson can register as "steersperson" of other teams to assist other teams steering.
 - vii. The male steersperson can register for the women's team as the steersperson.
 - viii. Must be at least 15 years of age (born before June 22, 2008). Members under the age of 18 need to submit the "Letter of Consent from Legal Representative (Guardian) for Underage Participants" (including relevant supporting documents, see Attachment 7 for more details).

b. Team Officials

i. It refers to the following three roles: "team leader", "coach" and "management". Team officials must choose

only one of the three roles to register. The only exception is for teams registered for the Junior Division. Junior Division teams do not need to register any team officials, but still need to provide the window of contact for their teams.

- ii. "Team Officials" are not allowed to board the boat for the competition. If they want to board the boat for the competition, they must register additionally as a "crew member". Only the Junior Division team officials can register additionally as a "steersperson".
- iii. Those who are registered as "team officials" and additionally registered as "steersperson" can register as another team's "steersperson" to assist other teams to steer the boat.
- (3) Personal information: Names, gender, ID numbers (those who are with a foreign passport need to provide passport numbers or Alien Permanent Resident Certificate (ARC) number), date of birth (in AD format), contact number, email, and mailing address along with current photo of officials and crew members

Your photo must be (in jpg format):

- * clear and in focus
- * taken within last month and in color
- * at least 531 pixels X 354 pixels (height X width)
- * the file size is limited to 4MB
- * Face front and with face covering 70% 80% of the photo to facilitate the identification
- * the head or hair should not reach the frame of the photo, however, female with hair length touching the lower frame of the photo is acceptable
- (4) register to bring its own equipment:
- a. Life jackets: Please mark whether to use self-provided life jackets when registering. For teams that wish to bring their own life jackets, need to make sure they meet the specifications regulated in Appendix 3 and must be fully aware of and abide by the content of Acknowledgement of Risk/Responsibility and Liability Waiver for

- Teams with Self-Provided Life Jackets (Appendix 4).
- b. Paddles: Please specify the number of self-provided paddles in the registration system when registering. The self-provided paddles must meet the specification and regulations of IDBF (Appendix 5).
- (5) Team introduction: It is for announcement during competition which includes description of team characteristics, achievements over the years, promotion of the unit or organization, etc.. It is limited to 200 words.
- (6) Participation consent information (The Organizer will not accept team registration if it is not signed by all participants.):
- a. Consent for Release of Personal Information (Appendix 6)
- b. Letter of Consent from Legal Representative (Guardian) for Underage Participants (including relevant supporting documents, as shown in Appendix 7)
- c. Team Grant Agreement and a copy of the account bankbook (Appendix 8)
- (7) For the teams registered for small size dragon boat division, they can apply for a public steersperson by ticking the corresponding box in the registration system.
 - 7. Steersperson's Workshop
 - Each accepted active team can send one representative from its crew member or officials to participate the steersperson's workshop. There are two workshop sessions. Each session is up to 70 participants. The registration is accepted sequentially, and it is closed when it reaches the max number of participants.
 - (1) Each team can submit two representatives indicating first order and second order. If for any reason that the first order representative is not able to attend the workshop, the position can be replaced by the second order representative. If such case should have occurred, the team needs to notify the Organizer by May 13, 2023.
 - (2) The workshop starts at 8:00 AM and ends at 4:30 PM. The dates for the two sessions of Steersperson's workshop are listed as follows:

Session ONE (3 days): May 20, 2023 (Saturday), May 21, 2023 (Sunday), and May 27, 2023 (Saturday)

Session TWO (3 days): May 28, 2023 (Sunday), June 3, 2023 (Saturday), and June 4, 2023 (Sunday)

- 8. For any questions or concerns regarding the registration and the event, please contact the Organizers during working hours (9:00AM to 6:00 PM).
 - (1) For online registration: TBA (to be announced)
 - (2) For registration status: TBA
 - (3) For competition related matter: TBA
 - (4) For Pre-Match Training: TBA
- 9. No changes to registration information will be accepted for this Championships. Teams are required to fill out accurate information and upload correct photos when registering online. If incorrect information is found upon review, teams will be notified to correct the information. If correction is not made within the specified time frame, the team will be directly disqualified from the lottery and competition eligibility.
- 10. Relevant information notifications will be sent to the team contact person by e-mail as the primary means of contact. Teams are responsible for confirming the accuracy of their email address and checking their inbox.

