2019 Department of Information Technology Major Events

March

- Taipei City Government Department of Information Technology's "Creating a Public-privatepartnership Smart City: Establishment of Taipei City Project Management Office" project was shortlisted in the Planning Category of the Second Government Service Award organized by the National Development Council.
- Taipei City Government participated in the 2019 Smart City Summit & Expo (lasting from March 26 through 29), unveiling its "Smart Taipei One City" theme and presenting application achievements at its pavilion.
- The Global Organization of Smart Cities (GO SMART) hosted a press conference to announce its founding and signed a memorandum with the Local Government Association of Queensland (LGAQ), Australia.

May

- In light of the implementation of the Cyber Security Management Act which comprehensively strengthened overall cyber security management system through the establishment of levels and regulations to reporting and responses in related areas, Taipei City Department of Information Technology revised the "Taipei City Government Information Security Management Standards" to prepare itself for confronting national-level cybersecurity challenges of a new era.

July

- Taipei City Government won the 2019 Smart City Asia Pacific Award with its submission "Transportation 2.0 – Al Driven Transportation Management, once again boosting the profile of Taipei City as a smart city brand.

Septemper

 cohosted the 2019 NASA International Space Apps Challenge.
- 23 Key Points of the Taipei City Government's Single Identification Service Operations has been officially launched, providing Taipei citizens with a standardized process for using Taipei City
