6	府中站 Fuzhong		The Lin Family Mansion and Garden is Taiwan's most complete example of classical garden-style architecture. The Commemorative Stone Inscription: Founding of Fangqiao School erected on the campus of Banqiao Elementary School was erected to honor the Lin family's contribution during the Japanese colonial period in establishing public school facilities. The stone is now a municipal historic monument.

The herbal tea sold here is today regarded as a natural health drink.