X. Number of Team Crew and Conditions

- 1. For Standard Dragon Boat Championships
 - (1) The number of team members must not exceed the maximum of 35 persons, including up to 3 team officials (one captain, one coach, one manager) and up to 32 team crews (including the paddlers, a steersperson, a flag catcher, and a drummer).
 - (2) Any team wishes to participate is required to recruit its own steersperson/coxswain. The organizer will not provide public steersperson.
 - 2. For Small Dragon Boat Championships
 - (1) The number of team members must not exceed the maximum of 25 persons, including up to 3 team officials (one captain, one coach, one manager) and up to 22 team crews (including the paddlers, the steersperson, and the drummer).
 - (2) The steersperson can be provided by the organizer (public steersperson) based on prior request. The public steersperson can't be hold responsible for successfully finishing the race. Each team is responsible for its decision of whether to request for public steersperson's assistance. Thus, thorough consideration is advised.

- 3. It is suggested that each team fills the quota at the registration. It is to ensure enough number of participants when one of the athletes is not able to participate due to unforeseen reasons.
- 4. For the Mixed Open Competition, the teams are composed with male and female athletes. The number of male paddlers for any team in a Standard Dragon Boat match may not exceed 10 persons. For the Mixed Division and Junior Division of Small Dragon Boat Championships, the number of male paddlers may not exceed 6 persons. The ratio of male and female paddlers is subject to each team.
- 5. Understanding this event can be considered as a strenuous sport, all participants must have knowledge of water safety and be able to swim as well as having passed a health examination to participate. Check one's personal condition to make sure the individual is well enough for competitive sports before any competitions or trainings. Each team's officials are responsible for insuring that all team members have met the requirements.
- 6. Each team shall prepare a team/organization flag and pole to represent the team in the closing ceremonies and also for saluting to the officials as they pass the podium on returning journey in the competition.
- 7. For the "steersperson" registered for multiple teams, the Organizer is not obliged to change the schedule or delay the roll call time in the case of the concurrent team schedule conflicts.

XI. Race Format

The Organizer will determine the race format applied based on the number of teams registered.

XII. Meetings

1. Lottery Meeting

The lottery meeting will be held at the 3rd floor in the Audio-Visual Room at the Department of Sports, Taipei City Government at 14:00 on April 8, 2023 (Saturday). No further notice will be given. If a team fails to send a representative for the team draw, the administration office of the event organizer has the right to draw for the team. And the team must accept the drawing result without reservation.

2. Team Draw

The team draw meeting will be held at the 3rd floor in the Audio-Visual Room at the Department of Sports, Taipei City Government at 14:00 on May 10, 2023 (Wednesday). No further notice will be given. If a team fails to send a representative for the team draw, the administration office of the event organizer has the right to draw for the team. And the team must accept the drawing result without reservation.

3. Team Manager's Meeting

2. Team Managers' Meeting

Team Managers' Meeting will be held at the 3rd floor, Audio Visual Room of Department of Sports, Taipei City Government at 14:00 on June 17, 2023 (Saturday). The Team Accreditation cards will be given out at the Team Managers' Meeting. No further notice will be given. The teams that are not able to attend the Team Manager's meeting need to pick up their accreditation cards between 18:00-20:00 of June 19, 2023 (Monday) at 1F of Department of Sports, Taipei City Government. Other pick-up time will not be accepted.

XIII. Race Gears and Equipment

- 1. The Organizer will provide all necessary equipment for the competition such as the boat, helm, drum, and drumstick. (Other training aids such as the whistles, loudspeakers are not allowed to be used in the event.) The Organizer reserves the right to make changes to the equipment in case of schedule changes or for any other reason.
- 2. Each team can bring their own life jackets or wear the life jackets provided by the Organizer. Since dragon boat racing is a team sport, life jackets are regarded as part of the team uniforms. All teams must wear life jackets of the same color. The styles of self-provided life jackets are mainly zipper or buckle. There is no restriction on color and the brand of the life jacket used. Buoyancy suits, belt-type/waist band type, inflatable, and pneumatic life jackets are prohibited. More details can be found in Appendix 3.
- 3. The self-provided life jackets will be inspected by the Organizer. If they do not meet the requirements in Appendix 3, the team will be prohibited from using their own lifejackets. And the team is required to wear the life jackets provided by the Organizer.
- 4. The life jackets provided by the organizer are in red. If the team's self-

- provided life jackets are insufficient in number during the inspection, the team is required to wear the life jackets provided by the organizer uniformly to compete.
- 5. Participants can prepare their own paddles that meet the specifications of International Dragon Boat Federation (IDBF) standard (see Appendix 5) for the competition. If they do not meet the specifications, please use the paddles provided by the Organizer. There is no restriction for the whole team to use the same style of paddles. Even with IDBF approved racing paddles need to be sent to the Organizer for inspection. If the whole team uses the same style and model of paddles, all self-provided paddles need to be brought to the "paddle inspection area" for random inspection. The Organizer will affix the organizer approved label on the shaft of the approved paddles after the inspection. Any self-provided paddle that fails to pass the inspection CANNOT be used for the competition.
- 6. Any team that intends to use their self-provided paddles, must deliver all their paddles to the "Inspection Area" for verification by the Organizer at least 30 minutes before the roll call of the team or within the time specified by the Organizer. The Organizer will still apply random inspections after the inspection. If found in random inspection, say, the length of the paddle does not meet the standards set out by IDBF, the team will be directly disqualified for the competition and the participation subsidy will be canceled.
- 7. Participating teams that wish to bring their own life jackets and paddles but are uncertain of the specification, can bring the life jackets and paddles to the Draw Meeting or the Team Manager Meeting. The competition referee team on site will assist in confirming whether they meet the requirements.

XIV. Training Sign-up

- 1. Pre-Match Training Practice
 - (1) Registered teams are eligible to sign up for training sessions prior to the Championships. Online sign up only. NO on site sign up will be provided. Further details can be found in Appendix 10 (Safety Guidelines) and Appendix 11 (Guideline for Pre-match Practice Sign-up).
 - (2) Pre-Match Training Practice only opens for the teams (coach and

crew members) registered for this year's Championships.

- (3) Please make sure to bring a photo ID. For local athletes, Personal Identification card is required for scanning on site. For foreign athletes, the passport or ROC (Taiwan) Resident Certificate is required. The ID provided on site will be used for identification. Each team must follow all the rules and regulations set forth by the event organizer during training practice (Safety Guidelines).
- (4) Self-provided life jackets and/or self-provided paddles can be used in Pre-match training practice.

2. Simulation Pool

Please find the details for the rules and regulations of simulation pool and practice sign-up in Appendix 13 and Appendix 14.

XV. Rules & Regulations

- 1. Any small dragon boat team that needs a race-sponsored public steersperson/coxswain, should make such request in the registration. The assignment of the sponsored steersperson/coxswain is arranged by the Organizer. Once the assignment is made, no changes will be applied, and no objection will be accepted.
- 2. Crew members of each team must bring his or her own accreditation card AND personal ID (For local athletes, one of the followings is acceptable: ID, National Health Insurance Card, or Drivers' License. For foreign athletes, the passport or ROC (Taiwan) Resident Certificate is required. For Junior Division athletes, the school ID is required.) to the Roll-call area at least 30 minutes prior to the race. Fail to do so will result in suspension of the race.
- 3. For Standard Dragon Boat racing, the team <u>must</u> consist of 21 members with 18 paddlers, a steersperson/coxswain, a drummer, and a flag catcher. For Small Dragon Boat racing, the team must consist of 12 members with 10 paddlers, a steersperson/coxswain, and a drummer. Any team with smaller number of crew will be disqualified. The number of crew member must be met at the rollcall before boarding the boat for competition.
- 4. For Standard Dragon Boat race, the rankings are determined by the sequence in which the teams catch their flags. The time recorded from the time the start signal is fired to the time the flag positioned at the finish line

- is removed will be listed as racing record. If a team is failed to catch its flag, the time the end of the boat passing the flag marking will be taken as the end of racing record. For Small Dragon Boat race, the rankings are determined by the sequence in which any part of the boats passing the finish line.
- 5. When the race is completed, all teams of the same heat should row the boats back by going straight for 15 meters (passing the ball float) then turning the boat to the left and heading back along the riverbank (close to the stage area) to the pier.
- 6. Every team must follow the match schedule posted by the Organizer (Event Handbook). The Organizer reserves the right to make any necessary changes. If there's any changes, it will be announced by the Race Officials though public announcement.
- 7. Every participant in the boat is required to wear a life jacket the whole-time during the race from start to finish. The drummer and the flag catcher should remain at the front of the boat (between the head of the boat and the first pair of paddlers).
 - * During the race is defined: from putting on the life jacket on shore, go to the pier and board the boat, start signal is fired to the finish of the race (standard dragon boat: catch the flag; small dragon boat: cross the finish line), return to the pier, get off the boat and up to the pier, and return the life jacket on shore.
- 8. As the dragon boats are in place, the race staff will call "Are you ready?" "Attention!" (At this time, the paddle blades must not go into the water and cannot row the paddles) and proceed to go as the start signal is fired by the race official.
- 9. Violation of the following (1) to (10) will result in disqualification of the race and cancellation of the specific competition grant. Violation of (11) to (13) will result in disqualification of the Championships and cancellation of ALL the competition grant.
 - (1) The number of crew members on boat is not followed.
 - (2) The drummer also acts as the flag catcher, or the steersperson acts as the paddler during the race.
 - (3) Any team member who does not wear a life jacket any time of the duration of the race.

- (4) Any team uses the necessary equipment for the competition that's not provided by the Organizer such as the boat, helm, drum and drumstick. (Or use other training aids such as whistles; loud speakers, etc.)
- (5) The team does not stay in its designated lane, including
 - i. the boat deviates its direction,
 - ii. the boat deviates its direction partially or entirely and impact other boats or colliding with another boat. If any of the violation occurs, the violated team is required to return to the starting pier immediately.
- (6) No team shall start paddling or have the paddle blades in water before the start signal is fired nor put the paddle(s) against the pier. Violation will be deemed foul start. The team will be penalized upon the second violation of this rule.
- (7) All paddlers must remain seated on the boat from the start to finish. (Only the drummer, flag catcher, or the steersperson is not bound by sitting on the boat.) Any violation will result in penalty.
- (8) For all divisions, the steerspersons are not allowed to paddle or assist in paddling during the race. (Assisted paddling refers to steering toward the end of the boat anytime from the start of the race to the end of the race.)
- (9) Any equipment or crew member falls into the water due to fault any time during the race.
- (10) The inspected self-provided paddle later being found that the length of the paddles being adjusted which did not meet the standards stipulated by IDBF without authorization.
- (11) Any team deliberately or by fault to fully stop paddling, blocking, or keep the helm off water and unable to control the boat which causes collision or other incidents during the race.
- (12) Any team that misses a race, regardless of the reason, including the case of forfeiting a race or ruled cancellation by the Organizer.
- (13) Any team or crew member or officials who does not accept the referees' decisions and disturbs or disrupts the order of the event or acts in unsportsmanlike conduct or acts in any other manner deemed as unsuitable by the Referee Committee. (For example: Crew member deliberately fall/jump into the water; deliberately dropping equipment or damaging dragon boat equipment, etc.)

10. Teams that are not able to finish the race due to factors of others (such as the influence of other team's violation), the Organizer will not accept appeals but WILL grant the race subsidy.

2. Trophies, medals, and certificate of merits:

For all Divisions, the champion will be awarded a trophy. The top three teams will each be awarded a medal. The top six teams will each be awarded a certificate (when 5 teams participate, only the top three teams will receive awards; when 6-9 teams participate, only the top four teams will receive awards; when 10 or more teams participate, the top five teams will receive awards. When 20 or more teams participate, the top six teams will receive awards.) Please find the chart below for detail.

- 3. Grant Subsidy: Subsidy will be issued to the teams that satisfy the followings:
 - (1) "Receipt of Grant" can be downloaded upon completion of the competition at the event website (from 10:00 AM of June 29, 2023 (Thursday) to July 7, 2023 (Friday)). The designated account holder of the grant subsidy needs to send (or deliver) the filled and signed Team Grant Agreement form to Department of Sports by July 10, 2023. Late submission will not be accepted. The amount of subsidy will be issued based on each team's participation and the amount will be transferred to the designated account.
 - (2) Follow the rules and regulations set out by the Organizing and attend the opening ceremony in proper attire. Subsidy will be revoked if there are less than 10 attending members for the standard dragon boat team or less than 6 members for small dragon boat team for the Opening Ceremony. When all members are in attendance, the event organizer assigned team sign carriers need to confirm the number of attendees and sign in for the team. It is encouraged but not mandatory for teams to participate in the Closing Ceremony except all awarded teams are required to participate in the Closing Ceremony.
 - (3) Every team shall follow the regulations, complete all the races, and attend the Opening or Closing ceremony. Subsidy will be revoked for any violation of the regulations or forfeiting the match.
 - (4) Teams meet the above-mentioned requirements will be able to receive the subsidies listed in the chart below:

Category	Standard Dragon Boat	Small Dragon Boat Open Division
Subsidy	completed until reaching maximum NT\$20,000 for each team.	NT\$3,000 for every race completed with self-recruited steersperson, until reaching maximum NT\$12,000 for each team. For teams requesting organizer sponsored public steersperson for any round of race, the above will not apply. A total of NT\$3,000 (no accumulation of heats) subsidy is granted for each team requesting organizer sponsored public steersperson.

- (5) For the promotion purpose, NT\$20,000 subsidy will be provided for teams of the Junior divisions regardless of self-provided steersperson or organizer sponsored (requested) steersperson is administered.
- (6) If the subsidy/grant account holder is a foreigner, please provide a copy of the front/back of the Residence Certificate. If the stay in Taiwan is less than 183 days, 6% of the subsidy amount will be withheld.

XVII. Disputes

- 1. Any disputes relating to the qualification of team members should be brought up at the time of assembly at the Roll-Call Area and CANNOT be disputed once the race started. If the disputes regarding the competition arise, the referee's decision shall be final and binding.
- 2. Disputes regarding the competition must be reported to the Chief Referee on the spot orally and followed by a written appeal (Appendix 9) of the dispute. The written appeal of the dispute needs to be signed by either the team manager or the coach with a deposit of NT\$5,000 to the Organizer within 30 minutes after the race is completed. Once the dispute is sustained, the deposit will be returned. However, if the Referee Committee decides that the dispute is not sustained, the deposit will NOT be refunded.
- 3. On the day of receiving a written appeal of the dispute, the Organizer will call a meeting with the Referee Committee to discuss the dispute and

- confirm whether it is sustained or not. The Committee's decision in the meeting should be final and binding.
- 4. If there is any act of opposing the Committee's final decision orally or in written form or spreading rumor or other misconduct ruled by the Referee Committee, the team will be disqualified, and its competition result/record will be cancelled.

XVIII. Addenda

- 1. Any team that does not follow the pandemic prevention measures set out by the Organizer and not rectify immediately after Organizer's reminder and instruction will result in disqualification and removal of all subsidies.
- 2. International teams invited by the Organizer will not receive additional subsidy if they have already accepted the Organizer's offer for accommodation and travel arrangements. Local foreigner community teams may request the same subsidy as the local teams, but no additional meals or accommodation subsidy will be issued.
- 3. Each team shall cover its own transportation, meals, clothing, and other related expenses during the competition.
- 4. Teams shall obey the safety related instruction set out by the Organizer's staff and lifeguards during practice and competitions. All team members must wear life vests (See instruction in Appendix 15) during competition and training/practice, and must be able to swim. All teams shall take full responsibility for their own safety during pre-match training practice and competition.
- 5. Teams participate in pre-match training practice must sign up their training time accordingly and follow "2023 Taipei International Dragon Boat Championships Pre-Match Training Practice & Safety Guidelines" (Appendix 10). The Pre-training schedule will be based on the order in which teams registered for their training sessions.
- 6. In case of a natural disaster or unpredictable events, the organizer has the right to suspend or delay matches. In such case, subsidies will be issued as usual. Prize money will be awarded or cancelled at the discretion of the Organizers depending on the progress of the competition.
- 7. The Organizer may request compensation from the team which causes damage of boats or capsizing by any wrongdoing; or if any equipment lost, damaged or any third person injury during practice or competition.

- 8. It is required that all teams and crew members follow the organizer staff, lifeguard and administrative officers' safety guideline and guidance. If violation occurred and confirmed to be true, a warning notice is applied for the first offence. The violated team will be disqualified and the full subside will be cancelled for the second violation.
- 9. Should any team, team member or officials not accept the Organizer's judgment, or any violation such as listed in XV-9. (11) and XV-9. (13), disturb or disrupt the order of the event or act in unsportsmanlike manner or act in any other manner deemed as unsuitable by the Referee Committee, will be disqualified from the competition and all subsidies will be removed. The Organizer may notify the appropriate institution, organization, or school to sanction the aforementioned team or team member(s).
- 10. All staff members of the Organizer and referee division are not allowed to participate as members or officials for any team.
- 11. The winner's prize money is regarded as an income. Therefore, must follow the Consolidated Income Tax rules of Taiwan accordingly. Government organizations and schools need to file the tax deduction for their teams. The tax deduction of private institutes or social communities will be filed through the assistance of the organization commissioned by Department of Sports.
- 12. If the amount and recipients of the competition subsidy for each participating team meet the supplementary premium requirements of the second-generation health insurance, the Department of Sports will deduct the amount and pay the supplementary insurance premium in accordance with the regulations.
- 13. The Organizer places public accident liability insurance for participants according to the "Public Accident Liability Insurance Standard Form for Large-Scale Group Events in Taipei City" (all details shall be subject to the insurance contract signed by the General Assembly and the insurance company). Contestants are advised to be cautious Consider your own safety and add personal accident insurance on your own. The insured items and amount are as follows, and the terms and conditions are detailed in the policy:
- (1) The liability for each bodily injury is NT\$3 million

- (2) Liability for bodily injury in each accident: NT\$15 million
- (3) Liability for loss of financial property in each accident is NT\$2,000,000
- (4) The maximum compensation amount within the insurance period is NT\$34 million



A · Covered with 100% nylon and filled with high density COREX foam N.B.R or PVC foam.

B · Personal Floating Devices need to meet European Standard (EN ISO 12402-5 EN 393 50N) or (ENISO 12402-4 EN 395 100N); or US Coast Guard approved (USCG) Type II, 15.5-p, 70N or Type III 15.5-p, 70N.



III. Any team that wishes to use self-provided life jackets needs to fill and turn in "2023 Taipei International Dragon Boat Championships Acknowledgement of Risk/Responsibility and Liability Waiver for Teams with Self-Provided Life Jackets" at registration. It is Okay if later the team decides to use the Organizer provided life jacket.



2023 Taipei International Dragon Boat Championships Pre-Match Training Practice & Safety Guidelines

- 1. The teams registered for the 2023 Taipei International Dragon Boat Championships may sign up for the practice/training session. Online sign up only (except for invitational teams). The closing of sign up time is at 17:00 two days before the training day. (Please find the sign-up schedule on the event website.)
- 2. The pre-match training practice time: morning training session are in shifts of 6:00 AM 11:00AM, The afternoon sessions are scheduled from 1:30 PM to 4:30 PM. All teams must leave the water before 4:30 PM.
- 3. The participants for training and competition must be able to swim as well as passing a health examination. The participants are responsible for monitoring his or her physical condition before and during the training session. Proper warm-up is required before training/practice and the competition to avoid sports injuries.
- 4. All teams can only practice in the area and water lanes specified by the Organizer, which is 500-meter west and 500-meter east from the Dazhi Bridge. The water way divides in the center line. Keep to the right downstream and keep to the left when returning.
- 5. During the training and the competition, each team is required to stay within the assigned lane and a life jacket should be worn at all times. Seat switching is prohibited to avoid accident. It is required to follow the instructions of Organizer's staff and guards. Any violations will result in a warning for the first offense and subsidy revoking and race suspension at the second offense.
- 6. Rowing equipment needed can be borrowed from the management unit of the Organizer with signing up prior to the practice. At least 7 pairs of paddles and a helm for 15 participants are needed for Standard Dragon Boat. And 4 pairs of paddles and a helm for 9 participants are needed for Small Dragon Boat.
- 7. The organizer will provide the dragon boats, paddles, drumsticks, helms, life jackets and any needed equipment without any fee. It is the team's responsibility to return the lent equipment properly after use. In the case of lost or damaged equipment, the team will be paying the full price.
- 8. Please take good care of all the lent equipment. Other than Force Majeure, any purposeful discarding or damaging of the equipment or capsizing the dragon boat will result in disqualification from the practice. The team will also need to pay the full price for the damages. Any violations of local laws and regulations will be subject to investigation.
- 9. In case of a typhoon alert, heavy rain alert or any other natural disasters issued by the Central Weather Bureau prior to the training, please contact the Pre-Match Training Management Unit for updates on schedule change. If the waves get too high or a thunderstorm occurs

- during practice or the competition, please follow the instructions of the Organizer /Management Unit and leave the water immediately.
- 10. The organizer reserves the right to stop training session and the competition for the safety of personnel and the smooth operation of the event. No objections from teams will be accepted.
- 11. Please make sure to bring a photo ID for checking in at scheduled training. For local residence, Personal Identification Card is required. For foreigners, the passport or ROC (Taiwan) Resident Certificate is required. The ID provided on site will be scanned for identification and online insurance. Anyone who fails to bring a photo ID is not allowed to participate in Pre-match practice.
- 12. Each team should have their own steersperson/coxswain during practice.
- 13. It is advised for inexperienced or new steersperson to complete "Steersperson Workshop" before the competitions. The information of such training will be posted on the event website.
- 14. Any further information or revision will be announced by the Organizer as it occurs.

 - (b) Closed from noon of June 9, 2023 (Friday) and closed all day on June 10, 2023

(Saturday) for River Worshipping and Eye Dotting Ceremony.

- (3) Sing up is limited to two times daily (one in the morning and one in the afternoon).
- 3. Conditions for boarding the boat: Standard dragon boats require at least 7 pairs of paddles and 1 helm for a total of 15 people; small dragon boats require at least 4 pairs of paddles and 1 helm for a total of 9 people.

4. Others:


- (1) Telephone sign-up and on-site sign-up are not accepted. Teams are required to complete their online reservation (sign-up) for practice slots or cancel them no later than 2 days before the practice date. Except for natural weather factors, if a team accumulates 2 missed practice sessions after making a reservation, the team's subsequent reserved practice slots will be cancelled to protect the rights of other teams and the effective use of resources.
- (2) Please make sure to bring a photo ID when check in for training. For local residence, Personal Identification Card is required. For foreigners, the passport or ROC (Taiwan) Resident Certificate is required. The ID provided on site will be scanned for identification and online insurance. Every participant must follow all the rules set forth in the 2023 Taipei International Dragon Boat Championships Pre-Match Training Practice & Safety Guidelines. Anyone who fails to bring a photo ID listed will not be allowed to participate in practice.
- (3) Pre-match training session is for registered teams and their crew members and coaches. It is not acceptable to change dragon boat sizes or merge teams.
- (4) Management staff for pre-match training: To be announced
- (5) During May and June, drumming will be prohibited when there is national and high school exam days, final exam days and school needs.
- (6) If further rules and regulations needed in the future, they will be posted on site and on the event official website.


Life Jacket Donning and Doffing Instruction for Taipei International Dragon Boat Championships

Rules and Regulations for Simulation Pool Department of Sports, Taipei City Government

- 1. It is regulated and governed by Department of Sports, Taipei City Government based on article 3 of Taipei City Government Venue Management Act for free training of Taipei International Dragon Boat Championships.
- 2. The pool is 90 cm deep.
- 3. No business conduct is allowed at the venue.
- 4. It is forbidden to transfer partial or the whole venue for other parties.
- 5. Please abide by the followings to maintain the safety, order, and cleanness of the venue:
 - (1) Appropriate sports attire and proper warm up are required before entering the venue. If you experience cramps during practice, you should stop activities immediately.
 - (2) In order to maintain tranquility, please comply with the noise control standards issued by the Environmental Protection Department of the Executive Yuan and prohibit all types of equipment for noise (such as loudspeakers, amplifiers, gas whistle, drums, etc.).
 - (3) Do not bring young children or animals into the facility for safety.
 - (4) Do not smoke, eat, chew gum or betel nut, spit, discard garbage or cigarette butts, set off firecrackers, drink alcohol, fight, gamble, cook, camp overnight or any illegal conduct.
 - (5) It is everyone's responsibility to maintain the public facilities together. The Organizer will seek compensation from whoever caused or contributed to damages if damages occur. It is strictly prohibited to run, push, or tag, or chase within the pool or around the pool. The party involved will be responsible for any accident occurred due to any of the above acts.
 - (6) Anyone who does not abide by these rules of use and has been advised by the management will be asked to leave the venue.
 - (7) In case of thunder and lightning, please stop all activities immediately and follow the instructions of the administrator/staff.
 - (8) The Department does not take responsibility for safekeeping of personal valuables.
- 6. The Organizer provides public paddles for practice free of charge. Each team shall return the paddle(s) intact after using it. If the equipment is damaged or lost, each team shall pay for it.
- 7. The Department reserves the right to amend the regulations as needed.

- 1. Time and Dates: Sign-up opens at 10:00 AM on May 10, 2023 (Wednesday) to reserve for trainings between May 20, 2023 (Saturday) and June 18, 2023 (Sunday) every day from 8:00 AM- 10:00 PM.
- 2. Procedure for signing up:
- (1) The simulation pool opens every day from 8:00 AM to 10:00 PM. Please complete your reservation by 5:00 pm at the latest 2 days before the practice day. For the teams that wish to pay for the use of the practice area should contact Lucky Parking Limited (Tel: 03-486-2200, Mr. Huang or Mr. Jiang). No onsite registration (sign up) is provided.
- (2) Teams registered for this year's Championships may register for practice through the registration system on the event website (http://dragonboat.taipei).
- (3) It is limited to one session (an hour) a day for each team.
- (4) If a team is unable to attend the practice, it should cancel the reservation by itself. If a team is absent from reserved practice for 2 times, the rest of the reserved practice sessions for the team will be canceled to protect the rights of other teams and the effective use of resources.
